PM calls upon tax administration to be soft in their approach and not treat everybody as tax evaders

New Delhi, Jun 17 Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has called upon Tax Administrators to be soft in their approach and not treat everybody as tax evaders. Shri Modi stressed that while there should be respect for the rule of law among all citizens, people should not fear tax administrators. He said, the foundation of administration should be on five pillars of Revenue Accountability, Probity, Information and Digitisation (RAPID). The Prime Minister was addressing the inaugural

session of the two-day annual conference of tax administrators in New Delhi yesterday. Shri Modi set a target for the taxmen to double the taxpayer base to 10 crore. He also said, the long arm of the law will catch up with those evading taxes. At the conference titled 'Rajyasva Gyan Sangam' (Knowledge Conference on Revenue), Shri Modi asked the officials to move towards digitisation to make tax administration efficient and work towards bridging the trust deficit. Govt gives top priority to fill vacancies of judges in all courts: Minister

Salem, June 17 Union Law Minister Shri Sadananda Gowda has said that the Centre is giving top priority to filling up of existing vacancies of judges in all the courts in the country. Talking to news reporters in Salem, Tamil Nadu, the Minister said there was a lull in the filling up of the vacancies in the higher judiciary for the last eight months, following the Supreme Court striking down the National Judicial Appointments Commission Act. But now

the Government has received sanction for filling the vacancies to the higher judiciary. On pendency of cases, Shri Gowda said, there were three crore cases pending in various courts, including 38 lakh in High Courts and 40,000 in the Supreme Court. He added that in order to clear the pending cases, the Ministry has evolved alternate dispute resolution mechanisms like Lok Adalats. Shri Gowda also hoped that around 1800 obsolete acts would

NASA captures pictures of Mount Sharp

New York, Jun 17 Using a 7-foot long camera called the Mars Hand Lens Imager, the NASA Curiosity rover team took the pictures on the foothills of Mount Sharp last month, a 3.4-mile high area near a site called Okuruso. Curiosity spends most of its time drilling rocks and processing samples in the Mount Sharp area, and two of these holes can be seen in the photos. This research helped researchers understand the history of fluids on Mars at rock formations called Stimson and Murray. This research has provided surprising insights into the Red Planet.

In men's singles, Kidambi Srikanth who had reached the semifinals at Sydney, also improved two places to reach World No. 11 with 52,086 points. P V Sindhu was static at World No. 10, while Ajay Jayaram who skipped the Australian Open to focus on training, slipped three places to be at the



24th spot. H S Prannoy, who is recovering from an injury, also lost four places

to be at the 28th spot. In men's doubles, Rio-bound Manu Attri and B Sumeeth Reddy slipped a place to be at the World No. 21st spot, while women's doubles pair of Jwala Gutta and Ashwini Ponnappa also dropped down to World No. 16.

Pre-Monsoon rain lashes many parts of North India

New Delhi, Jun 17
Delayed by a week, the monsoon is raining down heavily in vast areas of Kerala, Tamil Nadu and Andhra Pradesh. Apart from these southern states, it has covered the entire North-East as well. The progress of the South-West monsoon has slowed down the past few days. Conditions have not been conducive for its inland movement and it is stuck at Karnataka's Karwar and Gadag as well as Andhra's Angol. The met department has said that conditions have taken a turn for the better for Maharashtra and Central India. The monsoon is likely to cross these areas in the next 3-4 days. It will become completely active in Goa and South India during this period. The next 2 to 3 days will see it covering Central Arabian Sea, Konkan-Goa, South



Chattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh and Marathwada. The met department has said that delay in advance is unlikely to have any effect on the overall impact of the monsoon. Pre-monsoon rains have already been lashing most parts of Goa, Maharashtra and Karnataka. In several parts of Punjab & Haryana, pre-monsoon rains have been accompanied by drops in day and night temperatures. It rained on Wednesday night in Chandigarh with clear skies after sunrise. Ambala, Karnal, Panchkula, Hisar, Yamunanagar and Kurukshetra saw rains in Haryana. Among the hill states, pre-monsoon rains have been drenching Himachal Pradesh. There were heavy showers in Shimla and Mandi and several others parts have also been soaked since Tuesday night. Several districts of Uttar Pradesh have also seen drop in temperatures followed by rains.

Kazakhstan champion Ilyin among 10 new doping failures

London, Jun 17
Weightlifting's governing body today banned Kazakhstan's double Olympic champion Ilya Ilyin and three other gold medalists for failing dope tests at the 2012 London Olympics. In all, ten lifters were banned after dozens of London samples were retested. Kazakhstan's biggest

Olympic hero, Ilyin took 94kg gold in Beijing and London and was to go for a third straight title in Rio de Janeiro in August. He tested positive for anabolic steroids. Three other Kazakh gold medalists from London -- Zulfiya Chinslanlo (53 kg), Maiya Maneza (63 kg) and Svetlana Podobedova (73 kg) -- also failed tests and were banned, the IWF said. Others include Azerbaijan's 58kg world champion Boyanka Kostova and Russia's London 85kg silver medal winner Apti Aukhadov. The IOC is retesting samples to catch cheats who might be competing at the Rio de Janeiro Olympics in August.
