Judicial activism should not lead to dilution of separation of powers: President

Bhopal, Apr 16
President Shri Pranab Mukherjee has said, judicial activism should not lead to dilution of the separation of powers, which is a constitutional scheme. He was addressing the fourth Retreat of Supreme Court Judges at National Judicial Academy in Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh today. He said, each organ of our democracy must function within its own sphere. Shri Mukherjee said, the exercise of powers by the executive and the legislature is subject to judicial review, however only check for the exercising of power by the judiciary is self imposed discipline and self restraint. The President emphasized the need of the speedy,



accessible and affordable justice. He also expressed concern over pendency of cases in different courts. Shri Mukherjee said, pending cases must be quickly cleared through multi-dimensional efforts. He said that for speedy justice, use of IT and e-governance can make a positive impact. Addressing the Retreat,

Chief Justice of Supreme Court T S Thakur spoke on the objectives of the Retreat. He said, the modern global challenges required modern solutions. Union Law Minister Shri Sadanand Gowda said, the government is revising national litigation policy. He said, the steps are being

Satellite bandwidth connectivity of Andaman crosses 1 Gbps

Port Blair, Apr 16

The Lt. Governor took a review of the developments and overall improvements of telecommunication facilities in A&N Islands with R.N. Jha, CGM, BSNL at Raj Niwas today. The CGM conveyed that on the auspicious occasion of Ram Navami, A&N Telecom Circle commissioned a direct 20 Mbps satellite connectivity from Campbell Bay and Car Nicobar Islands each to mainland exclusively for providing broadband services to these remote Islands and with this broadband services has been rolled out in Campbell Bay. Earlier, direct connectivity of 20 Mbps of

Havelock Island with Kolkata was exclusively provided for the improvement of broadband services in this Island. He further said, augmentation of satellite bandwidth by 1 Gbps to these Islands has been achieved and with this, there has been gradual improvement in quality of services both in voice as well as data services. Shri Jha informed that in last one year, there has been a remarkable increase in volume of traffic in data services. He mentioned that per day data download has increased around 3 times in March 2016 in comparison to September 2014, overall data download per day has increased to around 3000

Giga Byte from around 1000 Giga Byte. He further said by taking certain measures such as integration of bandwidth, there will be further improvement and the data download figure will certainly improve in days to come. Broadband connections have increased by about 1400 customers and mobile active subscribers base has increased by over 22,000 in last one year. The total subscriber base of BSNL is over 2.6 lakh and it is growing consistently with daily addition of around 150 subscribers in these Islands. The CGM also informed that with the commissioning of the core equipments such as MPBN

routers and SGSN (Serving GPRS Support Node), bandwidth utilisation efficiency has improved significantly. Work for the development of telecom services, particularly the rolling out of broadband services in remote Islands are going on as per schedule. Besides, direct satellite connectivities, exclusively, for broadband services in Havelock, Car Nicobar and Campbell Bay, BSNL is going to provide direct satellite connectivities to remote Islands such as Neil, Kamorta, Little Andaman and Long Islands, by June 2016. Further, to ensure interruption free data services in North and

Middle Andaman, direct satellite connectivity of 60 Mbps is going to be implemented at Mayabunder in a week's time. CGM, BSNL appraised the Lt. Governor that BSNL is giving due importance for improvement of data services in these Islands. BSNL has planned to install and commission, state of the art 80 BTS - 3G BTSs to provide full coverage of 3G services in Port Blair so as to minimise the issue of call drops. At present, CGM admitted, that there is a deficiency in 3 G services coverage and as such advised the subscribers to latch their smart mobile phones on 2G services in North and

Pawan Hans evacuates critical patient from Kadamtala

Pawan Hans Helicopter today evacuated a critical patient from Kadamtala. Responding swiftly to a distress call from the Directorate of Health Services (DHS), the Department of Civil Aviation pressed into service Pawan Hans Helicopter immediately to evacuate the critical

patient; a boy namely Sambit Bawali, 18, suffering from acute chocking. The helicopter with the critical patient reached Port Blair by 2.35 pm and the patient was immediately shifted to GB

Bengaluru to host IPL final; Pune, Mumbai given home options

Bengaluru, Apr 16
The cash-rich IPL cricket league today picked Bengaluru as the venue for its finale and offered four alternate home options to the state's affected franchises. This development comes after the IPL schedule was thrown haywire following the Bombay High Court ordered the shifting of 13 IPL matches out of drought-hit Maharashtra. In a meeting between IPL Chairman Shri Rajeev Shukla and representatives of the Rising Pune Supergiants and



