essential supplies will be made in order to reduce movement of general public.

In a special effort to bring down cases in Little Andaman, District Administration has stationed Director (RD) and Dy.SP for strict monitoring of containment measures. The Secretary further disclosed that during the RT-PCR conducted on 315 incoming passengers who arrived here yesterday by flight, one positive case has been detected despite their carrying RT-PCR report from mainland. He further informed that 3 flights with 447 passengers arrived today and the RT-PCR reports are awaited. He also stated that during the RAT conducted on 146 passengers proceeding to N&M Andaman at Ferrargunj, 1 positive case has been detected. He said, that today till 3 pm, 380 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which, 352 were in the age group of 18-44 and the rest were above 45.

The Director, ANIIMS, Dr. A K Mandal disclosed that 13 COVID positive patients are presently undergoing treatment in the Hospital. Today, 3 COVID patients were discharged. He further informed that out of the 13 patients, 9 patients are on Oxygen support and no patient is on ventilator, he added.

The Deputy Director, G.B Pant Hospital, Dr. Amitabha De informed that in the three COVID Care Centres functioning in Port Blair, 1 new patient was admitted today and 1 patient was discharged. Altogether, 9 patients are presently being taken care of in these three COVID Care Centres while in COVID Care Centre Wimberlygunj, altogether, 6 patients are admitted, he added.

In N&M Andaman, 93 beneficiaries were vaccinated out of which 89 were in the age group of 18-44. In Nicobar District, 279 beneficiaries in the age group of 18-44 years were vaccinated.

The online registration for the vaccination is done through CoWIN portal and Aarogya Setu App. The slot for 18+ will be opened tomorrow from 9.30 am onwards for a week. Only 300 persons per slot will be given. Beneficiaries may get registered and schedule themselves for the vaccination. Online registration is mandatory and no on-site registration will be done and people have been advised to reach the centres as per the time schedule provided to the beneficiaries through the App. The general public have been requested to follow COVID Appropriate Behaviour while going for vaccination, a press release from DHS said.

**Safety Tips on Monsoon Preparedness  
(For Cyclone, Heavy Rain, Water Logging, Flash Flood etc.)**



1. Listen to radio or TV weather reports for warning & advice and be alert.
2. Identify safe shelters in your area. These should be cyclone resistant and also find the closest and safe route to reach them.
3. All your family members should know the safe routes to nearest shelter/raised pucca buildings.
4. Keep your emergency kit and basic food supply, medicines, torch and batteries etc. ready in waterproof bags. Drink preferably boiled water. Keep your food items covered.
5. Doors, windows, roof and walls should be strengthened/checked before the cyclone season through retrofitting and repairing. Store adequate foodgrains and water in safe places.
6. If your area is flood-prone, consider suitable flood resistant building materials.
7. Do not let children and pregnant woman remain empty stomach.
8. Put furniture, clothing and valuable items etc. on a higher platform so that they can be shifted safely/easily.
9. Do not use electrical appliances, which are in flood water.
10. Do not go into water of unknown depth and current.
11. Do not allow children to play in, or near flood water.
12. Do not venture into the sea if so advised. Stay Indoors under the strongest part of the house/if not moved to the cyclone shelter.
13. Remain indoors until informed that weather has improved.
14. In case of cyclone alert, do not go out, till officially advised that it is safe. If evacuated, wait till advised to go back. Use the recommended route to return to your home. Do not rush/panic.
15. Be careful of broken/uncovered power lines, damaged roads and houses, fallen trees etc.
16. Be careful of snakes, as snake bites are common during floods.

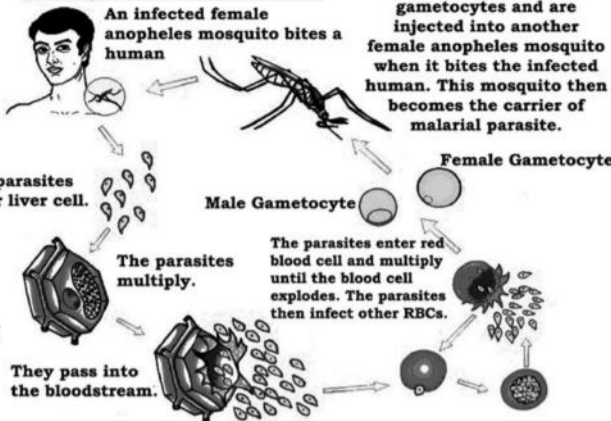

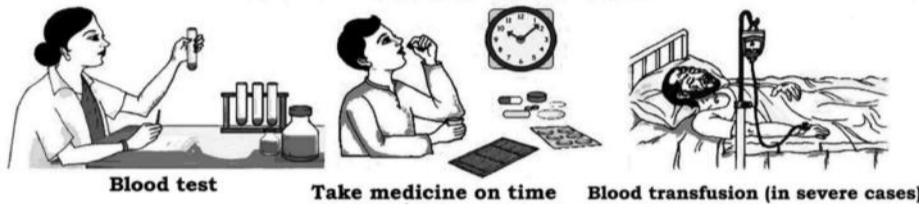

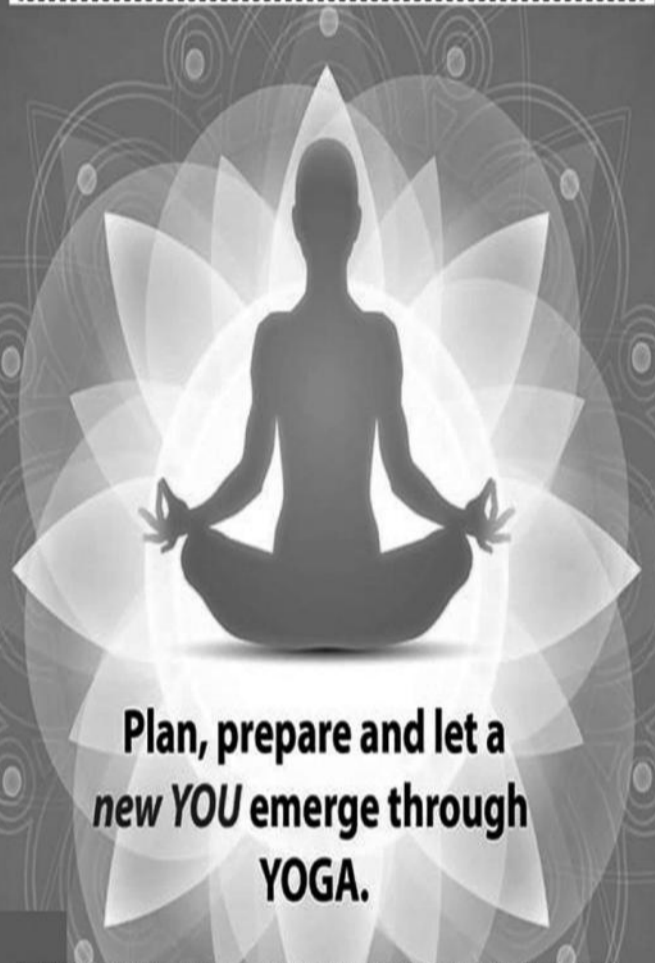
