Later in the afternoon, the Minister visited Hut Bay, Little Andaman. He was accompanied by the Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray, BJP State President, Shri Vishal Jolly and other officials of the A&N Administration. The Minister held a discussion with the officials of Department of Environment & Forests in the APWD Guest House at Hut Bay. Thereafter, the Minister also held a public meeting at Hut Bay, during which issues of reviving red oil palm plantation, development of tourism, use of un-inhabited Islands, relaxing ban imposed by Hon'ble Supreme Court on logging etc. were addressed by the Minister. After completion of his visit, the Minister returned to Port Blair. The Minister also visited Ross Island later in the evening.

While addressing the gathering on the occasion, the Minister underlined the need for implementing Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) in the tribal areas of Nicobar District. Accordingly, the PWD was directed to submit a plan proposal under PMGSY for implementation there. The Minister also stressed that all the Central Govt. schemes should be implemented in these Islands and also desired that the tribal

youth should take up skill development trainings at Port Blair. The Minister also enquired about the prospects of oil palm cultivation on grasslands there.

The First Captain, Champin, Shri Andrew Paul also raised issues regarding damaged crops and plantation, post-tsunami in the Islands. Other issues that came up in the discussion included construction of a dam at Kamorta, ongoing work on the road from Champin to Tapong, water

Australia beat India by three wickets in the 3rd ODI at the Melbourne Cricket Ground on Sunday to take an unassailable 3-0 lead in the five-match series. Virat Kohli's magnificent ton went in vain as Indian bowlers couldn't manage to defend a sizeable total for the third time in a row. After winning the toss, Australia offered the visitors to bat first. Even after losing in-form batsman Rohit Sharma early in the innings, Virat Kohli (117) and Shikhar Dhawan (68) added 119 runs for the second wicket to give India a good platform. New Delhi and Mumbai will host the semi-finals of the event on March 30 and 31, while Kolkata will be the venue of the April 3 final.

New Delhi, Jan 17
New Delhi: Swiss tennis ace Martina Hingis has joined her Indian partner Sania Mirza at the top of the WTA women's doubles rankings, a day after the duo bagged their second title of the season in Sydney. The WTA rankings were released on Saturday and Hingis has a whopping 11,395 points. The 35-year-old champion joined Mirza at the top. Sania and Hingis' brilliant dominant run continued without any hindrance, as they lifted their second trophy of the season on Friday with the WTA Apia International title after clinching their 30th win in

the first eight overs. However, Australia kept losing wickets at regular intervals and at one stage were reduced to 215 for six. But Glenn Maxwell probably played one of the most sensible knocks of his ODI career and took the match away from India's grasp, with the help of a magnificent 96 off 104 balls.
