NHIDCL team arriving on visit to Isles today; to assess NH-223

Port Blair, July 18
A team of experts, engineers, NHIDCL officials along with Chief Scientist of CRRI will be visiting Andaman & Nicobar Islands tomorrow (July 19) to assess the alignment of NH-223, to know the ground reality and chalk out a faster action plan to construct NH-223 in a high tech manner. The team will comprise of Shri Sudhir Mathur, Chief Scientist, Central Road Research

Institute (CRRI), New Delhi. He has received 14 prestigious awards. The prominent ones being Indian Roads Congress Award for best paper in Journal of Indian Roads Congress-1999, CSIR Technology Award for Engineering Technology - Awarded by CSIR-1999, etc, Shri Sandeep Kumar, GM (Tech) HQ, NHIDCL (In Charge of NH-223), Shri Neeraj Sinha, CEC Projects Pvt. Ltd., (DPR Consultant), Shri Arpit

Sharma, Tenaci Engineering Road Com (Soil Stabilization Expert), Shri Abhishek Bhatnagar, Kaba Infratech, (Soil Stabilization Expert) and Shri AK Verma, Global Road technology (Soil Stabilization Expert). The team is mandated to finalize the technology to construct Road preferably by adopting Soil Stabilization technique. The expert technical team is a high power team specially

deputed by MoRTH/ NHIDCL to give the blue print for the entire stretch of NH-223 (ATR) KM 0 - KM 333. In addition to roads, the team will also visit the sites of 2 creek bridges for the timely implementation.

After undertaking the site visit upto Diglipur, the team will report and will have a formal meeting accompanied by Shri Anand Kumar, IAS, MD, NHIDCL and Secretary, PWD, Chief Secretary, A&N Administration in the Chamber of the Chief Secretary on July 22, 2016. The team will conclude its visit on July 23, a communication from Office of the MP said here today.

Suspicious boat with 11 Myanmar crew apprehended by Coast Guard near Narcondum



Port Blair, July 18
The vigilant ships of Coast Guard, while patrolling near Narcondum Island apprehended one suspicious boat along with 11 Myanmar crew in a late night operation on July 17. The Coast Guard ships Rajkamal and Bhikaji Cama were on a routine patrol of Northern Group of Islands at 2300 hrs on July 17, when they sighted one wooden boat in position 9 miles East of Narcondum Island. The Coast Guard ships tried to establish communication with the boat on maritime frequency to identify; however, the boat did not respond and increased speed to run

away. The boat was not flying any country's flag and was not having any name or registration marking on its hull. Coast Guard ships warned the boat several times on loud hailer and VHF set and also flashed search light indicating the boat to stop and identify, however boat tried to evade and run away from Coast Guard ships. The crew of the boat were also seen throwing some items overboard into the sea, causing more suspicion. Thereafter, Coast Guard ships fired warning shots across the bow of the boat to forcefully stop her. Finally, the boat stopped

and surrendered after approximately 2 hours of chase. The Coast Guard boarding team boarded the boat and it was found that all 11 crew of the boat were Myanmar and none of them were holding any passport. The vessel was carrying large quantity of fuel and water and master/ crew could not give any reason for their presence in Indian waters. The vessel is 81 feet long and is suspected to be involved in human trafficking, as large number of used clothes of men and women have been found onboard. The Coast Guard ship is

who administered the oath, welcomed the members and said they are familiar faces, well-versed with the rules, procedures and conventions of the House.

Later, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi introduced the newly inducted Cabinet colleagues to the House. The House also paid tributes to those who were killed in terror attacks in Istanbul, Kabul, Karada in Central Baghdad, Dhaka, Jeddah, Madina and Nice. The Chairman expressed grief

New Delhi, Jul 18
Digitalisation of Parliamentary documents have helped save 1000 trees. Lok Sabha Speaker, Smti Sumitra Mahajan said this enumerating the steps taken to turn the House into a "paperless institution". She yesterday said the number of copies of various Committee reports and papers laid on the table of the House has been considerably reduced. She said the House has been able to save 80 lakh

SC accepts Lodha panel recommendations on structural reforms in BCCI

New Delhi, July 18
The Supreme Court today accepted major recommendations of the Lodha Committee on reforms in BCCI including a bar on ministers and civil servants and those above 70 years of age from becoming its members. However the apex court left it to the Parliament to decide whether it should come under RTI and if betting on the game should be legalised. The apex court also accepted the recommendations of the Committee headed by retired Chief Justice of India Justice R M Lodha to have a CAG nominee in BCCI. A bench of Chief Justice T S Thakur and Justice F M I Kalifulla rejected BCCI's objection against recommendations for one-state-one-vote. The court said that states like Maharashtra and Gujarat having more than one cricket associations will have voting rights on rotational basis. It accepted the panel's recommendation that there should be a player's association in the BCCI. The bench also accepted the recommendation that one person should hold one post in cricket administration to avoid any conflict of interest and

scrapping of all other administrative committees in the BCCI after CAG nominee comes in. The court also left it to the Board to decide whether there is need for any changes in the existing agreement relating to broadcasting rights and whether a franchise member should be in the Board to avoid any conflict of interest. The bench also requested the three-member panel, also comprising former apex court judges Ashok Bhan and R V Raveendran to oversee the transition of administrative structure in BCCI which has to take place within six months. The apex court-appointed Lodha Committee had on January 4 recommended
