25 children including 13 girls selected for National Bravery Awards



New Delhi, Jan 17
Twenty five children have been selected for the national bravery awards 2016. These include 13 girls. Four of the awards have been given posthumously. The coveted Bharat award has been conferred on 8 year old Late Kumari Tarh Peju of Arunachal Pradesh, who sacrificed her life while saving two of her friends from drowning. The prestigious Geeta Chopra award has been conferred on 18 year old Tejasweeta Pradhan and 17 year old Shivani Gond of West Bengal who showed immense courage fearlessly helping police and NGO in uncovering an international sex racket leading to the arrest of the

mastermind in Delhi. The Sanjya Chopra award has been given to 15 year old Sumit Mamgain of Uttarakhand who displayed outstanding bravery in fighting a leopard to save his cousin.

The children will receive their awards from Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi on 23rd of this month. They will also participate in the parade. President Shri Pranab Mukherjee will host reception in their honour.

concerned with the Executive Engineers of APWD & Electricity Deptt, Joint Director, Agriculture, Assistant Directors of Fisheries & AH&VS Deptt., Deputy Directors of Health, Transport & Shipping Departments, Deputy Education Officer concerned, Block Development Officer, Tehsildar, Executive Engineer, PRI, Executive Engineer, ZP, Deputy Superintendent of Police and Assistant Chief Conservator of Forest as

Members.

The 'Tehsil Diwas' will be held once in a month at each Tehsil and all the Sub Division level officers of various Departments shall compulsorily take part in it under the chairmanship of Sub Divisional Magistrate. If he has to take leave of absence, the same shall be taken from the chair prior to the meeting. SDM/ADM/ACs as the case may be, shall attend to the grievances of the individuals and pass necessary written

instructions to the Departmental heads in the meeting itself which should be as per law & rules/regulation as applicable.

The Departmental heads should carry out the instructions within time as directed by the Chairman and submit compliance to the Deputy Commissioner/ Sub Divisional Magistrate/ Additional District Magistrate/ Assistant Commissioner (S)/ Departmental HOD. If the

Departmental head is not able to implement the direction in time due to illegal issues/ fund constraint/ other genuine constraints & restrictions, the same shall be communicated within 7 days to Sub Divisional Magistrate/ Deputy Commissioner (SA). If the Deputy Commissioner (SA) finds that the directions have not been complied without any genuine reason or due to lackadaisical/malafide

One convicted for assaulting woman

Port Blair, Jan 17

Ld. Sessions Judge Sidhartha Kanjilal has convicted the accused Keshav Rao on Jan 16, 2017 for assaulting a pregnant woman following which she succumbed to the injuries and died. The accused Keshav Rao was produced from judicial custody on Jan 17 and after hearing him and his counsel, the Ld. Court of Sessions Judge has imposed punishment upon the accused Keshav for 5 years and to pay fine of Rs.5000/- and in default of payment of fine, he

has to suffer further rigorous imprisonment for a period of 6 months for commission of offence punishable U/s 304 Part II IPC.

The Sessions Judge also imposed punishment upon the accused person to suffer rigorous imprisonment for 6 months and to pay fine of Rs.1000/-. In default of payment of fine, he has to suffer rigorous imprisonment for 1 more month for the offence punishable U/s 451 of IPC, a communication from the Public Prosecutor, A&N Administration said here today.

India starts building 'world's biggest' Cricket stadium in Ahmedabad; will cost around \$100 million

Gujrat, Jan 17
India has started building the world's biggest cricket stadium that will accommodate 110,000 spectators and cost around \$100 million.

Since the capacity of Kolkata's Eden Gardens was reduced as part of a major rebuilding project, Melbourne Cricket Ground has held the title of the sport's largest stadium with seating for around 100,000. But speaking at a groundbreaking ceremony on Monday in India's western Gujarat state, officials said a new stadium would be able to

welcome 110,000 people. Gujarat Cricket Association vice president Parimal Nathwani put the overall cost of the project in the city of Ahmedabad at seven billion rupees, saying the venue would house other facilities. "The stadium will have 76 corporate boxes, four dressing rooms, a clubhouse and an Olympic-size swimming pool," Nathwani was quoted as saying. The complex, to be built over the next two years, will also have three practice grounds and an indoor cricket academy.

It is on the site of the recently demolished Sardar Patel Gujarat Stadium, which could hold around 50,000 spectators. India, the world's top-ranked Test team, has more than a dozen stadiums capable of holding international cricket matches. The completed stadium is expected to be the home of the Gujarat Lions, one of the eight teams in the Indian Premier League Twenty20 tournament. Gujarat are also the current holders of the Ranji Trophy, India's state championship.

