## Voting concludes to elect 14<sup>th</sup> President of India; counting on July 20

New Delhi, July 17  
Voting was held today to elect the 14th President of India as Members of Parliament and Legislative Assemblies exercised their franchise at designated centers at Parliament House and State Assemblies complex. Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi and BJP President Shri Amit Shah who is also a legislator from Gujarat cast their votes. Congress President Smt Sonia Gandhi, Vice President Shri Rahul Gandhi, former PM Dr. Manmohan Singh and BSP Chief Ms Mayawati were among those prominent leaders who cast their votes at Parliament House. Former Bihar Governor Shri Ram Nath Kovind and former Lok Sabha Speaker Smt Meira Kumar are in the direct fight in the polls in the race to the Raisina Hills. The voting concluded at 5pm. Paper ballots were used in this election. The results will be declared on Thursday.

## Training programme on GST Print and electronic media persons enlightened about GST

Port Blair, July 17  
A training programme on GST was organized for all the print and electronic media persons in the conference hall of the IP&T here this evening. The Jt. Commissioner, UTGST, Shri Kalyan Gosh from Central Board of Excise & Customs (CBEC) enlightened the scribes in detail about GST. He stated that after long deliberations, GST with the buzz word 'One Nation One Tax' has been implemented throughout the country which has eliminated many of the taxes. He said GST has brought uniformity in tax, easy inter-state goods movement by road, transparency in



transactions, online registration and transactions only through banks enabling different authorities to monitor each and every transaction. Turning to Islands, the Joint commissioner said, there will be no GST on rice, cereals, pulses, vegetables. He said consumers of A&N Islands have to pay only MRP printed on goods/items and the MRP rates cannot be violated. He said, furniture made of pure wood will attract 12 percent GST and consumers need not pay more than 12 percent on wooden furniture. He informed the scribes that the A&N Administration has taken up with the Central Govt. the issue of freight charges. He said that outreach programmes are being organized in different Islands to create awareness about GST, its merit, dispel doubts of the people and

**Roger Federer lifts a record 8th Wimbledon title beating Marin Cilic in Men's singles**

Wimbledon, Jul 17  
Roger Federer won a record eighth Wimbledon title and became the tournament's oldest champion yesterday with a straight-sets victory over Marin Cilic. Federer claimed his 19th Grand Slam title beating Cilic 6-3, 6-1, 6-4. The 36-year old Federer is also Wimbledon's oldest men's winner of the modern era, succeeding Arthur Ashe, who was almost 32 when he won in 1976.



This was Swiss superstar's 11th Wimbledon final and 29th title at the majors. With this victory, Federer also became the first player since Bjorn Borg in 1976 to win Wimbledon without dropping a set in the entire tournament.

**I H Manudev wins 1st National Masters snooker tournament title**

Chennai, Jul 17  
I H Manudev has won the first National Masters snooker tournament title in Chennai. Alok Kumar, a former national men's champion, had been in fine form coming into the summit clash, but found Karnataka's Manudev a tough proposition. Manudev, capitalised on the chances he got and kept scoring heavily and won the game by four impressive frames. He dominated the first two frames and seized control. In the third frame, Manudev stole Kumar's frame with an extraordinary



clearance with one red on the table to lead by 3-0 which made all the difference in the match. Kumar went all guns blazing in the fourth frame and clinched it with impressive potting. Manudev however kept his cool and capitalised on Kumar's mistakes to seal the match in fifth frame. Manudev beat Alok Kumar 68-42, 60-22, 65-59, 17-66, 63-33.

"The All-India Senior Selection Committee on Monday named Shikhar Dhawan as the replacement for injured Murali Vijay in the Test team, which is scheduled to travel to Sri Lanka for a three-match Test series," the BCCI Secretary Amitabh Chaudhary said in a release. "Vijay, who had suffered a wrist injury during Australia's tour of India, has complained of pain in his right wrist, while playing a preparatory match. The BCCI medical team has therefore advised that Vijay should continue his rehabilitation program," he added. Dhawan, who is a regular in the Indian ODI side, has played 23 Tests and averages 38.52. He has four hundreds to his credit in an accumulated 1464 runs. He last played a Test for India in

in their respective schools in which they have worked during the last academic session 2016-17, subject to satisfactory performance of each Part time workers during the last academic session. Their salary will be released subject to renewal of temporary Plan Posts from the Administration. For re-engagement of Part time PPT & PPA, the eligibility criteria should be strictly adhered to and it should also be ensured that the Pre-Primary Section of the respective school should have the strength of at least 05 students in the class, failing which, PPT & PPA should not be re-engaged. Those PPT & PPA, who do not join for any reasons what so ever, in such cases, the SMC of the respective school, are empowered to recommend for appointment of PPT and PPA/SK, they may select and recommend names of fresh candidates for PPT or PPA/SK, after ensuring eligibility criteria and after observing necessary procedures in terms of the guidelines issued by this Directorate of Education, Port Blair. Such proposals must be submitted to this Directorate of Education by 31st July, 2017.

All the Zonal Officers/DDOs/Head of Institutions have been directed to re-engage the Part time PPT, PPA and Part time Craft Instructors to their respective schools with immediate effect, subject to their performance and send their joining report to the Directorate of Education, Port Blair before 31st July, 2017 without fail. All the DDOs are required to furnish the performance report in respect of each Part time worker for the session 2016-17 under their control for issue of formal engagement orders. Formal engagement orders will be issued only after receipt of duty report and individual performance reports from all the DDOs, a communication said.
