PM delivers keynote address at High-Level Segment of ECOSOC Calls for a reformed multilateralism with a reformed United Nations at its center

New Delhi, July 17 (PIB)

Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi delivered a keynote address virtually at this year's High-Level Segment of the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) session today at the United Nations in New York. This was the first address by PM to the broader UN membership since India's overwhelming election as a non-permanent member of the Security Council on 17th June, for the term 2021-22. The theme of the High-Level Segment of the ECOSOC this year is "Multilateralism after COVID-19: What kind of UN do we need at the 75th anniversary".

Coinciding with the 75th Anniversary of the founding



of the UN, this theme also resonates with India's priority for its forthcoming membership of the UN Security Council. Prime Minister reiterated India's call for a 'reformed multilateralism' in a post-COVID-19 world, which reflects the realities of the contemporary world.

In his address, PM recalled India's long association with the ECOSOC and the UN's developmental work, including for the Sustainable Development Goals. He noted that India's developmental motto of 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikaas, Sabka Vishwas' resonates with the core SDG principle of leaving no one behind.

Prime Minister pointed out that India's success in improving the socio-economic indicators of its vast population has a significant impact on global SDG targets. He spoke about India's commitment to also support other developing countries in meeting their SDG targets. He spoke about India's ongoing development efforts, including for improving access to sanitation through the "Swachh Bharat Abhiyan", empowering women, ensuring financial inclusion, and expanding availability of housing and healthcare through flagship schemes such as the "Housing for All" programme and the "Ayushman Bharat"

Ministry of Tourism to create Comprehensive National Database of Accommodation units Owners of un-classified accommodation units of A&N Islands urged to register on portal

Port Blair, July 17

The Ministry of Tourism, Govt. of India has introduced the scheme for creation of Comprehensive National Database of Accommodation units in the country and has issued necessary guidelines under the scheme. Availability of data is crucial for

framing various policies and strategies for promotion and development of tourism. The database would also enable implementation and monitoring of health and safety protocols in the accommodation units in the country. Thus, the Ministry of Tourism, GoI has sought details about

un-classified accommodation units which have not been classified by Ministry, under the categories:- (i) Hotel, (ii) Resorts, (iii) Bed and Breakfast/Home Stays, (iv) Timeshare Units, (v) Apartment Hotel and (vi) Tented Accommodation.

Tourism has requested the owners of the mentioned accommodation units to register their unit directly and update data on the portal <https://hotelcloud.nic.in/HotelDivision/Default.aspx>. The same would be verified on quarterly

Remarkable performance by students of A&N Islands in Class X exam Overall pass percentage stood at 87.85%; Schools securing 100% result increases to 45

Port Blair, July 17

The result of All India Secondary School Examination 2019- 20 (Class X) was announced on 15th July, 2020. In a press release, the Directorate of Education has stated that during the academic session 2019-20, a total of 117 schools (including all managements) have registered with CBSE for conducting Class X examination, 2020.

The release further disclosed that during the first level compilation of results of all the 117 schools, out of 5292 candidates who have appeared in the examination, 4649 candidates have qualified in the examination while 616 candidates have been placed in compartment. The overall pass percentage of Class X this year stood at 87.85%. Further, as compared to previous year, the schools achieving cent percent results have increased from 40 to 45 schools (Administration's School-20, other managements- 25). Schools that secured pass percentage in the range between 90 >100 are 22, out of which 21 are Administration's schools. Similarly, schools that secured pass percentage in the range between 80 > 90 are 15, out of which 14 are Administration's schools.

Three terrorists killed by security forces in J&K

New Delhi, July 17

In the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, three Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) terrorists including a top Pakistani Commander were gunned down by security forces in Nagnad Chimmer area of Damhal Hanji Pora belt in South Kashmir's Kulgam District this morning.

Registered boat owners asked to comply with A&N Islands Marine Regulation, 2003 and Rules Boats to be equipped with life saving, fire fighting appliances & communication devices

Port Blair, July 17

The Directorate of Fisheries has urged the registered boat owners to obey the A&N Islands Marine Regulation, 2003 and Rules framed there under or else stringent action will be initiated as deemed fit against the violators of the rule provisions. Elaborating on the provisions, in a press release, the Department

has stated that the Gill Net, Ring net, Shore seine net/ Drag net of mesh size not below 25 mm (knot to knot diagonally) should not be used for fishing in A&N Waters. The Registered Motorised Mechanical Fishing boats which are operating with Long line, Purse seine net, Ring net, Squid jigger and Pelagic Trawling shall operate only in Zone-B

(Territorial waters from 6 0 NM from the appropriate base line up to 12 NM). These vessels should be fitted with inboard engine/ outboard engine of more than 30 Hp. Similarly, the Motorised Non Mechanical fishing boat (less than 30 Hp of engine) are not allowed to operate Ring net in Zone A (Territorial waters from

appropriate base line up to 6 NM). It has also been clarified that all the registered owners of Motorized Mechanical, Motorized Non Mechanical Fishing Boats and Traditional Crafts shall operate only the permitted fishing gears as specified in their respective Registration

Prime Minister also highlighted India's focus on environmental sustainability and bio-diversity conservation, and recalled India's leading role in the establishment of the International Solar Alliance and the Coalition for Disaster Resilient Infrastructure.

Speaking about India's role in its region as a first responder, Prime Minister recalled the support provided by the Indian Government and Indian pharma companies for ensuring medicine supplies to different countries, and for coordinating a joint response strategy among SAARC countries.

This was the second time that Prime Minister addressed the ECOSOC. He had earlier delivered the keynote address at the 70th anniversary of the ECOSOC in January 2016.
