Centre to focus on rotation, review of Govt officers for probity

New Delhi, Sept 17

The Centre in order to ensure probity among Government Staff has decided to carry out rotation in respect of sensitive to non-sensitive posts and review and screening of officers of doubtful integrity under the Fundamental Rules 56(J). The departments have been asked to invoke Fundamental Rules 56 (J) that empowers the Government to compulsorily retire an employee after they

put in 30 years of service, if they are suspected to be corrupt or ineffective. In an order issued by the Department of Personnel and Training, all Ministries and Departments have been asked to complete this activity in time bound manner. The appropriate authority has the absolute right to retire the Government servant, if it is necessary to do so in public interest, under the FR 56(J) of CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972.

Malaria deaths worldwide have fallen by 60 per cent: UN

UN, Sept 17

United Nations said today that malaria deaths worldwide have fallen by 60 per cent since 2000. It attributed the dip to improved diagnostic tests and massive distribution of mosquito nets aiding dramatic progress against the disease. Fifteen years ago, an estimated 262 million malaria cases killed nearly eight lakh 40 thousand people. According to a joint report by World Health Organization (WHO) and United Nations children's agency, UNICEF, projections for 2015 indicate that some 214 million cases are likely to cause four lakh 38 thousand deaths.

The Panchayat & Municipal Elections in the Islands will be held on Sept. 20, 2015. Accordingly, all activities related to canvassing are permitted up to 4 pm of 18th September 2015, only i.e. 48 hours before the closing of the poll. In a press release received here today, the Additional District Magistrate, South Andaman has clarified that if any contesting candidate violates this order, he/she shall be prosecuted under the relevant rule and if convicted, his/her candidature shall be cancelled.

Electrical installation works to be carried out by licensed contractor: SE

Port Blair, Sept. 17

The Electricity Department has asked the consumers to ensure that all electrical installation works are carried out by a licensed electrical contractor. The advisory has been issued as the extension / alteration of electric supply is frequently done without observing proper safety precaution and also by unlicensed contractor.

In a press release received here today, the Superintending

Engineer, Electricity Department has stated that as per the general condition relating to supply and use of electricity, it is necessary that the wiring in the consumer premises should conform to the Indian Electricity Rules 1956. The materials used for wiring shall conform to the relevant specification of the Bureau of Indian Standards or its equivalent.

All electric lines, equipments and apparatus should be of sufficient rating for power,

insulation and estimated fault current and sufficient mechanical strength for the duty which they are required to perform and shall be constructed, installed protected worked and maintained in such a manner as to ensure safety of human beings, animal and property. All electrical installation works should be carried out by a licensed electrical contractor as required under Rule 45 of the Indian Electricity Rules, 1956.

Chanderpaul receives Icon Award

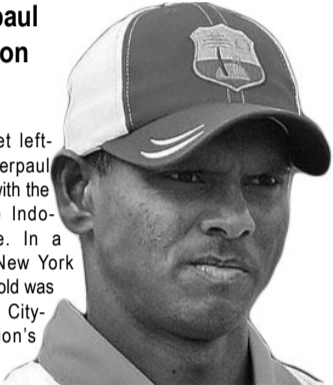
Guyana., Sept 17

Centre comes out with details of twin gold schemes

New Delhi, Sep 17
The Centre has come out with details of the twin gold schemes aimed at reducing the demand for physical gold and said that interest rate on the schemes would be decided in consultation with the RBI. The twin schemes Gold Monetisation Scheme (GMS) and Gold Bond Scheme was approved by the Cabinet last week. The schemes will come into effect after notification by the Finance Ministry. The GMS provides an option to people to monetise physical gold by depositing them with authorised banks and earning interests from such deposits. In an office memorandum, the Finance Ministry said there are a total 331 recognised Assaying and Hallmarking Centres wherein the purity of physical gold will be verified. The interest rate on these two schemes will be decided by the Government upon consultation with the RBI. Through the GMS, gold in any form can be deposited with banks for a

period of one to 15 years. Banks will be allowed to sell the gold, deposited with them, to jewellers to boost domestic supply and cut reliance on imports under the GMS.

No electrical installation work, including additions, alteration, repairs and adjustment to existing installations, except such replacement of lamps, fans, fuses, switches, low voltage domestic appliance and fittings as in no way alters its capacity or character, shall be carried out upon the premises of or on behalf of any consumer, for the purpose of supply to such consumer except by an electrical contractor licensed in this behalf and under the direct supervision of a person holding as certificate of competency. Such unauthorized use of electricity may also result in disconnection of supply after due notice. Accordingly, the consumers have been advised to strictly adhere to the safety Regulations and precautions while handling the electrical appliances to avoid any mishap / loss of life. This advisory is also for the awareness of all the conveners of various public meeting, puja pandals, marriage halls etc, the release added.