Kagiso Rabada replaces Dale Steyn as South Africa's No.1 Test bowler; Hashim Amla climbs to sixth spot

Dubai, Jan 17
Fast bowler Kagiso Rabada's strong performances in the recently-concluded three-match Test series against Sri Lanka made him South Africa's highest-ranked Test bowler, moving him one place above Dale Steyn, who is currently recuperating from the shoulder fracture he suffered during his side's tour of Australia in November. Rabada, who was one of South Africa's stars in its ICC U-19 Cricket World Cup 2014 triumph, stole the bowling limelight when he returned with the figures of three for 44 and two for 50. For this performance, he has earned a rise of three places which has put him in fifth position in the ICC Player Rankings for Test Bowlers. Rabada now leads Steyn by two points and trails Sri Lanka's fourth-ranked spinner Rangana Herath by six points.



For Sri Lanka, the only good news is the rise of fast bowler Nuwan Pradeep, who has leaped six places to a career-best 33rd spot following figures of four for 78 in South Africa's only innings. South Africa defeated Sri Lanka by an innings and 118 runs in Johannesburg, which gave it a 3-0 series win. The result means third-ranked South Africa has gained four points and has moved up to 107 points, two behind Australia, while seventh-ranked Sri Lanka has dropped four points to finish on 92 points.

The six centurions from the recently concluded Test matches in Johannesburg and Wellington have also been rewarded with impressive movements in the latest ICC Player Rankings for Test Batsmen. South Africa's Hashim Amla, who while scoring 134 became the eighth batsman to score a century in his 100th Test, has jumped four places to claim sixth position, while JP Duminy, who scored 155 and added 292 runs for the third wicket with Amla, has vaulted nine places to secure a career-high 33rd position.

Australian Open 2017: Rafael Nadal, Serena Williams, Milos Raonic power into 2nd round

Melbourne, Jan 17
In Australian Open Tennis, the first Grand Slam of the season, top-shot players like world number two Serena Williams, Rafael Nadal, Milos Raonic and Karolina Pliskova today advanced to the Singles second round. While Serena got the better of Swiss Belinda Bencic, 6-4, 6-3, Plisbova saw off Spain's Sara Tormo, 6-2, 6-0. Dominika Cibulkova and Caroline Wozniacki also made it to the second round. In Men's Singles, ninth seed Nadal defeated Florian Mayer, 6-3, 6-4, 6-4, while third placed Raonic beat Dustin Brown, 6-3, 6-4, 6-2. World number one Andy Murray, Angelique Kerber, Roger Federer, Garbine Muguruza and Stanislas Wawrinka have already progressed to

Round-2. The Doubles, featuring a number of Indian players, are yet to be played.

Australia's tour of India: Marcus Stoinis replaces injured Mitchell Marsh in Aussie ODI squad

Melbourne, Jan 17
Victorian all-rounder Marcus Stoinis will replace the injured Mitchell Marsh in Australia's one day international squad for the ongoing series against Pakistan, Cricket Australia said on Monday. Fast bowling all-rounder Marsh has been ruled out of the remainder of the five-match series with a shoulder injury, which he sustained in Australia's six-wicket loss against Pakistan in the second one-dayer at the Melbourne Cricket Ground on Sunday. Australia have already added

batsman Peter Handscomb to their squad with Chris Lynn ruled out of Thursday's third ODI in Perth due to an ongoing neck injury. Stoinis has a single one-day international for Australia to his name, against England in 2015. The 27-year-old will play Melbourne Stars' Big Bash Twenty20 match against Brisbane Heat on Tuesday before he and leg-spinner Adam Zampa, who has been released from the squad to play in the same match, join the one-day team in Perth on Wednesday.

NEFR to launch new tourist train

Guwahati, Jan 17
In Assam, the North-East Frontial (NF) Railways has announced the launch of Aastha Circuit Tourist Train from Guwahati. The new train would take travellers to a mix of popular pilgrimage destinations across the eastern part of the country at affordable rates. The all-inclusive special tourist train will start on February 17. The train would take the tourists to various famous religious destinations like Gangesagar, Sri Swamy Narayan Temple, Kalighat, Birla Temple in Kolkata, Sri Jagannath Temple and Konark Temple in Puri and Bhubaneswar - Lingaraj Temple. The duration of the tour from Guwahati to Guwahati is six nights and seven days and per person cost for the entire trip is Rs 6,161 only.

Not retiring from Test cricket; unavailable for New Zealand series: AB de Villiers

Johnesburg, Jan 17
AB de Villiers will not be retiring from Test cricket, but South Africa's one-day captain will sit out the upcoming series against New Zealand as he figures out the best way to manage his workload ahead of the 2019 World Cup. De Villiers has spent the past six months on the sidelines with an elbow injury, but is due to make his international comeback in the third Twenty20 international against Sri Lanka at Newlands on January 25. Asked when he would be returning to the Test side, de Villiers said on Tuesday. "Not yet. I'm not there yet. The reason being that I just need to settle things in my head. Over the last few years something has come to mind, which is the fact that we haven't won a World Cup yet. And for me to make it



to the 2019 World Cup, I can't really be serious in every format. "So I've made myself unavailable for the New Zealand Test series. I will be there for the ODIs, and I'm definitely not retiring from Test cricket because I have plans to come back at some stage. For me, for now the most important thing is the 2019 World Cup. I

want to make sure we get there, I want to make sure we lift that trophy. That's the first goal for me."
