The Member of Parliament, A & N Islands, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray, alongwith Shri Yumnam Tomba Singh, President, Preservation Committee of Deported Manipuri War Heroes in Andaman and Nicobar Islands and Shri Khagen Soren, Organization Secretary, Vanvashi Kalyan Aashram Port Blair, met the Lt Governor, A&N Islands Admiral DK Joshi at Raj Niwas today and submitted a demand for allotment of 1 acre of land in Port Blair for construction of a Memorial Centre in memory of the 'Heroes of Anglo Manipuri war of 1891'.  
The first Meitei/ Manipuri who was exiled to Kalapani were Meidingu (Meitei Prince), Sana Chachi Ahum



alias Ranjit (Horoscope name) alias Prince Narendrajit. Maharaja Kulachandra, his brothers and 12 noblemen, instead of hanging, were sent to Kalapani for life imprisonment after the

British Government confiscated all their wealth and property, on 23rd November, 1891 from Calcutta on board the Ship S. S. Shahjahan. Later, Maharaj Kullachandra

Dhwaja Singh and Major Chongtha Miya Singh were allowed to return to mainland and no information about the thirteen remaining prisoners could be found.

## Defence Minister commissions INS Kiltan into Indian Navy

Visakhapatnam, Oct 16  
Defence Minister Smt Nirmala Sitharaman commissioned an indigenously-built anti-submarine warfare stealth corvette INS Kiltan into the Indian Navy at the Naval Dockyard in Visakhapatnam today. The Minister said, INS Kiltan strengthens India's Defence System and will be a shining armour in 'Make in India' programme as it is totally built indigenously. The commissioning ceremony was attended at the Naval Dockyard by Chief of the Naval Staff Admiral Sunil Lanba, Flag Officer Commanding-in-Command H S Bisht and other senior officers. A Navy statement said,



this is the third of the four Kamorta-class corvettes being built under Project 28. INS Kiltan is the latest indigenously warship after Shivalik Class, Kolkata Class and sister ships INS Kamorta and INS Kadmat to have joined the Indian Navy's arsenal.

It is India's first major warship to have a stealth features, lower top superstructure of carbon weight and maintenance fibre composite material resulting in improved costs, the statement added.

## Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana Maternity benefits for pregnant & lactating mothers

Port Blair, Oct 16  
The Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana (Maternity benefit scheme), being implemented by the Govt. of India since Jan 1, 2017, was launched in the Islands recently. The Scheme is being implemented by the Department of Social Welfare under ICDS for pregnant women and lactating mothers.

Under the scheme, Rs. 5000 is payable to the beneficiary in three installments for the first live child. An amount of Rs.1000 will be provided as the first installment after the beneficiary registers her pregnancy at the



nearest Primary Health Centre along with the required documents. Registration of pregnancy must be done within 150 days. The beneficiary must also submit application form 1-A, MCP card, Identity proof, Bank/Post Office Account Pass Book.

In the second installment, Rs.2000 will be provided to the beneficiary. The beneficiary must have at least one ante natal checkup and the claim can be made after 180 days of

pregnancy. The documents required at this stage include application form 1-B and MCP card.

In the third installment, Rs. 2000 will be provided

to the beneficiary subject to conditions such as registration of child birth, first cycle of immunizations of BCG, OPV, DPT and Hepatitis B of the child besides Aadhaar registration of both, beneficiary and her husband. The documents to be submitted include application form 1-C, MCP Card, Aadhaar ID of both beneficiary and her

New Delhi, Oct 16  
Striker Rani Rampal will captain an 18-member Indian team at the ninth women's Asia Cup hockey tournament, which starts from October 28 at Kakamigahara City, Japan. Senior goalkeeper Savita has been named as the vice-captain of the side. The team selected by Hockey India for the upcoming Asia Cup has five changes from their Europe Tour of Netherlands and Belgium. Experienced defender Sushila Chanu Pukhrabam makes a comeback into the team while forwards Navneet Kaur, Navjot Kaur and Sonika have also been included. Apart from the inclusions, the



goal will be kept by Savita and Rajani Etimarpu while Deep Grace Ekka, Sunita Lakra, Suman Devi Thoudam and Gurjit Kaur will man the defence. The midfield will feature Namita Toppo, Nikki Pradhan, Monika, Lilima Minz and Neha Goyal while Rani, Vandana Katariya and

Lalremisiami will feature in the forward line. This will be the first for new head coach Harendra Singh with the Indian eyes and he would be looking towards a strong performance in Japan with qualification for next year's Hockey women's World Cup London 2018 being his top priority.

## Kavita Devi becomes first Indian woman to sign for WWE

New Delhi, Oct 16  
Kavita Devi, formerly a powerlifter, became the first Indian woman to sign up for the World Wrestling Entertainment (WWE). After The Great Khali and Jinder Mahal became the two male wrestlers to be snapped up the largest wrestling company in the world, it is now the turn of Kavita to take India's flag into the ring. The news was confirmed by Mahal on his visit to the country to promote the WWE India tour which will take place on December 8 and 9. Devi who hails from Haryana underwent training to become a professional wrestler under the guidance of The Great



Khali (Dalip Singh Rana) at his training academy in Punjab. She shot to fame after her video, where she competed against a fellow wrestler B B Bull Bull went viral. She was later invited to be part of the Mae Young Classic women's tournament after competing in the WWE tryouts in Dubai. Her appearance in the Mae Young

tournament made her the first Indian woman to compete in a WWE ring. Even though Devi failed to beat Dakota Kai in her match in the tournament, she has earned herself a massive shot with the contract with the WWE. Her training is slated to begin at the WWE Performance Center in Orlando, Florida in January.

