PM asks officers to move towards digitization, efficient tax administration

New Delhi, Jun 16
Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has asked tax officers to move towards digitisation and make tax administration better and efficient. Inaugurating the two day annual conference of Senior Tax Administrators, 'Rajasva Gyan Sangam' in New Delhi, Shri Modi suggested five pillars of tax administration- revenue, accountability, probity, information and digitization. The Prime Minister invited suggestions from officers on diverse subjects such as digitization, voluntary tax compliance, facilitation for taxpayers, and increasing the tax base. Shri Modi stressed that while there should be respect for the rule of law among all citizens, people should not fear tax administrators. Citing the example of the

IRBn constable rescued from forest after 48 hours

Port Blair, June 16
A Constable Compounder M. Sajit Kumar of IRBn who had gone missing since the morning of June 13, 2016 in the forest of Tillangchong Island, has been traced out after a joint search and rescue operation

conducted by AN Police, JOC (A&N) and RHQ (Coast Guard). In the morning of 13th June 2016, a Police party of 8 personnel including Constable Compounder M. Sajit Kumar, had gone to clean a nearby spring. This

party, after clearing the water source, went inside the forest in search of another spring. However, while about to return, they realized that M. Sajit was not present with the group. After making unsuccessful initial ground based

search, a signal for help was sent.

On receipt of signal from LOP Tillangchong, a request was placed immediately before PHQ, JOC Port Blair, RHQ (CG) etc. for helping to conduct a Search And Rescue operation.
