## First National Tribal Carnival to be held in Delhi: Union Tribal Affairs Minister

New Delhi, Oct 18  
First National Tribal Carnival will be held in Delhi from February 12 to 17, 2016. The carnival will be inaugurated by the Prime Minister. This was announced by Union Tribal Affairs Minister Shri Jugal Oram in New Delhi yesterday while addressing the meeting of the Parliamentary Consultative Committee attached to his Ministry. He said the purpose of this carnival is to showcase and promote various facets of tribal culture on a large scale. The Minister said, "the underlying idea is to preserve and promote various facets of

the tribal life relating to culture, tradition, customs and their skills and to expose it to the general population with a view to utilizing the potential for overall holistic development of the Scheduled Tribes." Activities liked displaying documented traditional socio-culture aspects, collection of art/artifacts, cultural performances, demonstration of skills like sports, paintings, traditional healing practices etc. will be part of the six day event. The Minister said, "the thematic panel discussion on issues like tribal health, education, skill development and culture with experts in the

relevant filed will be a part of the carnival". Shri Oram informed the members that the events during the carnival will be a mix of live musical and dance performances, exhibitions, display of craft, fashion show, panel discussion, book fair etc. He said, "a pride parade by tribal troupes in traditional attire shall be added event. The carnival promises to be a mix of art, music, traditional food and one of its kind of non-stop venue for lively entertainment of India's traditional tribal way of life full of experience and knowledge". The Minister said, around three thousand tribals from across the country

are expected to take part in the carnival. Beside, eminent tribal personalities who excelled in various field i.e sports, art and culture, literature, academic, medicine etc have also been invited. It may be recalled that in a review meeting before the Prime Minister in January this year it was decided that Ministry of Tribal Affairs shall initiate a "Tribal Carnival" with cultural troupes from various tribal communities of different States.

## Changes soon to be made in Labour Laws to rationalize them: Minister

Hyderabad, Oct 18  
Union Labour Minister, Shri Bandaru Dattatreya on Saturday said changes will soon be made in Labour Laws to rationalize them and ensure workers welfare with world standards. Addressing reporters in Hyderabad yesterday, he said 44 laws will be integrated into four labour codes. He said near consensus has been arrived at in the Tripartite meetings over the Labour Codes on Wages and Industrial Relations. Stating that these two codes will be introduced

in the next session of Parliament, he said, efforts are underway to get tripartite approval over two more Labour Codes on Welfare and Working Conditions-Safety. The Minister also said the Employees Provident Fund Amendment Bill will also be introduced the next session to benefit about 40 crore people in the unorganized sector. The Labour Minister further said the Provident Fund Act will also be amended and proposed Bill to this effect will be introduced in the next session.

## Bring 'model central law' to curb ponzi schemes: Parliamentary Panel

New Delhi, Oct 18  
The Parliamentary Standing Committee on Finance has suggested framing of a model central law to curb illegal money pooling activities done in the garb of direct selling. The law would include in its ambit collective investment schemes, chit funds, direct selling

schemes and such other activities which are presently permissible but are defined and regulated in a dispersed manner. There have been rising instances of gullible investors getting cheated by fraudulent investment schemes that mostly offer high returns within a short period of time. Observing that broad definition of 'money circulation' is the main reason for the failure of Prize Chits and Money Circulation (Banning) Act, the panel said there should be clear cut definitions so that prohibited schemes do not operate by camouflaging as legitimate schemes like direct selling.

## Govt. asks pensioners to furnish Life Certificate

New Delhi, Oct 18  
Government has asked the pensioners to furnish their Life Certificate and relevant details to their respective banks in order to enable the banks to provide them better services. They have been asked to furnish details in prescribed proforma in the month of November every year to their respective banks. Finance Ministry, in a release said, the pensioners should indicate their present address, telephone numbers and email ID (if available) on their respective Life Certificates.

## Pluto could have a water-ice crust under its surface: NASA

NASA, Oct. 18  
NASA says Pluto could have a water-ice crust under its surface, based on data sent from an unmanned probe. The space agency's New Horizons spacecraft passed within 12,500 kilometers of Pluto's surface on July 14th. A NASA team studied the data sent from the probe and published the results in the October issue of the journal Science. The team says Pluto, a dwarf planet, features vast plains and towering mountains 2,000 to 3,000 meters high and its surface is covered with frozen nitrogen and carbon monoxide and the brittle nitrogen ice is supported by a water-ice bedrock.