## Triple gold for Selena Selvakumar at Egypt Junior

Egypt, Oct 16  
Table Tennis Championship Young paddler Selena Selvakumar won triple gold medal at the Egypt Junior and Cadet Open Table Tennis Championship. The 17-year-old Chennai girl won singles and doubles gold

medal apart from the team championship gold. Top seeded Selena had to fight her way to the singles' gold though, with her last two matches against the Alhodaby sisters going all the way. She first overcame eighth-seeded Mariam

Alhodaby 4-3 (11-9, 11-8, 10-12, 8-11, 11-8, 5-11, 11-5) in the semi-final. In the final, she beat second seeded Marwa Alhodaby 4-3 (11-5, 12-10, 8-11, 6-11, 11-3, 6-11, 11-4). Selena paired up with Nigeria's Esther Oribamise in the doubles and beat Egypt-Greek duo of Farida Badawy and Malamatenia Papadimitriou 3-2 (11-8, 12-10, 9-11, 8-11, 11-9) in the final to clinch the gold. In the semi-finals, the duo beat Egypt's Sarah Abousetta and Tunisia's Abir Haj Sarah 11-7, 4-11, 13-11, 9-11, 12-10.

## India gain two places in FIFA rankings

New Delhi, Oct 16  
The Indian football team received a boost in FIFA rankings, a week after qualifying for the 2019 AFC Asian Cup by moving up two places to be at the 105th spot. The 'Blue Tigers' were ranked 107th last month but they are now at 105th in the latest rankings, courtesy their win over Macau in the AFC Asian Cup 2019 qualifiers last week. With 328 ranking points, India are just a rung below Zimbabwe and one spot above Niger. Among the Asian Football Confederation countries, India are at 14th spot. The 4-1 win over Macau on October 11 saw India qualify for the 2019 AFC Asian Cup in the UAE.

Lucknow, Oct 16  
Ritu Phogat is among the eight women wrestlers who will represent India at the U-23 World Championships in Poland next month. The squad was picked after the completion of trials here today. ## PV Sindhu, Kidambi Srikanth carry India's hopes at Denmark Open

Odense, Oct 16  
Title-contenders P V Sindhu and Kidambi Srikanth would look to put behind the disappointment of an early exit from Japan Open and make a positive start to their campaign at the \$750,000 Denmark Open Super Series Premier, which begins here on Tuesday. Rio Olympics and World Championship silver medallist Sindhu has been in rampaging form this season as she has already bagged two titles at the India Open and Korea Open respectively. After a gruelling week at Seoul last month, she couldn't sustain the intensity and suffered a second-round defeat against Japan's Nozomi Okuhara - an opponent she had some fierce battles recently - at the Japan Open at Tokyo. The second seeded Indian, however, will be fresh after a three-week training and would look to make amends when she opens her campaign against World No. 10 China's Chen Yufei, a rival she had beaten in the World Championship in August. Chinese seventh seed He Bingjiao is likely to stand in



Sindhu's way to the semi-finals. The left-handed Chinese has a 5-4 record against Sindhu even though the Indian had beaten her at Korea Open. Slowly finding her foot back after battling her way through a career-threatening injury last year, Saina Nehwal will be looking for her first super series win in 16 months. She had won the Australia Open last year in June, 2016 before a knee injury derailed her Rio Olympics dream. The World No. 12 bagged a bronze at the World Championship but she lost to

Carolina Marin at the Japan Open in the second round and the Indian will be itching for a revenge when she faces the fifth seeded Spariand in the opening round here. The duo are locked 4-4 in head-to-head count but the last time Saina had beaten Marin was at the 2015 Dubai World Superseries Finals. The Indian has lost twice in straight games to Marin in the last two meetings and she would need a determined effort to get across the newly-crowned Japan Open champion.

## International Passport mandatory for Haj pilgrims

Port Blair, Oct 16  
Possession of International Passport has been made compulsory by the Haj Committee of India, Mumbai for the intending Haj pilgrims. In this connection, all the intending applicants of A&N Islands have been asked to get their machine readable Passport ready before the announcement of Haj-2018, which is likely to be made by the Haj Committee of India, Mumbai shortly. The existing passport holders have also been advised to check the validity of their passports and get it renewed at least upto March 31, 2019. The intending applicants for Haj 2018 should also ensure that

their passport contains at least two-three empty visa pages adjacent to each other. Attachment of a copy of cancelled cheque having IFSC Code along with the application form is mandatory. This is to ensure speedy disposal of refunds, if any. If the intending applicant has a Bank Account in a non - IFSC Code Bank, they should open an account with a bank having IFSC Code. Further, if the intending applicants do not have any bank account, they should open an account with a Bank having IFSC Code, a communication from the Chairman, A&N Islands State Haj Committee said here.

husband and birth certificate. All eligible beneficiaries who have applied and who have been approved by the competent authority will receive payments through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) in their individual Bank/Post Office Account, specified by them in their application forms within 30 days of approval.

The Anganwadi workers shall provide the acknowledgement of receipt of application forms, provided the application is complete in all aspects. The beneficiaries can only apply for benefit of the scheme within 2 years from the date of the last menstrual period subject to fulfillment of eligibility conditions of the scheme.
