## All parties should reach consensus to clear Women's Reservation Bill: VP



Bhopal, Dec 18 Vice President Shri M Venkaiah Naidu today said, all parties should reach a consensus to clear the long-pending Women's Reservation Bill. The bill seeks to provide 33 per cent reservation to women in Parliament and state legislatures. At a state-level convention of

women's Self-Help Groups (SHGs) in Bhopal, the Vice President said, Women are given reservation in local government bodies and efforts are on for women's reservation in Parliament. Stressing that women's empowerment could create a new India, he said the focus should be on 'Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao'

programme of the Government. Earlier, Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Shri Shivraj Singh Chouhan announced several sops for women's SHGs. He said these groups would be exempted from stamp duty on loan documentation as well as get a three per cent rebate on interest.

## BJP wins absolute majority in Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh

New Delhi, Dec 18

The BJP has retained power in Gujarat for the 6th time in a row and swept the polls in Himachal Pradesh finishing just short of two-third majority. The party romped home again in Gujarat by winning 99 seats, seven seats more than the mark of absolute majority in the 182-member House. Congress won 77 seats and others 6.

In Himachal Pradesh, BJP wrested power from Congress by winning 44 seats, two seats short of two-third majority, in the 68 member House. The Congress won 21 and others three.

The prominent winners in Gujarat, include Chief Minister Shri Vijay Rupani and Education Minister Shri Bhupendarsingh Chudasama and Forest Minister Shri Ganapat Vasava.

## Calicut declared first Child Friendly Village of A&N Islands



Port Blair, Dec.18 In a recently conducted workshop by NCPDR in collaboration with UTCPDR, Calicut village of South Andaman has been declared as the First Child Friendly Village (CFV) of A&N Islands by the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights. Child Friendly Village is the concept of NCPDR, introduced in these Islands by the A&N UTCPDR and given to District Child Protection Unit, (DCPU/ A) for implementation in

South Andaman District. Three villages were selected to implement the concept in Pilot phase; Calicut village is one of them which has been awarded as the First Child Friendly Village of these Islands as all the indicators of CFV has been implemented in this village in a very short period of time.

**Sushil Kumar, Sakshi win gold at  
commonwealth Wrestling Championship**

Johannesburg, 18  
Double Olympic medallist Sushil Kumar made a glorious return to the international arena by clinching a gold medal at the Commonwealth Wrestling Championships in Johannesburg, South Africa today.  
Another Olympic medallist, Sakshi Malik, who won a bronze in the 2016 Rio Games, also clinched a gold medal in the championships.  
Sakshi defeated New Zealand's Tayla Tuahine Ford by a score of 13-2 in the final of the 62kg women's freestyle category to add another yellow metal for India.  
Earlier in the day returning to international wrestling after more than three years, Sushil defeated New Zealand Akash Khullar's via a pinfall in the final of the 74kg freestyle category



to clinch the yellow metal. It was his first medal in international wrestling since his gold medal in the 2014 Commonwealth Games in Glasgow.  
It was double celebration for India as other wrestler in same category, Parveen Rana also won a bronze medal.  
Sushil returned to competitive wrestling in November at the Senior Nationals in Indore where he won a gold medal amid controversy after getting

three walkovers from his fellow wrestlers.  
Incidentally, it was Rana who gave him a walkover in the title clash in Indore, but the duo wrestled this time and Sushil came out on top with a 5-4 victory margin.  
In his first bout, Sushil defeated Johannes Petrus Botha of South Africa 8-0 followed by the win over Rana.  
Sushil also beat Jasmit Singh Phulka of Canada by fall en route his gold medal.

