## Plans afoot to enhance security measures in North West Andaman Islands



**Port Blair, Mar 18**  
 A special meeting of the State Board of Wildlife, Andaman & Nicobar Islands was held at Megapode Nest Conference Hall today. The meeting was chaired by the Lt Governor, Lt Gen AK Singh (Retd) and was attended by the Chief Secretary-cum-Vice-Chairperson, Chief of Staff, HQ ANC, PCCF & Pr. Secretary (E&F), PCCF (WL) & CWLW-cum-Member Secretary, DGP, Adhyaksha, ZP, South Andaman amongst other members of the Board.  
 The agenda for the meeting was to introduce the newly constituted board members and to discuss the proposal for augmentation of surveillance/security measures in the North West Andaman Islands initiated by HQ Andaman and Nicobar Command.  
 While addressing the board members post the discussions on the agenda points, the Lt Governor highlighted the huge surveillance/security void along the West Coast of ANI which was being frequently exploited by the poachers and persons involved in other illegal activities. He complimented the HQ ANC for the excellent initiative which would be able to plug this void. The Lt Governor was sanguine that the sharing of the surveillance inputs and the cooperation, with the local administration would result in prevention of illegal poaching thereby protecting the wildlife resources in the A&N Islands.  
 The proposals now will be forwarded to GOI by the A&N Administration for final clearance, an ANC communiqué said here today.

## MP writes to HRD Minister about concerns of Isles students

**Port Blair, Mar 18**  
 The Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray, has brought to the knowledge of the HRD Ministry about the concerns of class XIIth students who appeared for Mathematics exam conducted by CBSE on March 14, 2016. The MP, in a letter addressed to HRD Minister, Smt. Smriti Irani, a copy of which was released to the press, has stated that after the math exam, the students are totally perturbed and disappointed as the question paper, according to the students, was tough & very lengthy. He also pointed that the paper was not according to the CBSE pattern and standard of question was of extremely high. This, he said, will have direct impact on pursuing higher education in good universities on mainland.  
 In this regard, the MP has requested the HRD Minister to personally intervene and issue suitable directions to all concerned authorities for lenient checking, awarding of grace marks and step marks on all attempted questions and the students of the Islands who were unable to finish the paper in time, should also be allotted marks on the left out questions, a communication said.

## Tripartite MoU executed to set up GPS Seismic observatories & early warning system in Isles

**Port Blair, Mar 18**  
 A tripartite Memorandum of Understanding was executed between Andaman and Nicobar Administration, Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Services (INCOIS), Hyderabad and Bharath Sanchar Nigam Ltd (BSNL) Port Blair for setting up permanent GPS Seismic observatories and early warning system in Andaman and Nicobar Islands at 35 location covering the entire length and breadth of Union Territory.  
 The agreement was signed between the Chief Secretary, A&N Administration with Director, INCOIS Dr. Sathesh C Shenoi and Chief General Manager, BSNL, Port Blair in presence of Principal Secretary (RR&DM) today.  
 Under this agreement, the A&N Administration shall make available 35 clear sites for setting up permanent Tsunami Early Warning Sirens towers. INCOIS will provide access to VSAT connectivity. The BSNL will execute the whole work of providing Tsunami Early Warning Sirens as an external project.  
 This tripartite agreement paves new way for developing capabilities to improve the early warning system and strengthening of emergency communication equipments to cop up with any eventualities. The strong motion sensor, GPS receivers and meteorological sensors will be co-located with the real time V-SAT connectivity at 35 locations to be used for early warning, emergency communication and earthquake research, a communication from the Director (DM) said here today.
