



## Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojna comes into effect

New Delhi, Dec 18  
 Offering one last chance to black money holders, the government has said that they have time until 31st March 2017 to come clean by paying 50 per cent tax of the unaccounted money under the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana. Government will use this money from penalty under this scheme for social schemes.

Government has notified changes to income tax law for the new black money disclosure scheme i.e. 'Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana'. Money received under this scheme as penalty will be used for the social schemes meant for the poor.

*\* This scheme starts from Dec 17 and declarations made under this scheme will be kept confidential*  
*\* Any individual who has undisclosed income can disclose income under this scheme till March 31 2017*  
*\* Any individual who declares unaccounted income, will have to pay a fine of 50% of the unaccounted money*  
*\* 25% of the amount will remain locked in for 4 years*  
*\* You can deposit the penalty on your undisclosed income in any bank or in the income tax department*  
*Government is taking very stern measures to combat black money. The cash seizures and various actions are being taken by the concerned departments after demonetisation.*  
*\* So far Search and seizures in 291 cases have been conducted after screening of data*  
*\* In these actions Rs 316 crore have been seized in cash*  
*\* In various raids, New currency notes of Rs 80 crore have been seized*  
*\* and rest amount is in old currency notes and Jewellery*  
*\* If in case you have any information about black money you can also email it on blackmoneyinfo@incometax.gov.in*  
*It is noteworthy that IT department is getting data on suspicious deposits on a daily basis from banks and concerned agencies are keeping a watchdog's eye on every transaction.*  
*If proper information is not provided on the deposited money it may turn troublesome for the depositor.*

## GB Pant Hospital treats injured persons due to accidental airgun shots

 Recently three cases of accidental airgun shot (lead pellets) injury in head and neck area have been treated at G B Pant Hospital. All the pellets were lying adjacent to vital structures like eye ball and sinuses. Injuries were treated by microsurgical techniques avoiding damage to the vital organs.

According to Dr Deshpal, ENT Surgeon seemingly harmless lead pellets shot by airguns can cause severe injuries and may even prove fatal. The lead in these pellets can cause lead poisoning if left in body tissue for long. ## Guidelines on 'work profile of teachers' in CBSE affiliated schools

### Teachers should be engaged in direct teaching and not other activities: CBSE

New Delhi, Dec 18  
 Schools affiliated to CBSE will not be engaged in activities other than those related to direct teaching, professional upgradation, examination, evaluation, etc. This was communicated to all Heads of Directorate/KVS/NVS/CTSA by Secretary (CBSE) in a circular issued recently. For activities of ministerial nature, transport or canteen for similar related tasks, separate trained staff may be deployed by the schools. The circular further stated that the primary function of the teaching profession



lies in facilitating the educational process of the children which is becoming challenging in modern times. While, the students acquire knowledge from multiple sources including internet, the role and importance of the teachers cannot be underestimated. The academic role of teachers in imparting

education has been acknowledged by status and regulations. In terms of Section 27 under Chapter-IV of the RTE Act-2009 "No teacher shall be deployed for any non-educational purposes other than the decennial population census, disaster relief duties or duties relating to elections to the local

authority or the State Legislatures or Parliament, as the case may be". The guidelines were also issued from the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India vide letter No.F-1-3/2010-EE4 dated 13.09.2010 regarding implementation of the Section 27 of the RTE Act-2009.

The issue of engaging teachers in activities other than academic was also raised by the representatives of various states in the meeting of the Central Advisory Board on Education (CABE) held recently.

 As part of unrelenting drive against illegal tobacco sale, a large number of raids were conducted in Campbell Bay by a joint team of Police and DFSO Nicobar. On the basis of credible information from reliable sources, Inspector S.K. Sarkar, SHO PS Campbell Bay with Police team of PS Campbell Bay along with District Food Safety Officer (DFSO) seized Bhagwan Zarda (9 tin), tobacco

pouches (52), Zen Maza Zarda (14 tin), Gulbahar Tobacco (38 plastic boxes), Mustana 220 tobacco (15 plastic boxes), Dhamaka golden special tobacco (2 tin), Karizhma tobacco (1 tin) and 69 Brand Zarda Pouch (5 nos). Contraband products under proper seizure memo. These items were seized from the shops owned by four persons namely Krishna Das, S/o Late Ananta Das, Biswajith Biswas, S/o Late Hazaril

Biswas, S. Kodimadan, S/o V. Sindoor Pandian and A. Thottaiiah, S/o late A. Endaiah.

The offences of all these four persons were compounded by DFSO Nicobar u/s 69 of FSS Act and the seized products were destroyed on Dec. 11, 2016 at Campbell Bay Police Station compound by burying in deep soil after mixing with phenyl in presence of SHO PS Campbell Bay, DFSO and (Contd. on last page)

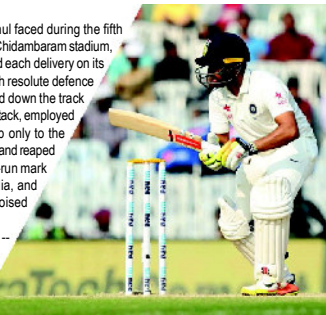

India start confidently after England post 477 in Chennai test

Chennai, Dec 18

For 311 deliveries that KL Rahul faced during the fifth India v England Test at the MA Chidambaram stadium, the Karnataka batsman treated each delivery on its merit. He mixed aggression with resolute defence throughout day two. He danced down the track to hit Liam Dawson out of the attack, employed the sweep and reverse sweep only to the balls that were outside off stump and reaped the rewards. He crosses the 100-run mark in Tests for the first time in India, and then raced past 150, he was poised for 200.

