WBO Asia Pacific Title Bout: Vijender Singh to face Kerry Hope

New Delhi, Jul 16

Undeclared in what has been a fast-rising professional career, Indian boxing star Vijender Singh will take on Welsh-born Australian Kerry Hope in his maiden title bout for the vacant WBO Asia Pacific super middleweight belt in New Delhi tomorrow.

The 30-year-old India, who has won all his six pro bouts after turning pro via knockouts, will be up against his most experienced and accomplished rival so far as Hope is a former WBCC European champion with 23-7 win-loss record.

The fight night tomorrow will feature seven other undercard bouts, comprising boxers from the Indian Boxing Council's stable and two Thai invites. One of the seven fights will be a women's exhibition bout, featuring boxers from the celebrated MC Mary Kom's academy. Should he win tomorrow, Vijender would get a crack at the top-15 of WBO world rankings.

High wave warning; fishermen cautioned

Port Blair, July 16

High waves in the range of 3.0 - 3.9 meters have been forecasted in Andaman till July 18, 2016 along the west coast of Andaman Islands between Ten Degree Channel to Coco Channel. Current speeds vary between 52 - 58 cm/sec.

Meanwhile, similar high waves have been forecasted in Nicobar till July 18 along the west coast of Nicobar Islands between Ten Degree Channel to Great Channel.

Current speeds vary between 70 - 77 cm/sec. Fishermen have been advised to be cautious while venturing into the sea. Petrol, diesel prices cut

New Delhi, Jul 16

Petrol price has been cut by 2 rupees 25 paise per litre and diesel by 42 paise a litre. The new prices came into effect from midnight last night. Petrol will now cost 62 rupees 51 paise a litre in Delhi, 66 rupees 3 paise in Kolkata, 67 rupees

11 paise in Mumbai and 62 rupees in Chennai. Diesel will cost 54 rupees 28 paise in Delhi, 56 rupees 48 paise in Kolkata, 59 rupees 60 paise in Mumbai and 55 rupees 82 paise in Chennai. This is the second reduction in rates this month.

of payment which, according to the MP, is due since the last 5 months. Regularisation of 300DRMs in Car Nicobar working in different departments in various capacities since 15-20 years and regular deduction of EPF were also brought to the notice of the MP. The Member of Parliament, also interceded with the villagers of Kinyuka, the village which has been declared as 'Saansad Aadarsh Gram', in presence of officials of A&N Administration on July 15. During the interaction, Shri Ray noticed that base line survey is yet to be done while the Village development plan is also yet to be prepared. Apart from this, many basic facilities are yet to be taken up in that village, the MP added. The MP also wanted that the transfer policy for Nicobar group should be like that of Education Department and other departments of the Administration should apply the same policy for the betterment of their staff. At Nancowrie, the residents highlighted problem related to drinking water and education sector. The V-Sat installed at Secondary School Kamorta is not being used properly, the MP said. He also suggested for setting up of a forest saw mill as huge timber is available at Nicobars. Stone quarry can be allotted at Nancowrie and Katchal to meet the demand of quarry product in nearby islands, the MP observed.

The MP has assured the residents of Nicobar of communicating all the grievances of the people of Nicobar area to the Chief Secretary and will also highlight the same during the coming Parliament session. He further stated that the first team from the National Highways and Infrastructure Development Corporation Ltd (NHIDCL) is scheduled to arrive in the Isles on July 19, which will tour the entire stretch of NH-223 and submit their report.
