## Resumption of MGNREGA works during pandemic rejuvenates rural livelihood

Port Blair, June 30

The Directorate of RD, PRIs & ULBs has resumed the MGNREGA works on priority to provide employment to the poor households. In the time of pandemic, where most of the poor households are without any source of regular income, the resumption of MGNREGA works after relaxation in lockdown norms recently had rejuvenated rural livelihood in the Islands.

The Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA), one of the most popular flagship programs of Govt. of India ensures at least 100 days of wage employment to rural people and has been a source of livelihood for many rural people.

The MGNREGA has turned out to be a major source of employment to the rural population when all the other source of employments in



urban areas was halted. Beneficiaries are being provided employment as per their demand.

In order to provide employment during the pandemic and reimbursing pending wages of beneficiaries, the Ministry of Rural Development (MoRD) has released a total amount of Rs.763.31 Lakh under MGNREGA for the Financial Year 2021-22. From the total amount released, Rs.584.88 Lakh is released

towards labour wage component including pending wages to tune with Rs.450 Lakh; Rs. 161.15 Lakh is released for Material component and Rs. 17.13Lakh towards Admin component.

The rural populace is very excited on resumption of MGNREGA works and even more encouraged after receipt of pending wages. Around 50 nos. of works have been resumed in

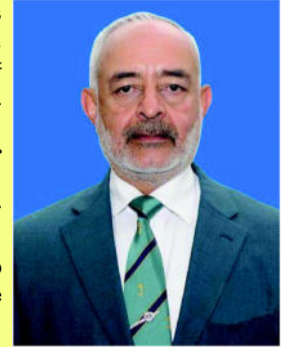

## Vaccination- shield against the virus

### 51,561 eligible beneficiaries in the age group of 18 to 44 vaccinated so far

Port Blair, June 30

The safety of the citizens is the foremost priority of the Administration, especially during this pandemic time. To shield its citizens from the corona virus, the vaccination of eligible beneficiaries is being initiated by the Administration in different parts of the Islands.

Accordingly, the vaccination began with administering of COVISHIELD vaccine for

followed by frontline workers and vulnerable population with co-

morbidities. Subsequently, the vaccination for 45 and above was initiated followed by 18 to 44 years which is currently underway.

Meanwhile, the vaccination drive is continuing smoothly in A&N Islands. As per data available, a total of 1,77,605

## Media briefed on COVID-19

### Administration focusing on five-fold strategy of Testing, Tracking, Treating, COVID Appropriate Behavior and Vaccination to control spread of virus: Secretary (Health)

Port Blair, June 30

A&N Islands is a standalone Territory and the Administration is trying its level best to restrict the entry of corona virus into the Islands from mainland by conducting RTPCR tests of the flight passengers on their arrival for the safety of the Islanders. This was stated by the Secretary (Health), Shri Ram Niwas Sharma briefing media on COVID-19 situation in A&N Islands in the conference hall of IP&T here this evening. The Administration is focusing on the fivefold strategy of Testing, Tracking, Treating, COVID Appropriate Behavior and Vaccination. As per the direction of Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, the testing facility in the Islands are given utmost importance with two third of the tests being conducted through



RTPCR while one third through RAT, he said.

The Secretary further said that during the RTPCR test conducted on 350 passengers who arrived here yesterday, no corona positive case has been detected. Similarly, no positive case was detected during the tests conducted on 141 persons bound for Middle & North Andaman at Ferrargunj. The mobile testing team visited Manjery (Manglutan) area wherein 94 persons were tested till afternoon and there too, all were found negative.

Today, three flights with 421 passengers arrived here and their RTPCR reports are awaited, he said. The Secretary said that there are 42 corona active cases in South Andaman as on 29.06.21 while there is no active case in North & Middle Andaman and Nicobar District.

He further informed that the number of corona positive patients admitted in the G. B Pant Hospital is 4 and all of them are on Oxygen support and no

patient is on ventilator. He reiterated that people should follow COVID Appropriate Behaviour by wearing mask, use hand sanitizer, maintain social distancing and wash their hands regularly.

