## Chartered flight on Kolkata-Port Blair-Kolkata sector to operate on every Thursday from Feb 25

Port Blair, Feb 17

The chartered flight on Kolkata-Port Blair-Kolkata sector will now be operated on every Thursday instead of Fridays, due to operational constraints, as the crew for operation of this flight on Fridays were not available as conveyed by the Air India Head Office to the Secretary (Civil Aviation) Shri N.K.Sharma. The issues have been sorted out and necessary clearances have been

given for operation of this chartered flight on Kolkata-Port Blair sector on every Thursday w.e.f 25.02.2016.

As per the fresh schedule, Air India will operate weekly one charter flight on every Thursday with 144 seater Airbus aircraft from 25th February, 2016 during night hours. Accordingly, the Air India flight AI 3707 will depart from Kolkata at 9 pm and reach Port Blair

at 11 pm. On its return, the flight AI 3708 will depart from Port Blair at 11.40 PM to reach Kolkata at 01.40 A.M.

Initially, advance ticketing will be done for the flights scheduled upto March, 2016. The flights will be available on Feb 25, March 3, 10, 17, 24 & 31, 2016.

Passengers intending to travel from Port Blair to Kolkata and from Kolkata to Port Blair on these flights can

book their tickets in advance at the Inter-Island Helicopter terminal, VIP Road, Port Blair between 9 AM & 4 PM on all working days from 18th February, 2016 onwards. Tickets for sector Kolkata to Port Blair can also be booked at the office of the Dy. Resident Commissioner, Andaman & Nicobar Bhawan, No. 7, D.P. Block, Sector 5, Salt Lake, Kolkata-91 between 10 A.M. & 4 P.M. Passengers have been asked to

submit their requisition in the prescribed format available on website www.and.nic.in. Only one ticket will be issued per applicant. However, in case of family, a maximum of 4 tickets will be issued per application. Out of the total 144 seats 115 seats will be reserved for Islanders while the rest 29 seats can be allotted to non-Islanders.

## Badminton Asia Cup: India beats Singapore, enters quarterfinals

Hyderabad, Feb 17  
India sailed into the quarterfinals of Badminton Asia Team Championship with a comprehensive 5-0 victory over Singapore in Hyderabad on Wednesday.  
India, thus, made a strong comeback after suffering a defeat to China in their first Group A tie on Monday. Each tie comprises three singles and two doubles matches.  
To begin with, Kidambi Srikanth scored a comfortable 21-16, 12-21, 21-13 win over Zi Liang Derek Wong in the first singles match at the Gachibowli Indoor Stadium. The Singaporean tried to compete

but the world number 9 Indian, after losing the second game, bounced back to have the last laugh. It turned out to be a one-sided affair for Ajay Jayaram in the second singles against Kean Yew Loh as he went on to score a 21-11, 21-18 victory.  
India's doubles players, too, came up with an impressive performance and won the two matches quite easily. Manu Attri and Sumeeth Reddy beat Yong Kai Terry Hee-Kean Hean Loh 21-15, 21-14. While the duo of Pranaav Jerry Chopra and Akshay Dewalkar triumphed Danny Bawa Chrisnanta and Hendra Wijaya 21-14, 21-13 in

the second doubles match. The 27-ranked HS Prannoy, too, dominated his singles match against Zin Rei Ryan NG, winning it 21-10, 21-12.  
Chief national coach Pullela Gopichand expressed happiness over the team's commanding performance. "It's a good win. The 5-0 win is wonderful. Hopefully, we will do better in the next matches as well," he told PTI.  
In the morning session's other men's matches, Japan trounced Sri Lanka 5-0, Malaysia defeated Nepal 5-0 and Hong Kong China beat Philippines 4-1.

### India women beat Sri Lanka by 6 wickets to seal series in Ranchi

Ranchi, Feb 17  
The Indian women cricket team took an unassailable 2-0 lead in the three-match ODI series against Sri Lanka with a six-wicket win in the second match here on Wednesday.  
Opting to bat first, Sri Lanka could manage only 178 for nine in the allotted 50 overs at the JSCA International Stadium Complex.  
18-year-old Deepthi Sharma was the wrecker-in-chief, picking up four for 23 with her medium pace bowling, to set up the home side's win. Skipper Mithali Raj then remained unbeaten on 53 to guide her team home with as many as 41 balls to spare. India were 179 for four in 43.1 overs when the winning run was scored.

### Justin Gatlin vows to beat Usain Bolt at 2016 Rio Olympics

New York, Feb 17  
Controversial American sprinter Justin Gatlin has vowed to defeat the world's fastest man Usain Bolt at the Rio Olympics later this year. Gatlin is seeking revenge after Jamaican Bolt put a troubled build-up behind him to beat the American and retain his world 100 metre title in Beijing last year, reports CMC. The prospect of another clash between Bolt and Gatlin sets the tone for an epic 100m showdown during the summer Olympics in Brazil from August 5-21.  
"I'm going to win. We are bringing it (gold medal) back to the USA. We are going to bring it back to the USA, to LA to New York," said Gatlin on Tuesday.

The campaign shall be replicated in all the wards of Municipal Council in a phased manner to eradicate Open Defecation. Besides, adequate planning for Collection of litter / Solid Wastes through Solid Waste Management was also undertaken in the said ward which will be extended to other wards in phased manner.

After the completion of the campaign, action under the provisions of Prohibition of Employment as Manual Scavengers and their Rehabilitation Act 2013 will be taken against defaulters who practice open defecation for achieving an Open Defecation Free city status.

### Over 8.4 lakh foreign tourists came to India in Jan

New Delhi, Feb 17  
As many as 8.44 lakh foreign tourists arrived in India in January as compared to 7.91 lakh during the same month last year, recording a growth of 6.8 per cent in the footfall.

Foreign Exchange Earnings (FEEs) from tourism increased 13 per cent at Rs 13,669 crore in January this year against Rs 12,100 crore in the same period in 2015, an official release said. The US topped the list of percentage share of foreign