## Social Security Insurance Schemes; last date extended upto Nov. 30

The Govt. of India, launched two Social Security Schemes viz Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojna (PMSBY), (accidental insurance of Rs. 2,00,000 with a premium of Rs. 12/-per annum, age limit from 18 to 70 Years) and Pradhan Mantri Jivan Jyoti

Bima Yojna (PMJJBY), (life insurance of Rs. 2,00,000 with a premium of Rs. 330 per annum, age limit from 18 to 50), on 09th May 2015. The last date for enrolment under PMJJBY (without self-certificate of good health) was earlier extended upto Sept. 30, 2015. However, as

a larger proportion of the eligible bank account holders are still uncovered, the last date for enrolment under these insurance schemes, without self-certified of good health for PMJJBY, has now been extended upto Nov. 30, 2015.

**Sindhu stuns Marin, makes final**

Odense, Oct 18  
P.V. Sindhu stunned reigning World champion Carolina Marin of Spain to extend her dream run into the final of the \$650,000 Denmark Open Super Series Premier badminton here on Saturday.  
Double World Championships bronze medalist Sindhu beat the second seed 21-15, 18-21, 21-17 in an hour and 14 minutes.  
In the final, Sindhu will face 2012 Olympic champion Li Xuerui of China, who got past seventh seed Sung Ji Hyun of South Korea 21-8, 20-22, 21-10 in 56 minutes.  
Also, 20-year-old Sindhu improved her head-to-head record against the 22-year-old

Carolina to 2-3.  
Sindhu had earlier registered upset wins over third seed Tai Tzu Ying of Chinese Taipei and sixth seed Yihan Wang of China in the previous two matches.  
In the first game between Sindhu and Carolina, the Hyderabad opened up a 9-4 lead. The Spaniard was not able to bridge the gap and lost 15-21.  
However, some poor line calls seemed to upset Carolina and she regularly hit easy shots into the net.  
Once she corrected those mistakes, she looked a different player and after holding an 11-5 advantage went on to win 21-18.  
In the third game, Sindhu was sharper and got her act together

against the current All England champion.  
Carolina managed a 12-9 lead that swelled to 15-11 as Sindhu struggled with her serve and net play. But Sindhu was quick to correct things and earned three consecutive points to bring the arrears to one at 15-14.  
After Carolina got another point, Sindhu bagged six points on the trot to not only equalise but also hold a 20-16 lead before winning 21-17.  
In the quarterfinals, Sindhu had beaten former World No. 1 Chinese Wang Yihan 21-18, 21-19.

**India beats Australia, enters the final**

Malaysia, Oct 18  
Defending champion India defeated Australia 1-0 in its last league match to enter the final of the fifth Sultan of Johor Cup junior men's hockey tournament here on Saturday. India will take on Great Britain in the title clash on Sunday. India began on an attacking note, but Australia played a strong defensive game, denying its opponent any chance to score as the first half ended goalless. An error from the Australian half in the 42nd minute resulted in a penalty stroke to India.  
Harmanpreet Singh made no mistake in converting the opportunity to give his side the lead. "It's great to finish the league matches on a winning note. It wasn't an easy game and we played against a tough team.

**BCCI not to terminate CSK, RR; two new teams in next IPL**

Mumbai, Oct 18  
The BCCI Working Committee meeting on Sunday decided to include two new teams for the coming season of the Indian Premier League. It also decided not to terminate Chennai Super Kings and Rajasthan Royals that are on a two-year suspension.  
IPL chairman Rajeev Shukla had said that the tournament cannot be held with just six teams. He insisted that the IPL is a 'robust' product and the judgment (suspension of teams) would not affect it.  
"The decision whether it will be a 10-team affair from 2018 will only be taken at the AGM where the other major decisions including bilateral series with

Pakistan will be discussed," a senior BCCI office-bearer told PTI.  
Among other important decisions taken at today's meeting, the Board has scheduled its Annual General Meeting for November 9.  
In July, the Supreme Court-appointed Justice R.M. Lodha Committee suspended IPL cricket franchisees India Cements Ltd (ICL) and Jaipur IPL Pvt Ltd (JIPL) from the Indian Premier League for two years.  
The two team officials found guilty of betting by the Supreme Court were also suspended for a maximum 5 years from taking part in any cricketing activities.

The District Administration has made elaborate traffic arrangements/parking arrangements for the Durga Puja Festival from Oct. 19 to 23, 2015 from 6 pm to 10 pm.  
Accordingly, all the LMVs & two wheelers intending to proceed to G.B.Pant Hospital and National Memorial from Goalghar Junction shall follow the route via Bengali Club, Model School, Clock Tower & Y-Narayan. But the Buses and Heavy vehicles shall be diverted from Model School Crossing via APWD Crossing, Murugan Temple, RGT Road, R.K.Mission Jn., Girls School Jn., Old Scout Hut Jn., Y.Narayana Jn. to National Memorial. All the LMVs & Two wheelers intending to proceed Hayat Singh Crossing or Dairy Farm Junction from National Memorial and G.B.Pant Hospital shall either follow the route via Dharmshala, R.K. Mission, RGT Road, Murugan Temple and APWD or follow the route via Y-Narayan Junction, Scout Hut Junction, ANIIDCO, Fire Brigade, APWD Jn., IP&T Jn., Secretariat Jn. R.B.V. Junction and will proceed to their destination. Those vehicles intending to go to Delanipur will turn from Secretariat Junction to Goalghar and then to Delanipur. All the buses intending to proceed to Hayat Singh from G.B.Pant Hospital shall follow the route via Y-Narayan Crossing, Scout Hut Junction, Girls School,

