Chief Secretary inspects various ongoing & upcoming developmental project sites at Diglipur

Directs concerned Departments to expedite pending & current works within stipulated time and cost, overruns are criminal ! Separate Anti Corruption Wing to be set up in N&M Andaman Stresses on fruit trees all along Power Generator efficiency be monitored closely and strict vigil on diesel theft / waste

Diglipur, July 17

The Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Jitendra Narain who is on a three-day visit to Diglipur, N&M Andaman District today inspected various ongoing as well as upcoming developmental projects/ sites.

During the inspection of Kalpong Dam, the Chief Secretary stressed on the need for improving efficiency in power generators. In this regard, the Deputy Commissioner, N&M Andaman, Dr. Angel Bhati Chauhan has been directed to conduct check on all power generator sets in the District and the amount of diesel generated per litre. The Chief Secretary also directed officials to identify prospective locations at Kalpong Dam for creation of picnic spots for tourists.

While inspecting the Eco-Tourism Site at Ram Nagar Beach, the Chief Secretary enquired about additional facilities for visitors and prospects for further beautification of the beach. The Chief Secretary directed Forest Department to come up with more eco-friendly activities and beautification of the tourist spot at Ram Nagar beach.

Proposal for fruit tree plantation and florification expand of highways was also directed to all Departments.

The Chief Secretary visited the construction site of R.C.C. Bridge (Box type culvert) at Ram Nagar under SAGY by APWD. He also inspected the quality of the stones used for construction of the bridge and issued directions to the Deputy Commissioner, N&M Andaman and Superintendent of Police, N&M Andaman to check the quality of materials used for construction of projects. Expressing displeasure over the delay in the construction of the R.C.C bridge at Ram Nagar, the Chief Secretary remarked that such delays are criminal. In this regard, the Deputy Commissioner (N&M) Andaman has been directed to carry out strict inspection on delay of such projects and register complaints on delay in construction works.

They were directed to expedite various pending and ongoing works within stipulated time. APWD was directed to provide details of all ongoing as well as pending works/ projects during the last 10 years.

Similarly, the Rural Development Department was also directed to speed up the progress of upcoming projects. A detailed report with photos was sought on the delays and quality of the NHIDCL projects.

The Chief Secretary also directed the Deputy Commissioner (N&M Andaman) to put up 100 important issues/ challenges pertaining to various Departments viz. Electricity, APWD, Forests etc. in N&M Andaman District for its speedy redressal.

To keep tab on various developmental projects, the Chief Secretary also directed the DM and Superintendent of Police (N&M Andaman) to set up Anti Corruption Wing in the District immediately.

During the visit to Shibpur Airport, the Chief Secretary inspected the Airport extension project and enquired about the delays in the project.

The Chief Secretary also held review meeting with all Heads of Department till late evening on Saturday.

Random RAT test by District Administration in rural areas

105 persons tested at Manglutan and all samples found negative



Port Blair, July 17

The District Administration, South Andaman conducted mobile RAT screening at Manglutan today to detect corona cases in rural areas. The test was randomly conducted on

105 persons and it is encouraging to note that all the samples turned out to be negative.

The District Administration has initiated this facility in rural areas so as to keep check on the spread of

the virus. This step has taken the test facility to remotest areas of the District, thereby making testing easier, faster and accessible to every section of the society, a press release from DC (SA) said.

Vaccination- shield against the virus

2,54,688 lakh eligible beneficiaries vaccinated in Isles so far

Port Blair, July 17

The safety of the citizens is the foremost priority of the Administration, especially during this pandemic time. To shield its citizens from the corona virus, the vaccination of eligible beneficiaries is being initiated by the Administration in different parts of the Islands. Accordingly, the vaccination began with administering of COVISHIELD vaccine for Health Care Workers followed by frontline workers and vulnerable population with co-

morbidities. Subsequently, the vaccination for 45 and above was initiated followed by 18 to 44 years which is currently underway.

Meanwhile, the vaccination drive is continuing smoothly in A&N Islands. As per data available, a total of 2, 54, 688 beneficiaries have been vaccinated so far in A&N Islands, out of the target beneficiaries of 2, 81, 603 (approx.). A total of 3195 people were vaccinated today in A&N Islands. 2210 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South

Andaman District, out of which, 408 were in the age group of 18-44 years. Similarly, 603 beneficiaries were vaccinated in North & Middle Andaman District, out of which, 78 were in the age group of 18-44 years. In Nicobar District, 382 beneficiaries were vaccinated out of which, 265 were in the age group of 18-44 years. A total of 67,346 eligible people in the age group of 18 to 44 years have been vaccinated till date, a press release from Directorate of Health Services said.