All the while he was focused -- barring one delivery. Unfortunately that delivery, tossed up outside off from Adil Rashid, was the one Rahul tried to take a single to reach 200. It was not overpitched for Rahul to drive through covers, yet he went for a thinking of an easy single to raise his helmet high. It was a length ball that Rahul should have drove towards mid-off. He did not track this ball on its merit and paid the price. The ball was lobbed to point and Jos Buttler completed the catch; Rahul was on his haunches, hand over his head in disbelief and he had to drag himself off the pitch thinking of the agony of that one run. But the 199 that he made, his fourth Test hundred and first in India, was the fulcrum around which India build their first innings in reply to England's 477 on Sunday. By the time stumps were drawn, India had



score 391 for the loss of four wickets, 86 runs adrift of England's firstinnings total. A rare failure for Kohli and England were back in the game. With a spring in their steps, England regrouped and Rashid's ball started to turn a bit more. Aligot just that extra bounce to unsettle the otherwise comfortable Rahul. But Karun battled the early nerves and gave good company to Rahul combining for a 161-run stand for the fourth wicket. He is unbeaten on 71 with local boy Vijay for company (17).

Training session on cashless/virtual/digital money held at JNRM

Port Blair, Dec. 18

A training session as a part of the ongoing policy reforms on demonetization by the Govt. was held at JNRM yesterday. Briefing the session, the chief guest, Dr.N.Francis Xavier, Principal JNRM emphasized the need to change with the changing reforms in the monetary sector.

The programme was coordinated and presented by Dr. P.M.Murali, Associate Professor, Dept. of Economics in association with Shri Farooque, Manager, District Lead Bank wherein all aspects relating to virtual or digital money were dealt at length to the satisfaction of the faculty and students present.

During the presentation, the main aim behind the introduction of cashless or Digital money transaction was explained. The main aim was to check the growing corruption and stop the 'Hawala' transactions, which has been the main cause for increased terrorism in India

and also to bring in an overall transparency in the day to day transactions besides making the transactions convenient. Demonetization refers to a transaction system, wherein the money in its physical form will assume the form of digital or virtual system through E - payments, i.e., through Mobile Banking, Phone Banking, ATM's and through Internet Banking, the speakers explained.

A two-step process for converting our transactions into digital mode was imparted which includes first acquiring Apps of any bank - send SMS (MBREG) to 9223440000 and get user ID and default MPIN. Then, open the apps - register with the User ID and a new MPIN (in place of default MPIN). Secondly, visit the A/C holders bank ATM and register one's Phone No. going to "Mobile Registration" option in the ATM. Then the customers are ready for Mobile banking, the expert added. The programme

concluded with by vote of thanks proposed by Shri. Abdul Salam, Assistant Professor, BBA, JNRM. Ms Jochibed Vincent, Assistant Professor, English compered the programme.

India lift second Junior Hockey World Cup title, first in 15 years



Lucknow, Dec 18

India's junior hockey team lifted the World Cup for the second time in history as they beat Belgium 2-1 in the final in Lucknow on Sunday. This was India's first title in 15 years after they won their maiden on back in 2001.

The final in Lucknow was dominated by India throughout as they attacked right from the word go. Belgium always looked like playing catch with

the Indian team and never created real chances of scoring a goal. India also became the only team besides Germany to win the Junior World Cup more than one time. In 1997, India had finished runners-up, falling in the final against Australia. Against Belgium, India opened the scoring in the eighth minute through Gurjant Singh, who scored a wonderful reverse stick goal from a steep angle

from the left side. India lead 2-0 at half-time after a second goal through Simranjeet Singh who scored his third goal in 22nd minute. With just 15 seconds to go on the clock, Belgium was awarded a penalty corner. With the clock expiring as Belgium took the penalty corner, India were assured of a win in the final. Belgium converted the corner but it was only to change the scoreline to 2-1.

Undeclared Vijender eyes new title next year

New Delhi, Dec 18

The WBO Asia-Pacific title won and defended successfully, Indian boxing star Vijender Singh will now be on the prowl for a new belt and could be challenging for the Commonwealth or the Oriental crown in the next couple of months.

Up against Tanzania's former world champion Francis Cheka in his Super Middleweight title defence clash last night, Vijender took less than 10 minutes to score a knockout win and remain undefeated in his professional career, which is eight fights old now. Next up for him could be a Commonwealth title fight in Leicester. The Commonwealth Super Middleweight is currently held by British boxer Luke Blackledge, who has 22 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses to show for in his 27-fight career so far.

"We have been discussing that probably Vijender might just go back to UK and fight there or in China or in Dubai. So it's not just gonna be about fighting in India," Tomar said.
