GST Council clears e-way bill mechanism; to be rolled out by June

New Delhi, Dec 17
In a bid to plug gaps, the GST Council has decided to implement the e-way bill mechanism throughout the country by June 1st after reviewing the readiness of the IT network. Under the Goods and Services Tax (GST) regime, the waybill is replaced by an e-way bill which aims at mitigating the problems caused by



waybill compliance. E-way bill is an electronic way bill for movement of goods

which can be generated on the GSTN portal.

Work to integrate Brahmos missile on 40 Sukhoi aircraft begins

New Delhi, Dec 17
The work has begun to integrate the Brahmos supersonic cruise missile on 40 Sukhoi combat aircraft. Official sources said, the fleet of 40 Sukhoi jets will undergo structural modifications at the state-run aerospace major Hindustan Aeronautics Limited for integration of the missile on them. The project is likely to be completed by 2020 and is expected to fulfill the critical needs of the Indian Air Force.

The air-launched variant of the Brahmos, the world's fastest supersonic cruise missile, was successfully test fired from a Sukhoi-30 combat jet last month, marking a major milestone to enhance the precision strike capability of the Air Force.

Brahmos is the heaviest weapon to be deployed on the Sukhoi-30. The missile is a joint venture between the Defence Research and Development Organization and NPO Mashinostroyeniya of Russia.

Implementation of 'Smart City Project' by PBMC Replacement work of street tube lights with LED lights complete in all 24 wards

Port Blair, Dec.17
The Port Blair Municipal Council has totally switched over to LED Lights from the existing tube lights and SV lamp street lights. The replacement work of street tube lights with LED lights have been completed in all the 24 wards. This work was carried under the Smart City Project which has not only become an added attraction but has also brightened the entire city area. Altogether, 13,900 street tube lights and SV lamp street lights have been replaced with LED lights, informed the PBMC Chairperson, Shri Indra Pal Singh while speaking to 'The Daily Telegrams' here today. The Chairperson further



informed that the Council has a contract with the agency EESL which has undertaken the task of replacement. The agency will take care of the maintenance of the Street Lights for seven years. No repairing work will be carried of the LED lights

and the agency will completely replace the street light if it is not working as per the contract, the Chairperson said, adding that Gandhi Park and Mohanpura Market will also be developed under the 'Smart City Project'. There is also a proposal to install a desalination plant of 14MLD capacity in

The objective of the Stand Up India Scheme is to facilitate Bank loans between 10 lakhs to 1 crore to at least one Scheduled Caste (SC) or Scheduled Tribe (ST) borrower and at least one woman borrower per bank branch for setting up enterprises in manufacturing, services or trading sector.

To be eligible, the applicant must be SC/ST and/or woman entrepreneurs above 18 years of age. Loan under the scheme are available for manufacturing or services or training sectors. It will be composite loan (inclusive of term loan and working capital) between 10 lakhs and upto 100 lakhs.

Sports Minister announces partnership with Japanese university



New Delhi, Dec 17 Sports Minister Col Rajyavardhan Singh Rathore in New Delhi announced a sports tie-up between Lakshmi Bai University of Physical Education and a Japanese university. "Talks with Japan about the growth of sports in India is on. Lakshmi Bai University of Physical Education is now partnering with a university in Japan to promote sports," Col Rathore said at the commemorative ceremony of the Japan-India sports exchange programme. Referring to the judo demonstration showcased by Japanese Olympic medallists

Masashi Nishiyama and Misato Nakamura, Col Rathore expressed his appreciation for the sport and encouraged the young school children, specially girls present at the event, to take it up. "We saw that Misato Nakamura, who was smaller in size than Masashi Nishiyama, was easily able to fling him. That is the speciality of judo. In judo even those smaller in size or slightly weaker can defeat opponents weighing more than them. Because in this game a player can use the power of his/ her opponent in their own favour," the Minister said.

The Japanese Ambassador to India Kenji Hiramatsu also praised the several programmes conducted by the two countries this year ahead of the 2020 Tokyo Olympics. "I hope both the India and Japan will continue to have such exchange programmes in future even after the Olympics." Masashi Nishiyama, who won a bronze medal at the 2012 London Olympics, said judo is a good discipline for self defence. "Judo is a wonderful way to defend yourself and all the ladies should learn it, good thing that the Indian government is promoting it," said Nishiyama.

PV Sindhu settles for silver at BWF World Superseries Finals

Dubai, Dec 17 Ace Indian shuttler PV Sindhu missed out on a chance to create history as she went down fighting against Akane Yamaguchi of Japan in the pulsating summit dash of the season-ending BWF World Superseries Finals in Dubai on Sunday. Had Sindhu won, she would have become the first India player to win World Superseries Finals title. Yamaguchi exacted sweet revenge of her defeat to Sindhu in group match as she bounced back from a game down to register an exhausting 15-21, 21-12, 21-19 win over the Indian in a match that lasted 94 minutes. On Saturday, Sindhu beat China's Chen Yufei in the semi-finals to emulate Saina Nehwal, who had reached the final in 2011 and mixed doubles pair of Jwala Gutta and V Diju, who had ended runners-up in 2009. Sindhu opened the first game with 2-0 lead before conceding five straight points to



trail 2-5. Sindhu won a 33 shots rally to make it 8-8 and then Yamaguchi made an unforced error after another long rally of 31 shots to hand her opponent an advantage. The Indian shuttler continued to have upper hand to go into the break with 11-8 lead. rom trailing 5-8, Sindhu earned eight successive points to lead the first game 13-8. Yamaguchi turned the table and reduced the gap to one point but Sindhu kept her nerve

and held on to her advantage to seal the first game 21-15 in 23 minutes. Sindhu surged ahead with 5-0 lead in the second game but Yamaguchi found her rhythm to level the terms and went into break with valuable 11-9 advantage. Sindhu found the going tough after the break as Yamaguchi continued to stay ahead and drew level by winning the second game 21-12 in 26 minutes and forced the match into the decider.