Training prog. on IPM in paddy crop held

Port Blair, July 17

To make aware of the latest developments in Integrated Pest Management and refresh the knowledge of the field functionaries of Agriculture Department of South Andaman zone, the Central Integrated Pest Management Centre (CIPMC), Port Blair organized a programme recently in association with Department of Agriculture, in the Conference Hall of Zonal Agriculture Office, South Andaman. The Technical experts from CIPMC Port Blair, Shri Ramesh H.P, Plant Protection Officer, Dr Janardan Saikia, APPO and Dr.A.D.Gawande, APPO delivered lectures on several topics of IPM in rice crop. Various tools of IPM followed in rice crop to manage the

pest and diseases such as cultural, mechanical, biological methods, physical, genetic and regulatory methods were explained in detail in the programme.

Apart from this, use of various types of traps, pheromones to manage pest and disease in paddy were highlighted. Special focus was given on management of ear head bug, the reason being it is one of the major pests in the Islands. Various types of insect pest and diseases occurring in paddy and their management in the Islands ecosystem, especially yellow stem borer, leaf hoppers, case

worm, gundhi bug, blast, brown spot, BLB were explained in depth. In this connection, the CIPMC will be organizing a farmers' field school on IPM paddy in association with Agriculture Department in the farmers' field of South Andaman during this paddy season.

Earlier welcoming the officers of CIPMC and the field functionaries, Shri Ramesh Kumar, Assistant Director (Agri) lauded the importance of such type of training at the right time of paddy cultivation, a press release received here said.

Under the scheme, a scholarship is granted for two girl children per family where the family income is not more than Rs. 8 lakh per annum. The selected girl child receives Rs. 50,000/- per annum for every year of study as a lump sum amount which has tuition fee component of Rs. 30,000/- or at actual whichever is less and further an amount of Rs 2000/- for 10 months as incidentals each year. In case of candidates who have been admitted under tuition fee waiver, the amount of Rs.30,000 is reimbursed. Students are eligible to get an amount of Rs. 30,000/- for the purchase of Books/ Equipment/Software/ Laptop/Desktop/Vehicle/ Fee paid towards competitive examination applications forms/exam/ specific equipment/ software's for visually impaired/ speech and hearing disabled.

Seven students from Degree and three from Diploma Engineering programmes under Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Institute of Technology have been selected for the Pragathi Scholarship for the year 2020-21 amongst 7723 applicants under this Category, a press release from DBRAIT said.

ICC announces groups for T20 World Cup 2021; India and Pakistan placed in same group

New Delhi, July 17

The International Cricket Council has announced the groups for the T20 World Cup scheduled to be held later this year in the United Arab Emirates and Oman. Arch-rivals India and Pakistan are pooled in the same Group B. This year's tournament will be played in two stages.

The first stage will be a qualifier from where four teams will reach the Super 12 stage. Besides six associate



nations, Sri Lanka and Bangladesh will also compete in the qualifiers after they failed to earn automatic qualification through their T20I rankings. England, Australia, South Africa, West Indies, and Sri Lanka will form the Group A, while India, Pakistan, New Zealand, Afghanistan and two other qualifiers have been placed in the Group B.

ANIIMS for YOU

A perceptive approach to restrain COVID-Vaccination and its impact

Corona Virus is not a new entity, the virus has a history as old as 1920s in birds and 1960s for humans. Over the years various mutations resulting in two previous outbreaks as SARS-CoV (2002-2003) and MERS (2012) have shown the capability of this virus. Well, the past is scary but teaches us a lesson on how this can be restrained.

The last pandemic with such intensity was 100 years back i.e.Spanish Flu in 1918, with estimated 500 million infected cases and an estimated 100 million deaths. A total of 4 waves with the world still engaged in World War-I. In addition, medical technology and counter measures at the time were limited or non-existent. No diagnostic tests existed at the time that could test for influenza infection, no drugs to counter the virus or superimposed bacterial infections, even penicillin was not discovered until 1928, X-rays just being introduced, no ICU set up, no mechanical ventilation, still the world managed to come out of this pandemic by very strict measures of quarantine, complete lockdown and measures for wearing masks.

Today, considerable advancements have been made in the areas of health technology, disease surveillance, medical care, medicines and drugs, vaccines and pandemic planning. If we add up this with preventive habits, the pandemic can be easily restrained. The biggest boon we have today is in the form of Vaccines as prevention is always better than cure.

Today, we have numerous COVID vaccines developed and used across the world based on different mechanisms. Some of it are Pfizer-BioNTec and Moderna as RNA vaccine, Oxford AstraZeneca, Sputnik V and Sputnik light, Johnson & Johnson, Convidecia as Adenovirus vector vaccines; Sinopharm (BBIBP)(WIBP), CoronaVac, Covaxin as inactivated viral vaccine. Out of these Oxford-Astra Zeneca (Covishield), Covaxin and Sputnik V have been currently made available in India with Moderna and Pfizer upcoming in succeeding months. India started its vaccination drive since 16th January, 2021.

