Fisheries; and hydropower and renewable energy projects through the Ministry of Power.

Emphasising infrastructure development, he said that road construction in the Islands would be undertaken in accordance with high standards. He said that the Islands could also aspire to have world-class infrastructure and facilities comparable to those seen in countries such as Thailand and Singapore.

The Hon'ble Lt. Governor called upon officers, employees and citizens to work together as one team. He said that there should be no barriers based on caste, region or community and that service to the nation should be the common guiding principle for everyone.

Paying tribute to the freedom fighters who endured extremely difficult conditions in the Cellular Jail, the Hon'ble Lt. Governor described the Andaman and Nicobar Islands as the sacred land and pilgrimage site of the martyrs. He expressed his respect for all places of worship and reiterated the collective goal of building "Shreshtha Andaman" as part of "Shreshtha Bharat."

Concluding his address, the Hon'ble Lt. Governor extended greetings on the occasion of Vishwakarma Jayanti and the birthday of the Hon'ble Prime Minister. He reiterated his commitment towards development, cleanliness, transparency and collective progress in the Islands.

Earlier, the Hon'ble Lt. Governor administered the Swachhata Pledge to those present and reaffirmed the collective commitment towards building a clean and healthy Andaman and Nicobar Islands. Giving a green touch to the programme, he planted a fruit-bearing sapling in the school premises. The Hon'ble Member of Parliament and other dignitaries also participated in the tree plantation drive.

As part of the awareness campaign, the Hon'ble Lt. Governor flagged



off a visit by students to solid waste processing centres. The initiative aims to provide students with first-hand exposure to scientific waste-management processes and motivate them to become ambassadors of cleanliness.

Thereafter, the Hon'ble Lt. Governor, along with the Hon'ble Member of Parliament and other dignitaries, actively participated in the Swachhata Shramdaan, leading the cleanliness campaign and setting an example of collective action for a clean and green Islands.

In his address, the Hon'ble Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray, recalled the launch of the Swachhata Abhiyan by the Hon'ble Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, and said that single-use plastic carry bags were once widely used across the Islands. He said that plastic bags were commonly used while purchasing fish, vegetables and other essential items and were often discarded along roadsides and into drains.

He stated that sustained efforts under the Swachhata Abhiyan and active public participation have brought about a significant change in cleanliness-related behaviour in the Islands, resulting in a considerable reduction in the use of plastic carry bags.

The key focus areas of the campaign include the transformation of cleanliness target units and public places with high footfall, increasing youth participation in cleanliness activities, promoting a circular economy and encouraging "Swachhata Se Samridhhi" through the Waste-to-Wealth initiative.

The campaign launched today will continue until October 17. The Vishwakarma Jayanti programmes were also organised at Lok Niwas and Chatham Saw Mill, where the celebrations were attended by officials, employees and other participants.

Mega Voluntary Blood Donation drive inaugurated at R.K. Mission

A Mega Voluntary Blood Donation Drive, themed "One Drop of Humanity. Give Blood. Save Lives." was inaugurated at Ramakrishna Mission (R.K. Mission), Sri Vijaya Puram today. The inauguration was held in the presence of Shri Bishnu Pada Ray, Hon'ble Member of Parliament; Smti. Vasantha, Chairperson, SVPMC; Shri Raghunath Kulkarni, BJP National Prabhari of

A&N Islands; and Shri Anil Tiwari, State President, BJP. The drive will continue till 2nd October, 2026, with several voluntary blood donation camps scheduled to be organised during the period. Altogether, 57 units of blood were donated by the voluntary donors.

The programme is being organized in association with the Andaman & Nicobar AIDS Control Society (ANACS), with technical support from the



Blood Centre, G. B. Pant Hospital, ANIIMS, Sri Vijaya Puram, with the objective of promoting voluntary blood donation and creating awareness about the importance of maintaining an adequate and safe blood supply.

The Blood Donation camp was facilitated by Dr. Malvika Mahato, Medical Officer and Officer In-Charge, Blood Bank, Sri Vijaya Puram. The donors were examined for their eligibility to donate blood

and briefed the donors on various aspect and importance of blood donation.

The technical team ensures that the donated blood units are appropriately processed and screened for transfusion-transmissible infections, in accordance with established blood safety protocols. Donor eligibility and safety were also assessed as part of the donation process, a press release from ANACS said.

Directorate of Industries in collaboration with DPIIT & GIZ hosts Multi-Stakeholder Workshop for formulation of Sri Vijaya Puram City Logistics Plan

Sri Vijaya Puram, Sept. 17

The Directorate of Industries, in collaboration with DPIIT and GIZ, successfully organized a one day Kick Off & Stakeholder Orientation Workshop for the preparation of the City Logistics Plan (CLP) for Sri Vijaya Puram, bringing together representatives from various Government Departments, agencies and stakeholders to deliberate on the city's logistics challenges and opportunities.

The workshop commenced with opening remarks by Ms. Ambika Ratnoo, Director of Industries; Shri Yashasvi Mund, Director, Logistics Division, DPIIT; Shri Raghu Babu, Programme Director, GIZ, and Ms. Sunitha Kumari, Deputy Director (Industries) followed by an introduction to the City Logistics Plan, its alignment with the National Logistics Policy and its potential benefits for the islands.

