



Country registers 3,11,170 new COVID cases; records daily new recoveries of over 3,62,000 people

New Delhi, May 16

The Health Ministry has informed that in the last 24 hours, the nation registered 3 lakh 11 thousand 170 new COVID cases. Over 3 lakh 62 thousand people have recovered and with this the recovery rate has further improved to stand at 84.25 per cent. So far, over 2 crore 7 lakh people have recovered from the COVID-19 infection in the country.

The cumulative share of active COVID cases in the country has declined to comprise nearly 14.66 per cent of the total reported cases. Currently over 36 lakh 18 thousand people are reported to be suffering from the viral pandemic and are either

Covid recovery rate further improves to 84.25 % in country



New Delhi, May 16 The Health Ministry has informed that in the last 24 hours, the nation registered 3,11,170 new COVID cases. Over 3,62,000 people have recovered and with this the recovery rate has further improved to stand at 84.25 per cent.

Pradesh, Punjab, Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat & Kerala continue to be the major hotspots of the viral pandemic. Nearly 75 per cent of the new cases are reported from these 10 states.

The Health Ministry has informed that four thousand 77 COVID related deaths were reported in the last 24 hours taking the cumulative toll to 2,70,284. With a special focus on the 5-point principle of 'Test, Track, Treat, Isolate & Vaccinate', the number of cumulative COVID-19 testing reported by Indian Council of Medical Research, ICMR has surpassed the figure of 31.48 crore.

Currently over 36.18 lakh people are reported to be suffering from the viral pandemic and are either hospitalised or are under home isolation. The apex medical research body has informed that in the past 24 hours more than 18.32 lakh samples were tested in the country.

AIIMS doctors provide guidance on Medication and Care for Mild COVID-19 Patients

New Delhi, May 16

The commonly observed symptoms among COVID-19 patients are fever, dry cough, tiredness and loss of taste or smell. Irritation in throat, headache, body ache, diarrhoea, rash on skin and redness in eyes are also observed in rare cases.

If you observe any of these symptoms, you should immediately isolate yourself from others. This was informed by Dr. Neeraj Nishchal of AIIMS Delhi, during a webinar on "Medication and Care in Home Isolation", for patients who are tested positive for COVID-19. The webinar was organized by The Centre of Excellence of the Union Health and Family Welfare Ministry. 80 per cent of infected patients experience very mild symptoms.

The medications are to be taken in proper quantity and at accurate timing. Knowing about the medicine is not enough; patients should also know how and when they are to be taken, only then would it prove to be beneficial, said Dr. Neeraj.

The decision of home isolation for patients above 60 years and with co-morbidities like Hypertension, Diabetes, Heart Disease, chronic ailments related to kidneys and lungs, should be taken only after

consulting doctors.

Here are some measures COVID-19 positive patients need to take, as part of managing the infection.

Regular medicines should be taken, requirements for sanitization and cleanliness should be met. Medical grade masks should be stocked in advance. We should plan for daily essentials and prepare list of contact numbers for health-related information, health workers, hotlines, etc. Along with this, contact numbers of friends, other family members and neighbours should also be kept handy for emergency situations. Proper care and planning should be done also for the children in the family.

Mild and asymptomatic patients should be kept in home isolation. Such patients should take utmost care to keep safe distance from other family members, especially children. Medicines required frequently should be easily accessible by the patients. Proper and regular communication between caregiver and doctor is necessary. Positive patients should always wear three-layered mask. Masks should be discarded after proper sanitization every 8 hours. Patient and caregiver both should wear N-95 masks while

interacting with each other.

Pulse Oximeter should be used to monitor oxygen levels in body, very carefully. Artificial nails or nail polish should be removed before use and patient's hand should be warmed if it is cold. Take rest for at least five minutes before testing. If the observation is constant for five seconds, the figure indicates oxygen level in your body. Remdesivir should never be taken at home. Positive attitude and regular exercise are a must for patients in home isolation, said Dr. Neeraj.

If the oxygen level goes below 94, patients should be admitted, said Dr Manish of AIIMS Delhi, speaking about "Revised Guidelines for Mild COVID-19 patients during treatment". While checking oxygen level, age of the patient and other chronic disease should be kept in mind.

Informing about the use of Ivermectin, Dr. Manish said that its use depends on the immunity level and other patient-specific conditions. The same holds for the use of Paracetamol.

During the discussion, both experts clearly said that no medication should be taken during home isolation, without consulting doctors (Source: india.gov.in)

Health Ministry issues SOP on COVID-19 Containment & Management in Peri-urban, Rural & Tribal areas

New Delhi, May 16

Union Health Ministry has issued Standard operating procedure on COVID-19 Containment and Management in Peri-urban, Rural and Tribal areas.

The Ministry said, a large number of cases of Covid 19 is reported in urban areas. However, a gradual increase is now being seen in peri-urban, rural and tribal areas as well. In view of this there is a need to enable communities, strengthen primary level healthcare infrastructure at all levels to intensify COVID-19 response in these areas. Health Ministry said, nearly 80 to 85 per cent COVID-19 cases are asymptomatic and or mildly symptomatic. These patients do not require hospitalization and may be managed at home or in Covid care isolation facilities. The monitoring of oxygen saturation is important for monitoring of COVID patients.

For this it is desirable for each village to have adequate number of pulse oximeters and thermometers. The Village Health,



Sanitation and Nutrition committee, VHSNC should mobilize resources to make provisions for these equipment. A system of providing the pulse oximeters and thermometers to families with a confirmed case of COVID should be developed through ASHA, Anganwadi workers and village-level volunteers. The Ministry said, home Isolation kit shall be provided, which includes required medicines such as Paracetamol 500 mg, Tablet Ivermectin, cough syrup, multivitamins besides a detailed pamphlet indicating the precautions to be taken and medication details. The contact

details should also be provided to them, in case of any major symptoms or deterioration of health condition. Patients under home isolation will stand discharged and end isolation after at least 10 days have passed from onset of symptoms and no fever for three days. There is no need for testing after the home isolation period is over. The Ministry said, Peri-urban and rural areas may plan a minimum of 30-bedded Covid care centers. The Centres shall offer care for asymptomatic cases with comorbidities or mild cases where home isolation is not feasible. It could admit a COVID suspect or confirmed case.

Centre provides more than 20 crore vaccine doses to States, UTs free of Cost so far: Health Ministry

New Delhi, May 16

Union Health Ministry today said that more than 20 crore vaccine doses have been provided to States and Union Territories free of Cost by the Central Government, so far. It said, Centre has been supporting the nationwide vaccination drive by providing COVID Vaccines to the States and UTs, in addition to several efforts to ramp up its production and supply.

More than one crore 84 lakh COVID Vaccine doses are still



available with the States and UTs to be administered. The Ministry said, nearly 51 lakh vaccine

doses are in the pipeline and will be received by the States and UTs within the next three days.




