PM reviews performance of key infrastructure sectors

New Delhi, Nov 18
The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, on Thursday reviewed progress of key infrastructure sectors including PMGSY, housing, coal and power. The review meeting, which lasted for about two and a half hours, was attended by top officials from PMO, NITI Aayog and infrastructure Ministries of the Government of India. In course of the presentation made by CEO NITI Aayog, it was noted that remarkable progress has been made in several areas. Under the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana, 81 per cent of the targeted habitations numbering about 1.45 lakh have so far been



connected. Officials said progress is being made towards connecting all the remaining unconnected habitations within a defined timeframe. The Prime Minister observed that resources available for this work should be used optimally throughout the year. He also hoped that

the advancement of the Union Budget date would lead to further improvement in performance. The Prime Minister was informed of the expeditious resolution of complaints received on the Meri Sadak App. He called for detailed analysis of the

complaints, so that timely remedial measures are initiated wherever required. Reviewing progress towards the roadmap to deliver 1 crore houses in the rural areas by 2019, the Prime Minister said that the positive impact of housing

Sushil Kumar, Sakshi Malik, Geeta Phogat win gold in National Wrestling Championship



Indore, Nov 18

Two-time Olympic-medallist Sushil Kumar, India's lone woman Olympic medal winner Sakshi Malik and Geeta Phogat won gold medal in their respective categories in the National Wrestling championship in Indore yesterday. Sushil Kumar took less than three minutes to bag a gold medal as three of his rivals gave him a walkover in men's 74kg freestyle competition. Sakshi finished on the top of the podium after posting a dominating 10-0 victory over Pooja Tomar of Haryana in the final of women's 62kg, while Geeta clinched the yellow metal with a win against Ravita in the final of 59kg category.

Revamped Indian Super League kicks off in Kochi

Kochi, Nov 18

In football, the fourth season of the revamped Indian Super League (ISL) began in Kochi yesterday with more teams and home-grown players. The tournament comes after the euphoria generated by the country's maiden FIFA event. There are 10 teams for the first

time in the league's history, with Bengaluru FC and Jamshedpur FC entering the fray. Clubs are allowed to field five foreign players, as against six in previous seasons. In the opening match at Kochi yesterday, Defending champions ATK and Kerala Blasters played out a goalless draw.

The match between two sides, who have featured in the two summit clashes of the earlier three editions so far, did not rise to any great heights with very few goal-scoring chances. This was the first time that ATK drew their first away match in an ISL edition, having won in the earlier three occasions.

He said, NAA enables consumers to apply for relief if they feel reduction in prices is not passed on to them and for this an institutional framework has been provided to take appropriate remedial action. The Minister said, in case the consumers do not get the benefit of reduction in prices, they can apply for the relief to the screening committee to the particular state. In case the incident of profiteering relates to an item to mass impact the application may be directly made to the standing committee.