During the interactive discussions, participants highlighted key logistics challenges, including increasing traffic congestion caused by the concentration of cargo, passenger and tourist movement within the city, absence of dedicated freight corridors and logistics hubs, inadequate warehousing facilities outside urban areas, limited air and maritime connectivity, high freight costs, delays in the movement of essential commodities, e-commerce delivery challenges, and constraints in inter-island transportation. Stakeholders also emphasized the need for streamlined truck movement, improved public transport, dedicated loading and unloading zones, better utilization of airport and port infrastructure, strengthened



mainland and inter-island connectivity, and development of logistics infrastructure outside city limits to reduce congestion.

Officials from Departments including Transport, Police, Tourism, Revenue, Fisheries, Civil Supplies, Disaster Management, Health, Labour, APWD and Port Management Board shared valuable insights on sector-specific challenges and their expectations from the City Logistics Plan. The dignitaries expressed their concerns relating to road congestion, rising tourism demand, supply chain reliability, reverse logistics, delays in the supply of essential commodities, high transportation costs etc.

A key outcome of the workshop was the Data Mapping and Action Planning Exercise, where participating departments identified critical datasets required for preparation of the CLP. These included information on land use, transportation networks, ports, warehouses, industrial estates, vehicle registrations, passenger flows, fisheries, health infrastructure, disaster management facilities, supply chain assets, and other socio-economic indicators.

The exercise helped establish a clear Data Ownership Matrix and strengthened inter-departmental coordination for the next stages of the planning process.

The workshop concluded with an open discussion on feedback, queries, and next steps for preparation of the City Logistics Plan.

The Directorate of Industries, Sri Vijaya Puram, was appreciated for successfully bringing together diverse stakeholders on a common platform and facilitating meaningful discussions on the future of logistics in the islands. The workshop laid a solid foundation for the development of a comprehensive City Logistics Plan aimed at improving connectivity, enhancing supply chain efficiency, reducing logistics costs, easing congestion, and supporting sustainable economic growth across the Andaman & Nicobar Islands.

The participating Departments reaffirmed their commitment to support the City Logistics Plan process and contribute towards building a more efficient, resilient, and future-ready logistics ecosystem for the islands, a press release from Directorate of Industries said.

Awareness training on pig farming conducted at Harminder Bay

The Department of Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Services (AH&VS) organised an Awareness Training on Pig Farming under the National Livestock Mission in the form of a Pig Farmers' Field School (FFS) at the Piggery Unit of Shri Erick Nathaniel, Harminder Bay.

A total of 25 participants, most of whom keep pigs as an important livestock of the household, enthusiastically attended the programme. Shri Joseph, 2nd Captain, graced the occasion as chief guest and requested the participants to give patient hearing and attention to the training. Shri Festus, Ex-Secretary, Tribal Council, attended as guest of honour and urged the tribal farmers to adopt scientific pig



farming techniques with proper hygiene to obtain maximum production benefit.

During the programme, the participants were imparted general know-how on pig farming by introducing scientific methods of rearing for improved pork production, with reference to popularising value-added products such as bacon, ham and sausage for higher returns. Inputs including plastic gumla and refreshments were distributed to the participants.

During the interactive session, the farmers put forth demands for piglets, goat kids, ducks and poultry birds and registered their names accordingly. The Department of AH&VS remains committed to organising Farmers' Field Schools and capacity-building programmes under NLM to promote scientific pig farming among tribal and rural communities in the Islands, a press release from Deptt. of AH&VS said.

Infertility camps conducted at multiple locations across South Andaman

Sri Vijaya Puram, Sept. 17

The Department of Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Services (AH&VS) conducted a series of Infertility Camps at various locations in South Andaman during the second week of September 2026 as part of its ongoing efforts to improve the reproductive health of bovines.

On 12th September 2026, an Infertility Camp was organised at Gandhi Nagar and Shastri Nagar. During the camp, 15 animals were dewormed and 15 animals were provided with mineral mixture supplement. Injection Tonophosphan was administered to one cow. Three cows were found pregnant on examination and conventional Artificial Insemination was performed on one cow. The livestock owners were also advised on proper nutritional management of cattle.

On the same day, another Infertility Camp was conducted at Sippighat village under Gram Panchayat Sippighat by the Senior Veterinary Officer, Veterinary Hospital Garacharma and team, along with Dr. Perumal, Senior Scientist, CIARI. A total of 22 animals were



examined, of which 16 were found pregnant, one was pregnancy-doubtful, four were non-pregnant and one heifer had not yet come into heat. Deworming was carried out on 19 cattle, one bull was castrated, and new tagging and tag replacement were done in four cattle.

On 14th September 2026, an Infertility Camp was conducted at Loha Barik and adjoining areas of Manglutan, Guptapara and Maymyo under Veterinary Dispensary, Manglutan. Out of 41 breedable animals available, 11 animals were screened for infertility and reproductive disorders. Three cases of reproductive problems were identified, including one case of underdeveloped genitalia

associated with undernutrition and one case of postpartum anoestrus. Six animals were provided mineral mixture and deworming, along with necessary treatment and supportive therapy including Cyclomin-Seven bolus, multivitamin injection and Ivermectin injection. Follow-up of previously treated infertility cases was also undertaken, and farmers were advised on balanced nutrition, mineral supplementation, proper heat detection and timely Artificial Insemination. An Infertility Camp was also conducted at Dam Basti as part of the same series of camps, a press release from Deptt. of AH&VS said.