The Secretary said that vaccination is an important weapon to keep the virus at bay. He said, 38.05% population has been vaccinated till yesterday, out of the total population of 4,00,000. He said, till yesterday, 1,72,916 persons have been inoculated with COVISHIELD Vaccine in A&N Islands. First dose have been given to 1,52,188 beneficiaries covering 54.04% of the population. The second has been given to 20,728 beneficiaries and the number of beneficiaries being vaccinated with second dose is also picking up. He said that second dose count is

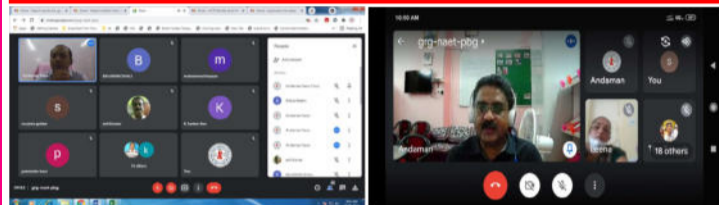
**Last date of submission of life certificate for availing financial assistance under various schemes of Social Welfare Deptt. extended upto July 2**

**ANACS imparts virtual training on Index Testing Services to counselors**

A three-day virtual training on Index Testing Services for counselor was conducted by A&N AIDS Control Society from June 28 to 30, 2021. The counselor of all the ICTCs, Blood Bank, STI and ART Centre attended the virtual training. To achieve the UNAIDS target of zero HIV by 2030, the National AIDS Control Organization, GoI formulated a new HIV testing strategy. Index Testing Services is an effective strategy for identifying new cases of HIV. Index Testing is an effective approach to saturate HIV case finding by providing Index Testing Services to Sexual / Injecting partners and Biological children of people living with HIV. This in turn shall break the chain of HIV transmission in the community. The training was virtually inaugurated by Dr. M. Joy, Project Director, A&N AIDS Control Society. The Project Director emphasized on the paramount importance of utilization of the digital platform in the COVID pandemic scenario. He also stressed to implement the Index Testing Programme to test the population who are hard to reach, unreached, never tested, vulnerable/at risk. The training was imparted by Dr. PK Sikdar, AD (ICTC) I/c and Shri Sankar Rao, AD (M&E). The training was technically supported by Ms Lakshya, Technical Officer (SRL), Smt. Sujatha Malakar, DA and Shri Aji. B, CLS under the guidance of NACO, a press release from A & N AIDS Control Society said.

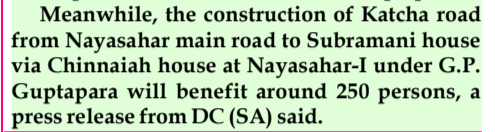
**Exam schedule for integrated courses & B.Ed. Degree of TGCE announced**

the Islands after relaxation in the lockdown. While executing the work, the field officials are ensuring adherence of all COVID protocols viz. social distancing, sanitization of workers and wearing mask in the work sites. An instance of MGNREGA work which has been resumed in this lockdown to provide employment to beneficiaries is at Guptapara Gram Panchayat. A katcha approach road of length 435 m is being constructed from Nayasahar main road to Subramani house via Chinnaiah house at Nayasahar-I which will provide connectivity to around 20 nos. of households of the area. The work is sanctioned with an estimated cost of Rs.4,92,000 and estimated persondays of 1820. At present, around 22 nos. of beneficiaries are being provided employment from the resumption of this work. Expressing her opinion, Smt. Vijaya, a MGNREGA beneficiary from Gram Panchayat Guptapara expressed gratitude to the Administration and MGNREGA team for releasing the pending wages to the beneficiaries in the time of pandemic. She further said that MGNREGA is a lifeline of the poor needy people in providing employment, when all other sources of income were halted and is very happy with the resumption of MGNREGA work at Guptapara. less as it is given after 84 days after administering of first dose. 1, 03,713 beneficiaries in the age group of 45 plus have been inoculated while the number of 18 plus beneficiaries vaccinated stood at 48,475 as on June 29. He said that the vaccination drive is continuing smoothly and till 3 pm today, 460 eligible persons in the age group of 18-44 were inoculated in JNRM while the number of beneficiaries vaccinated under 45 plus age group stood at 190. Efforts will be made to cover the small pockets as per the availability of vaccine. He informed that there is sufficient stock of vaccine for the 2<sup>nd</sup> dose beneficiaries and urged them to inoculate themselves as per their due date without fail. The Secretary also sought the co-operation of one and all in following COVID Appropriate Behavior which will help the Administration in controlling the spread of the virus. "We should not let our guard down and should not be complacent till our Islands achieve ZERO status of COVID positive cases". # ANIIMS for YOU