Mumbai Indians, it was decided to allot IPL's final and the first Qualifier to Bengaluru. The second Qualifier and the Eliminator, on the other hand, have been proposed to be moved to Kolkata to implement the Bombay High Court's order. The Court had asked the BCCI to shift all the IPL matches after April 30 from Maharashtra due

to the acute water crisis in the state. In today's meeting, the two affected franchises were asked to pick from Raipur, Jaipur, Visakhapatnam and Kanpur as their alternate home base. While Pune opted for Visakhapatnam, Mumbai Indians sought two days' time to choose their new base. Shri Shukla told reporters after the meeting that the organisers of the IPL would propose before the Governing Council that Final and Qualifier 1 be shifted to Bengaluru, while Qualifier 2 and Eliminator to Kolkata. Shukla also stated that the BCCI will plead before the High Court to allow the May 1 clash between Mumbai and Pune to go ahead in Pune as the home franchise will be playing a game in the city on April 29.

Table Tennis: Soumyajit Ghosh, Manika Batra book their Rio berths



Hong Kong, Apr 16
Indian Table Tennis players, Soumyajit Ghosh and Manika Batra have booked berths in the forthcoming Rio Olympics. Both the paddlers won their groups in the Asian Qualifiers in Hong Kong yesterday to book the tickets to Rio. The competition was restricted to India alone as no other country from the region participated in the South Asian Zone qualification event. Four players in each section played against one another to grab a spot. Ace Indian paddler Sharath Kamal managed just one win. Sharath will now play in the main Asian Qualifiers which begin after the conclusion of other Zone qualifiers. Even if he loses then, Sharath should automatically qualify for the Games based on his Olympic rankings which the International Table Tennis Federation will release next month after all qualification tournaments. World Number 2 Ding Ning has gone down to Japan's Ito Mima 4-2 in the Women's Singles. Ding Ning is the 2nd top player from China to bow out of the tournament, after top-ranked Liu Shiwen was bounced in the first round.

Australia thrash India 4-0 to win Sultan Azlan Shah Cup

Ipoh (Malaysia), Apr 16
A dominant Australia notched up a thumping 4-0 victory over India in the summit showdown to win the Sultan Azlan Shah Cup hockey tournament on Saturday. Thomas William Craig (25th, 35th) scored twice while Matt Gohdes (43rd, 57th)

too found the net two times for Australia as the in-form Kookaburras won the tournament for a record ninth time. The result meant Australia lifted the trophy with an all-win record. For the reigning world champion and world number one, Craig opened the scoring in the 25th minute when he dribbled past a couple of Indian defenders and dragged goalkeeper Akash Chikte out before putting the ball into an empty net. Craig doubled the lead when he lunged into a cross in the 35th minute for his fourth goal of the tournament.

Heat wave continues to wreak havoc across the country

New Delhi, Apr 16
Heat wave continues to wreak havoc across many parts of the country. According to the latest report from the India Meteorological Department, at least 8 states across the country will face heat-wave conditions over the next two days. Meanwhile Central and peninsular India continued to witness the hottest April in recent years. The continuing heat wave in the country has led to serious concern with temperatures breaking all previous records in many parts. The maximum temperature in most parts of the state has crossed 40 degrees on almost a daily basis for more than a week now while there are predictions of the lull or hot winds blowing for another full week. People have also been cautioned against going out in the afternoon when the temperature reaches its peak. In West Bengal Kolkata and the Southern part of the state are the worst sufferers where temperatures reached 45 degrees celsius for the first time in 50 years. Maharashtra too is severely affected by the



heat wave. Meteorological Department has given a bleak picture for the next few days. There seems to be no respite for the present. Experts have warned that the slightest negligence in such weather could have disastrous consequences. The weather man has in fact predicted a 3-4 degree increase in temperature in the next few days.

Death toll in earthquake in southern Japanese city of Kumamoto rises to 20

Tokyo, Apr 16
Death toll in the late last night's earthquake in the southern Japanese city of Kumamoto has risen to 20. Media reports say, more than 1,000 were also injured in the 7.3 magnitude powerful earthquake that hit the Kyushu region a day after an earlier tremor killed nine people. Meanwhile, Relief and rescue efforts are under way to help the victims. Around 20,000 troops have been deployed in the operation in the region. Dozens of people are feared trapped in the rubble of collapsed buildings. Rescuers dug through the rubble of collapsed buildings and mud and debris today to reach the trapped persons, but continued aftershocks hindered rescue efforts. Quakes continue to rattle Kumamoto Prefecture and the surrounding regions.



Japan's only operating nuclear power plant is also in Kyushu. Officials say there are no irregularities with the two reactors. Officials say around 69,000 people in Kumamoto Prefecture have been evacuated from their homes. The quakes are also affecting transportation. Officials at Kumamoto Airport shut the terminal building after it was damaged by the tremors
