1,99,110 Digital Health Cards generated constituting 52.32 % population making A&N Islands in lead

Port Blair, Jan. 17

The A&N Islands has recorded around 1,99,110 people in creation of Digital Health Identity Cards under the Govt.'s National Digital Health Mission, as on date. This constitutes 52.32 % islander population coverage, making A&N Islands lead the way in creation of Health ID cards among the 6 UTs of the country, as per the National Digital Health Mission (NDHM) Health ID dashboard status.

It may be recalled that the National Digital Health

Mission (NDHM) was launched on 15th August, 2020 across six Union Territories including A&N Islands on a pilot basis. The National Health Authority, New Delhi is the Nodal Agency for implementation of NDHM. Health ID creation of all the citizens is one of the key building blocks under NDHM. Health ID under NDHM is free of cost, voluntary and consent based, that can be created using Aadhaar or mobile number along with basic information. The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, GoI has formulated the National Digital Health

Mission (NDHM) with the aim to provide the necessary support for integration of digital health infrastructure in the country. Creation of Health ID will enable people to keep a track of their health data and share it only with verified doctors or health providers when needed after an informed consent. The Health ID is designed with highest standards of security and privacy and will enable inclusive access to all health services. The Islanders can create their Health ID online by visiting the site <https://healthid.ndhm.gov.in/>.

The Health ID can be created using Aadhaar number option or Mobile number to receive their OTP and filling up basic information which includes name, sex, date of birth and mobile number. The State Health Agency is the implementing agency for NDHM in these Islands. For any technical help, general public may contact State Health Agency over phone number 03192-231993.

Citizen centric initiative by District Administration Online payment of Stamp Duty & printing of e-Stamp Certificate garners popularity among people

686 certificates amounting to Rs.39426/- generated through online system

Port Blair, Jan. 17

The online payment of Stamp Duty & printing of e-Stamp Certificate launched by the A&N Administration in collaboration with Stock Holding Corporation of India Limited on 17th Dec. 2020 is becoming very popular among the general public as the system allows to buy e-stamps upto a maximum of Rs.1000/- from their comfortable place as per their convenient time. The basic requirements for online e-stamping are any handheld device with internet connection and printer. Citizen may visit the website www.shcilestamp.com and login as guest or proceed to register.



The client is required to make a one-time registration with basic details. An URL will be sent to the registered mail id for activation which has to be activated by the user. This user credentials can be used across all online products of e-Stamping (non-judicial) and e-Court fee (judicial). The same user credentials are valid for all States/UT wherever online facility is available. In case of guest login, OTP will be sent to the mobile number for further verification.

After the registration, client will have to enter all the details of the transaction such as the name and address of the parties, Consideration and Stamp duty amount etc. On submission of

these details a Transaction Reference No. will be generated. Against this reference no., the user has to make online payment through Net Banking or VISA Debit Card via Payment Gateway Services.

Once the payment is completed and successful, client is required to print the e-Stamp Certificate in A4 size plain paper. Since its launch, around 686 certificates for an amount of Rs.39426/- has been generated through the online system.

This citizen centric initiative has simplified the procedure and streamlined the entire process. The District Administration urges the public to use this facility for their needs and in case of any issues in this regard may approach the DC, South Andaman Office for clarifications, a press release Deputy Commissioner (SA) said.

Australia finished day three on 21 without loss in their second innings against India in the fourth and final Test at Gabba in Brisbane today. Australian openers Marcus Harris and David Warner

survived six overs the hosts ended the day with a lead of 54 runs with all 10 second innings wickets intact.

Earlier, India were bowled out for 336 in the first innings, only 33 runs behind Australia's first innings total of 369.

Debutant Washington Sundar and Shardul Thakur



scored fifties on the third day. The duo added 123 runs to bring India back in the game. For India, Shardul Thakur was the top scorer with 67 runs while Washington Sundar scored valuable 50 runs. They gave the visitors a fighting chance of securing the draw India need in the fourth Test against Australia to retain the Border-Gavaskar Trophy. For Australia, Josh Hazlewood scalped five wickets. Pat Cummins and Mitchell Starc picked two wickets each while off-spinner Nathan Lyon, playing his 100th Test, scalped one.
