New Delhi, May 17 President Pranab Mukherjee received the first copies of the books - 'Tagore's Vision of the Contemporary World' and 'Tagore and Russia' at Rashtrapati Bhavan in New Delhi yesterday. Speaking on the occasion, the President said that he was happy to receive the first

copies of these books containing proceedings of seminars organized in 2011 by the Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR). He complimented the ICCR on the initiative and for its support for Tagore Studies over the years. He urged ICCR to continue these exercises and to support Tagore scholars across the world in the coming days. The President said Tagore travelled widely within India and abroad. Russia had a special place in Tagore's heart. Tagore was attracted to the Soviet Union having heard of the success of its programmes of rural education. The books have been edited by Prof. Indra Nath Choudhuri and Dr. Reba Som.

Law for celebs endorsing unverified products soon

Patna, May 17 The Centre is working on a new legislation to replace the existing Consumer Protection Act, which will have penal provisions of Rs 50 lakh and five year imprisonment for celebrities promoting sale of items without verifying the quality, Union Minister Shri Ramvilas Paswan said today. The proposed Consumer Protection Bill, 2016 has already been approved by the Parliamentary Standing Committee and would be introduced in Parliament in the next session, the Food and Consumer Affairs Minister told reporters here. The new legislation to replace the existing

Consumer Protection Act, 1986 would have stringent provisions against actors and other personalities doing advertisements for brands without verifying the products. "Some leading actors/actresses like Amitabh Bachchan, Salman Khan and others claim that the products they promote will add to one's strength or one will have hair on a bald head, which is not true.

Such things should stop. You advertise for an item only after being convinced of its results yourself," Paswan said. In the new legislation, penalty for indulging in a "deceiving" advertisement would be enhanced to Rs 50 lakh from Rs ten lakh at present and the jail term to five years from the current two years, he said. Shri Paswan said the new legislation would have

elaborate scope for a consumer to lodge complaint against a sub-standard product sitting at home and it would also enhance the monetary limits of district and state-level consumer redressal courts. "The new legislation will make it mandatory that the complaint be registered within 21 days," he said adding, it would enhance

Foreign varsities coming to India will have to collaborate with Indian institutions: Minister

New Delhi, May 17 The Government has proposed that foreign universities coming to India will have to collaborate with Indian academic institutions so that in case of any legal dispute, the settlement will be done in the country itself. Human Resource Development Minister Smt Smriti Irani said this in an exclusive interview to AIR. Smt Irani also said that the government will soon come out with a new Education policy to promote quality

education in the country. She said, views and suggestions of various stakeholders including Education Councils have been considered to prepare the policy. The Minister said that the Committee set up for the purpose will submit the Draft Policy within 15 to 20 days.

New Delhi, May 17 Union Minister for Social Justice and Empowerment Shri Thaawarchand Gehlot has said that Center will soon come up with a new bill to improve the present law for Disabilities. Inaugurating the 14th National convention for Persons with Disabilities in New Delhi today, Shri Gehlot said this bill is presently in PMO for consideration. He said in

the new bill there will be 19 categories in place of present 7 categories for Disabilities. Shri Gehlot said, the government made many historic achievements in the last two years. He said, for the first time, Center started scholarships for 'divyang' persons. He added that the Government has launched the Accessible India Campaign or Sugamya Bharat

Abhiyan as a step towards achieving Universal Accessibility. 50 Cities and 705 Railway stations across the country are being covered under the Campaign. The Minister informed that the Department is not only providing assistive devices to 'divyangs' but has also provided skill training to over 48 thousand in the last one year.

SV Sunil will be Sreejesh's deputy in the squad which also has seasoned first team players like VR Raghunath, Kothajit Singh, SK Uthappa, Akashdeep Singh to name a few. performers from the team's silver medal winning Azlan Shah Cup team, finds himself retained in the squad, and is joined by his junior colleagues, Harjeet Singh and Goalkeeper Vikas Dahiya, who will be a back up to Sreejesh in the squad. Speaking after the squad announcement, Sreejesh said, "At the Champions Trophy, our aim will be to put in a class performance and finish as high as we can. Side strain rules Glenn Maxwell out of remaining tournament

Sydney, May 17
Glenn Maxwell on Tuesday became the fifth Australian to pull out of the Indian Premier League (IPL), but his injury is unlikely to keep him out of an upcoming West Indies tour. The hard-hitting batsman suffered a strain in his left abdomen playing for the Kings XI Punjab and is returning home as a precaution. Australia team physiotherapist David Beakley said it did not appear serious enough to prevent him playing in the West Indies tri-series, which Australia open in Guyana on June 6 against South Africa. "From the information we have so far, the injury doesn't appear to be something that will prevent Glenn from participating in this tour," he said.

Djokovic suffers rare loss as Murray takes Rome title

Rome, May 17
Andy Murray punctured Novak Djokovic's air of dominance by beating the out-of-form Serb in straight sets in the final of the Italian Open in Rome on Sunday. Just a week after Djokovic had beaten him in the final of the Madrid Open, the Scot gained his revenge over the world number one in another claycourt final with a superb 6-3 6-3 win in one hour and 35 minutes. Djokovic was not at his best and in a grumpy mood, complaining on several

occasions to the umpire about the slippery court surface on a damp day at the Foro Italico. He slumped to only his third defeat of the entire season, hitting a couple of errant forehands and a double fault in the final game before Murray conjured up one inspirational backhand winner to lift the title. No British man had won the Italian title since 1931 and the triumph gives the world number three Murray a major boost before the second of the season's grand slams, the French Open, starts next week.