## NATIONAL DOCTORS DAY- 2021

1<sup>st</sup> July of every year India celebrates the National Doctors Day. In India National Doctors Day was started to commemorate the birthday of Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy, a legendary physician from West Bengal for his immense contribution to the medical field in India during British era. After the Indian Independence he became the 2<sup>nd</sup> Chief Minister of West Bengal. He was a great physician, a philanthropist, educationist, a great freedom fighter and a true and dedicated politician. He was born on this day in the year 1882 and also died on the same day in 1962.

Now question may arise why the Indian Government has chosen his birthday to be celebrated as the National Doctors Day? To answer this question we may mention a quote from the British Medical Journal, which in its obituary described Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy as the "first medical consultant in the subcontinent of India, who towered over his contemporaries in several fields...at his professional zenith he may have had the largest consulting practice in the world, news of his visit to a city or even railway station bringing forth hordes of would be patients".

This was a great achievement for any Indian during the pre-independence period when British ruled over India. He was credited with provision of delivering quality health care available for common people and was instrumental in establishing two great prestigious Institutions in the country - The Indian Medical Association (IMA) in 1928 and The Medical Council of India (MCI) in 1945, of which he was the 1st President. He also took the initiative to establish the Indian Institute of Mental Health, the Infectious disease hospital in Kolkata and Kolkata's first ever Post Graduate Medical College. He was among the few Indians who obtained both FRCS and MRCP degree simultaneously.

He was honored with the country's highest civilian award, the Bharat Ratna in the year 1961. In 1976, the BC Roy National Award was instituted by the IMA and awarded every year on National Doctors day to the eligible doctors for their exemplary work and contribution in the field of medicine. So on this auspicious occasion of National Doctors Day we pay our humble homage to this great figure for his contribution thus leaving an indelible mark in the history of medical profession in India.

This day is very significant in many aspects, on one side it reminds the doctor fraternity about their noble medical profession and the pledge taken by them to serve humanity and those in need while maintaining the Code of Ethics. Medical profession always starts with the Hippocratic oath which states to treat the ill to the best of one's ability, to preserve a patient's privacy, to teach the secrets of medicine to the next generation and so on & ultimately the physician is dedicating his or her life and actions to the needs of the individual patient, as well as to the humanity. On the other hand it reminds the common people about the selfless services made by the doctors throughout the world and to thank them, acknowledge their selfless contribution and show gratitude for rendering their services for betterment of mankind.

This year is also very relevant as we are fighting against a unknown enemy COVID-19, which is creating a havoc worldwide. We have witnessed loss of human resources and many valuable life's in the 1st wave as well as in 2nd wave of COVID pandemic, which has hit mankind in a much worse manner. We have seen our medical fraternity fighting day and night against this unknown enemy and also many of them have lost their lives or of their dear ones to this deadly virus.

While on one hand people across India and around the globe are largely confined to their homes with businesses and educational institutions all shut down in an attempt to contain the virus, and on the other hand doctors and medical staff members are leading the battle against COVID-19 from the front. Putting their own lives at risk with selfless determination for the sake of saving lives standing as the barrier between the virus and the public. Needless to say the doctors and staff working in health-care sectors are particularly vulnerable to the highly infectious disease. In the fight against corona virus, the brave medical army stands strong with thermometers, stethoscopes, and ventilators as their weapons.

This virus was not able to break our courage rather it has increased by leaps and bounds.