R.K.Mission, RGT Road, Murugan Temple, APWD crossing, Model School Crossing, Bengali Club, Middle Point, Goalghar, Junglight and Hayat Singh.  
Further, the vehicles intending to proceed to G.B.Pant Hospital and Supply Lane Puja Pandal from Light House Junction shall follow the route via Gandhi Statue, Clock Tower and Y Narayan Junction. These vehicles will not be allowed to return to Clock Tower. The vehicles shall follow the route while returning from G.B.Pant Hospital and Supply Lane Puja either via Dharmshala, R.K Mission, RGT Road, Murugan Temple and APWD or follow the route via Y-Narayan Junction, Scout Hut Junction, ANIIDCO, Fire Brigade, APWD Jn., IP&T Jn., Secretariat Jn. R.B.V, Hayat Singh Junction and will proceed to their destination.  
No vehicle shall be allowed to proceed to Junglight, Hayat Singh or Dairy Farm from Goalghar Jn. (Except buses). They shall follow the route from Goalghar, Bengali Club, Model School, APWD Crossing, IP&T, Secretariat Junction, R.B.V. Jn., Hayat Singh Jn. and then to their destination.  
PARKING  
1. At Atul Smriti Samiti: All the owners/drivers coming to Atul Smriti Samiti to witness and offer the Puja shall park their vehicles in the parking place situated

near IP&T Junction. No vehicle will be allowed to park in front of Atul Smriti Samiti or in front of Head Post Office, Port Blair.  
2. At Netaji Club Puja Pandal:-  
The devotees coming to witness the Puja at Netaji Club will park their vehicles at Old Taxi Stand.  
3. At Supply Lane Puja Pandal (Near Aberdeen Post Office)  
All the vehicles coming to witness the Puja at Water Sports Complex and at the newly constructed parking place on the western side of the Netaji Stadium.  
4. Delanipur Puja Pandal

**Rs 2,000-cr fund to push financial inclusion: RBI**

Mumbai, Oct 18  
The RBI has announced the merger of two different funds to create a new Financial Inclusion Fund- FIF with a corpus of 2,000 crore rupees. In a notification issued in Mumbai, the apex bank said it has decided to merge Financial Inclusion Fund and Financial Inclusion Technology Fund into a single Fund to support 'developmental and promotional activities' of banking services. The new Fund will be maintained by the National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development - NABARD.  
RBI said that the objectives of the FIF shall be to support 'developmental and promotional activities' including creating of financial inclusion infrastructure across the

country, capacity building of stakeholders and creation of awareness to address demand side issues. Another of its major objective would be enhanced investment in Green Information and Communication Technology solution. FIF will also

provide support for funding the setting up and operational cost for running Financial Inclusion and Literacy Centres.

have been admitted in three disciplines such as Automobiles, Electrical Equipment Maintenance and Software Development. Required faculties for these disciplines have been appointed. 35 students have been enrolled in each discipline and the total number of students admitted for the first level in the first ever Community College is 105. There was no restriction in the age bar of the students admitted in the college. Each course has been divided into 5 levels and the duration of each level comprise of 1000 hours, 500 hours each for theory and practical/skills. The contents of Community College courses are student friendly and uniform throughout the country.

The elasticity in the Community College is such that a student after completing first level can enter into job as per their wish (self-employment, Govt. or Pvt. Sectors) and he can also pursue his study for the remaining level anytime in his career. After completing 5 levels, the students will get 'Community Skill Diploma Certificate' from Maharashtra Board of Technical Education (MBTA) to which this college is affiliated. Students will get separate certificates on completion of each level. The Coordinator has further said that the Community College will be run under the overall supervision of the host Institution i.e. DBRAIT. The local industries (authorized service centers of automobiles industries and electrical appliances etc.) have been made partner for imparting skill oriented practical trainings to the students.

Community Colleges are a source of economic growth because it provides an educated and skilled workforce that improves the quality of life for individuals, students, communities, and the Nation, he added. A Community College may be defined as an institution which is 'For the community, By the community and Of the community'. It offers educational opportunities to all sections of society, particularly the marginalized and the disadvantaged. A diploma course at a Community College encourage students who may want to attend a three-year degree but are not academically, mentally or economically ready to study in a formal system.

First Community College of the country was started in 1995 in Pondicherry, and presently, over 200 Community Colleges, approved by UGC and AICTE, are already running in the country and doing yeoman service to generate employment opportunities for youth of rural India.