**Rohit Sharma storms into top five of  
ICC rankings for ODI batsmen**

Dubai, Dec 18  
Riding on his third ODI double hundred in the recently concluded home series against Sri Lanka, India's stand-in captain Rohit Sharma has moved up into the fifth position on the International Cricket Council's (ICC) Rankings for batsmen in ODIs. India won the three-match series 2-1 by winning the final ODI by eight wickets in Visakhapatnam on Sunday. According to an ICC media release, it is for the first time that Rohit has crossed the 800-point mark. His currently tally stands at 816, thanks to his 208 in the second match against Sri Lanka in Mohali. However, it's not Rohit's career-best ranking as he was No. 3 last year in February. He was placed seventh before the current rankings were



released by the ICC on Monday.  
Rohit's opening partner, Shikhar Dhawan, has also gained a spot to be No. 14 after aggregating 168 runs including an unbeaten 100 in Visakhapatnam. He was named 'Player of the series' for his effort.  
Among the Indian bowlers, legspinner Yuzvendra Chahal has moved up 23 places to take 28th place after finishing with six wickets in the series.

Chinaman bowler Kuldeep Yadav has gained 16 places to be at career-best 56th position. Allrounder Hardik Pandya's 45th position is also the best he has been placed so far in his short career.  
There has been no change of positions in the team rankings. India could have overtaken South Africa at the top with a 3-0 win but that was ruled out early as they lost the opening match on a seaming track in Dharamsala.

BBC Team of the Year Award**

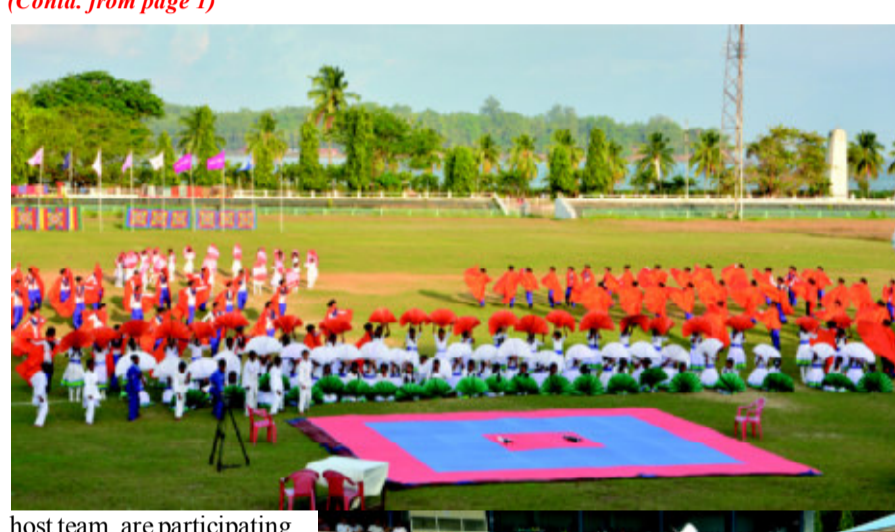


London, Dec 18  
England's women cricket team won the BBC Team of the Year Award following their remarkable win over India in the World Cup that was played under home conditions. In a thrilling final played at the Lord's, England beat India by nine runs. The tournament drew plenty of attention with wide coverage on TV and was attended in numbers.  
Batting first, England scored 228/7 in the 50 overs. In reply, India looked to be in comfortable place before surrendering late on to fall for 219 runs. Punam Raut scored 86 while Harmanpreet Kaur chipped in with 51 runs to bring

India close but the middle to lower order collapsed miserably to hand England the win.  
Elsewhere, the biggest prize on the night went to Britain's Olympic and world champion Mo Farah who won the BBC Sports Personality of the Year award. The distance runner, who won his sixth World Championships gold medal in London this year when he triumphed in the 10,000 metres, was named as the winner ahead of second-placed superbike rider Jonathan Rea and parathlete Jonnie Peacock. Other nominees and pre-event favourites, world heavyweight

boxing champion Anthony Joshua and Formula One world title holder Lewis Hamilton failed to make the top three.  
Farah, born in Somalia and moved to Britain at the age of eight, won 5,000m and 10,000m gold medals at the 2012 and 2016 Olympics as well as six world titles in those distances. The 34-year-old ended his track career this year to concentrate on road running, received the trophy from his step-daughter Rihanna in a studio in London. However, his attempt at sharing his speech was interrupted when BBC's live satellite link to the Echo Arena in Liverpool cut out seconds later.
