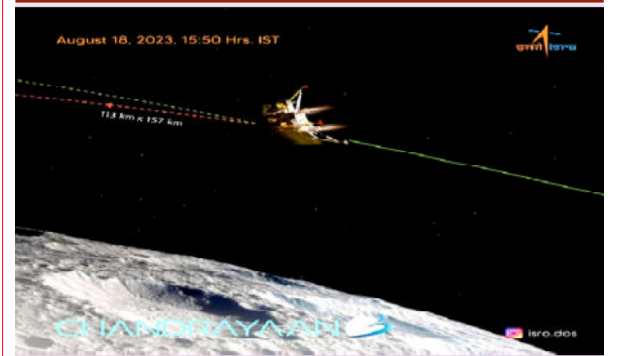

Strict actions will be initiated against violators

The Andaman Nicobar Pollution Control Committee (ANPCC) has issued a stern reminder to all industries operating within Andaman and Nicobar Islands to comply with the provisions outlined in the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, and the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981, it is mandatory for every industrial unit to obtain the Consent to Operate (CTO) from ANPCC before the establishment of any Industry, operation, process, treatment and disposal system, or any extension thereof, which is likely to discharge sewage, trade effluent, or pollutants into water bodies, land, or air.

Additionally, every Industrial Unit must also secure the Consent to Operate (CTO) from ANPCC after the establishment of the unit. The absence of these consents not only poses a serious threat to the environment but also constitutes a violation of the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981, and the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986.

Prompt action by PMF staff saves drowning boy



Port Blair, Aug.18
Prompt and immediate rescue operation by staff of Police Marine Force saved a precious life at sea. On Aug 15, the PMF boat (Island Marines) was deployed to perform duties for safety and security of Islands from illegal intrusion. At around 11.30 am while patrolling by FRP boat ANP Prithivi between Netaji Subash Chandra Bose Island and Aberdeen Jetty, the staff noticed a boy drowning in the sea. On sighting the boy in distress, ANP Prithivi (FRP) rushed towards the spot. PC Saw Paul (PMF) immediately jumped into the sea and successfully saved the life of a school going child studying in Govt. Sr. Secondary School Mohanpura.

The boat staff of PMF immediately informed the Police Control Room and the boy was taken to G.B. Pant Hospital without delay and admitted in the hospital for further examination by doctors. The boy is out of danger.

industrial units have been established and are operating without obtaining the requisite CTE and CTO as mandated by law. Such actions not only disregard environmental safeguards but also undermine the health and well-being of the community and ecosystem.

In light of these observations, ANPCC urgently urges all industries to: 1. Obtain Consent to Establish (CTE): Industries planning to establish new units or expand existing operations must obtain prior consent from ANPCC. This consent ensures that the proposed activities adhere to pollution control standards.

2. Secure Consent to Operate (CTO): Industries already in operation must obtain CTO from ANPCC to ensure their activities are in compliance with environmental regulations.

3. Authorisation: Some industries requires authorisation under various rules framed under the Environment Protection Act, 1986 for disposal of waste generated during the activities

4. Comply with Environmental Laws: It is the moral and legal responsibility of every industrial unit to uphold the provisions of the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981, and the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, to ensure a sustainable and pollution-free environment.

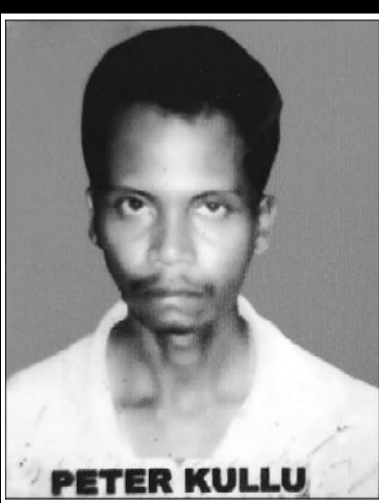

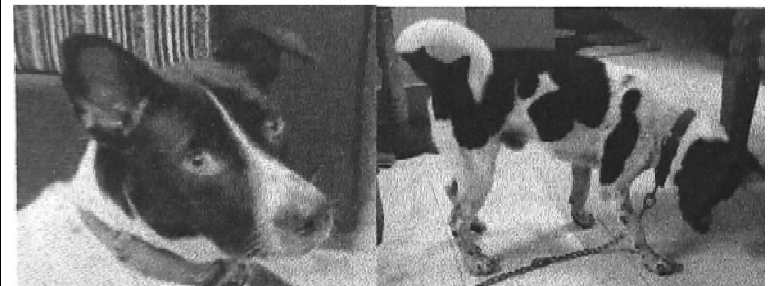
