



Govt launches 'Operation Clean Money' website to bring illegal wealth on books

New Delhi, May 17 Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley has said number of filing income tax return and tax collection has gone up post- demonetisation. Launching the Operation Clean Money Portal of Income Tax Department in New Delhi yesterday, Shri Jaitley said, detection of tax evasion has become easy and it will no longer be safe for the people indulging in tax evasion. He said, the Department has identified 18 lakh tax payers whose cash transaction made from 8th of November to 30th of December, 2016 during demonetisation period did not appear in line with their income profile. He said, about 91 lakh more income



tax returns have been filed and the number of persons whose income profile do not match will increase further. Shri Jaitley said, the Clean Money portal will provide information about user guides, frequently asked questions and training toolkits related to

verification process. He said, the portal will provide more facility to the tax compliant. The Operation Clean Money was launched by the Income Tax Department in January this year for e-verification of large cash deposits made during demonetisation period.

There has been encouraging response to the online verification process and large number of tax payers submitted their responses without visiting the Income Tax office. In addition to 18 lakh cases, 5.68 lakh new cases have also been identified for e-verification.

The programme now has been extended to all districts of the country from 1st of January this year. It is applicable only to the first born baby. The Maternity Benefit Programme will provide



compensation for the wage loss in terms of cash incentives so that the women can take adequate

rest before and after delivery and not be deprived of proper nutrition.

IEST creates India's first smart grid project

New Delhi, May 17

The Indian Institute of Engineering Science and Technology (IEST) has successfully created the country's first smart grid project, which will generate power from renewable sources of energy. IEST Director, Prof. Ajoy Kumar Roy said that the project is soon likely to be inaugurated by President Shri Pranab Mukherjee. Prof. Roy said, the smart grid will be synchronised to generate power from solar, wind and vegetable waste resources, depending on the weather conditions and availability of waste products. He said, this project is the first of its kind in the country. The power to be generated from solar energy depends on the availability of sunlight, while wind energy will be produced during nor'wester and tropical storm. The power from biogas will be generated from vegetable waste collected from the campus kitchen and outside markets.

Port Blair, May 17 A month long Capacity Building, Skill Upgradation & Design Development training for Coconut shell Handicrafts commenced at Tushnabad, South Andaman yesterday with tributes to the portrait of Mahatma Gandhi, the Father of the Nation. The training is being organized under the new scheme of 'Promotion of local handicrafts of A & N Islands' (A state collaboration initiative of the Department of AR & PG, Govt. of India, New Delhi). The highlight of the training is that it is covering a batch of 40 women who intend to become entrepreneurs with support of KVIB and Directorate of Industries. Smti Rashmi Singh, Secretary (Ind.) & Vice Chairperson, A&NI KVIB inaugurated the

programme in presence of Shri Ajit Anand, Director of Industries, Shri Aloke Kumar Saha, Regional Manager, RO, SBI, Port Blair, Smti Mary Jasinta, Pradhan, Gram Panchayat, Tushnabad, Shri Anand Amrit Raj, Ex-Up Adhyaksh, Zilla Parishad and other senior officers of the Directorate of Industries and KVIB. Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana

India is the land of farmers where the maximum proportion of rural population depends on agriculture. Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi unveiled the new scheme Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY) on 13th January, 2016. This scheme will help in decreasing the burden of premiums on farmers who take loans for their cultivation and will also safeguard them against the inclement weather.

It has also been decided to make the settlement process of the insurance claim, fast and easy so that the farmers do not face any trouble regarding the crop insurance plan. This scheme will be implemented in every state of India, in association with respective State Governments. The scheme will be administered under the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Government of India.

Highlight of the scheme

There will be a uniform premium of only 2% to be paid by farmers for all Kharif crops and 1.5% for all Rabi crops. In case of annual commercial and horticultural crops, the premium to be paid will be only 5%.

The premium rates to be paid by farmers are very low and balance premium will be paid by the Government to provide full insured amount to the farmers against crop loss in any natural calamities.

There is no upper limit on Government subsidy. Even

if balance premium is 90%, it will be borne by the Government.

Earlier, there was a provision of capping the premium rate which is low claims being paid to farmers. Now this is removed and farmers will get claim against full sum insured without any reduction.

The use of technology will be encouraged to a great extent. Smart phones, Remote sensing drone and GPS technologies will be used to capture and upload data of crop cutting to reduce the delays in the claim



payment.

Allocation of the scheme presented in budget 2016-2017 is Rs.5, 550 cores.

The insurance plan will be handled under a single insurance company, Agriculture Insurance Company of India (AIC).

PMFBY is a replacement scheme of National Agriculture Insurance Scheme (NAIS) and Modified National Agriculture Insurance Scheme (MNAIS) and hence exempted from the service tax.

India to play five ODIs, one T20I in West Indies in June-July

New Delhi, May 17

India are scheduled to play five ODIs and one T20I against the West Indies in June-July, a BCCI media release confirmed on Tuesday (May 16). The tour to the Caribbean will come just days after the Champions Trophy in England.

The five-match ODI series is slated to begin on June 23, with the first two games to be played at the Queen's Park Oval in Port of Spain. While the third and fourth ODI will be played at the Sir Vivian Richards Stadium in Antigua, the final ODI and the solitary T20I will be played at the Sabina Park in Kingston, Jamaica. This assignment will immediately follow the Champions Trophy which takes place from June 1 - June 18. India had similarly toured the Caribbean even in 2013, after a successful Champions Trophy campaign in England. At that time, after a similar five-day break, India went on to win the tri-series which involved Sri Lanka as well.

While India will hope to defend their crown in the upcoming eight-nation tournament, West Indies won't even be involved,

having failed to qualify on the basis of their ODI ranking. In fact, this ODI tour has massive bearing for the hosts in their pursuit of direct qualification for the 2019 ODI World Cup.

West Indies are currently ninth in the ICC ODI rankings, nine rating points behind Pakistan.

Japanese tennis player Mitsuhashi gets life ban for match-fixing

Hong Kong, May 17

Japanese player Junn Mitsuhashi has been banned for life following an investigation into match-fixing. The Tennis Integrity Unit announced today that he has also been fined 50,000 US Dollars after being found to have made corrupt approaches to other players and to have placed bets on matches. The ban applies with immediate affect and means Mitsuhashi, 27, cannot compete in, or attend, any

tournament or event organised or sanctioned by the governing bodies of the sport. In November 2015 he asked Joshua Chetty, a player he had previously coached, to make a corrupt approach to a fellow player during an ITF Futures tournament in Stellenbosch, South Africa. The player was offered 2,000 US Dollars to under perform in a singles match and 600 US Dollars in a doubles match. Chetty received a lifetime ban last September.

Cabinet approves amendment of Public Premises Act

New Delhi, May 17

The Cabinet has approved amendment to the Public Premises (Eviction of Unauthorized Occupants) Act, 1971 to facilitate smooth and speedy eviction of unauthorised occupants from government accommo-

modation. The amendment will enable the Estate officer to apply summary proceedings for evicting unauthorised occupants from residential accommodations allotted for a period the person holds office. Non-eviction of such residences leads to

unavailability of houses to new incumbents. Under the existing provisions of the Act, the eviction proceedings take unusually long time, thereby reducing the availability of government accommodations to new incumbents.