Why should we get vaccinated?

All COVID-19 vaccines produce protection against the disease, as a result of developing an immune response to the SARS-CoV-2 virus. Developing immunity means there is a reduced risk of developing the illness and its consequences. Getting vaccinated may also protect people around you, because if you are protected from getting infected and from disease, you are less likely to infect someone else, particularly important for people at increased risk for severe illness from COVID-19, such as elderly adults, and people with other medical conditions. Hence, this also helps to break the chain.



Are vaccines safe?

Millions of people have safely received COVID-19 vaccines. All of the approved COVID-19 vaccines go through a rigorous, multi-stage testing process, including large clinical trials that involve tens of thousands of people specifically designed to identify any safety concerns followed by an external panel of experts convened by WHO to analyze the results from clinical trials. Since, it simulates like an infection for our body to learn we get several symptoms like fever, body ache, fatigue, head ache, diarrhoea. But 2 days of fever is better than actual infection with SARS-CoV-2 with unknown outcome!

Which Vaccine should I take?

Comparing the current vaccines available in India with facts, Oxford-AstraZeneca (Covishield) demonstrated an average of 76% efficacy going upto 86% after 1st dose and 2nd dose(>12 weeks apart) of average 82% going upto 92%.COVAXIN® demonstrated an average of 78% vaccine efficacy against mild, moderate, and severe COVID-19 disease. Sputnik V demonstrated an average of 79.4% after 1st dose and 91.6% average after 2nd dose. All the above vaccines have shown the efficacy against severe COVID-19 and as 100% with an impact on reduction in hospitalizations.

Nevertheless, at this point of time when the most important thing is to break the chain of transmission and achieve herd immunity, there is no point in choosing the vaccine. Since all the vaccines have proven to provide a 100% protection against severe disease and significantly reduce hospitalization it's better to take any of them as soon as possible to protect oneself, family and friends.



Safety of COVID-19 vaccines for different groups:

COVID-19 vaccines have been tested in large, randomized controlled trials that include people of a broad age range, both sexes, different ethnicities, and those with known medical conditions. The vaccines have shown a high level of efficacy across all populations. Vaccines have been found to be safe and effective in people with various underlying medical conditions that are associated with increased risk of severe disease. These include high blood pressure; diabetes; asthma; pulmonary, liver or kidney disease; and chronic infections that are stable and controlled.

Those who should consult with a doctor before vaccination include people with a compromised immune system, older people with severe frailty, people with a history of severe allergic reaction to vaccines, people living with HIV, on cancer chemotherapy or other severe immune compromised condition.

Safety of COVID 19 vaccines for children:

COVID 19 vaccine trials for children are currently underway, and when results become available, WHO will provide updated guidance for vaccination in children. Vaccine trials targeting adults were prioritized because COVID 19 has proven to be a more serious and dangerous diseases among older populations.

So what should we do:

Get vaccinated and incite others to get their vaccination. And even after vaccination follow all necessary preventive measures of wearing masks properly, proper hand washing/sanitizing. All of us should restrain from crowding, avoid travelling unless required to limit the contact, eat healthy and vaccinate as soon as possible. If you get infected, have faith in your attending doctor and health care workers, these measures will definitely restrain the spread of COVID and help us to prevent the third wave of pandemic.

The Siren will be blown in the following manner during occurrence of the disaster:-

01.	WATCH	EQ> 6.5 M Wave Amplitude below 0.5 Mtr.	One Long Blast	No immediate action is required. However watch to be kept on the change in magnitude and intensity of the event
02.	ALERT	EQ> 6.5 M Wave Amplitude between 0.50 to 2.0 Mtr.	Two Long Blast	1) People in sea beaches and vulnerable areas to move to higher ground 2) Vessel to move into deep ocean
03.	WARNING	EQ> 6.5 M Wave Amplitude above 2.00 Mtr.	Three Long Blast	1) People in affected areas to evacuate 2) Vessel to move into deep ocean

The siren will be tested on 3rd and 18th of every month at 1000 Hrs. during the test, the siren will be blown for two successive blast for 30 seconds. Siren of Electronic Display Board installed at Police Control Room, State Control Room, Junglight (Fisheries Dept.), Met Office, MRCC, JOC, INS Jarawa at Port Blair, Fisheries Dept. at Rangat, EOC at Mayabunder, MRCC at Diglipur, Fisheries Dept. at Hut Bay, EOC at Kamorta, EOC at Car Nicobar, and MRCC & EOC at Campbell Bay will also be blown in a similar manner at 1000 Hrs.

Therefore, the general public is hereby informed not to panic during the test of siren and requested to remain calm during test blast of siren on the date and time specified above.
