Digi Dhan Melas: Consumers, merchants win prizes worth Rs 61 cr

New Delhi, Jan 19 Over three lakh 80 thousand consumers and twenty one thousand merchants have won prize money worth around 61 crore rupees at 24 Digi-Dhan Melas across the country. This was disclosed by the Information Technology Minister Shri Ravi Shankar Prasad in New Delhi yesterday. He said, government's efforts to

give a boost to the digital payment systems and cashless economy have evoked good response from the people. Shri Prasad said, people from different age groups, occupations and walks of life have taken part in a big way in the Lucky Grahak Yojana and Digi-Dhan Vyapar Yojana giving a fillip to digital transactions. The schemes were launched on 25th of

December last year and shall remain open till 14th of April this year. The schemes are aimed at incentivising the consumers and the merchants to promote digital payments. He said, the common service centres under the department of Electronics and IT has trained 1.94 crore citizens and 5.93 lakh merchants for carrying out transactions through digital payment systems.

Visit of National Human Rights Commission to Isles A&N Administration taking appropriate care of its citizens: NHRC Chairman



Port Blair, Jan 19 The National Human Rights Commission conducted its first camp sitting and open hearing, in these Islands here today. Briefing the media in the evening, about the issues that came up during the camp sitting, open hearing and meetings with NGOs and the A&N Administration, the Chairman, NHRC, Justice H.L. Dattu expressed happiness that the A&N Administration is taking appropriate care of its citizens and the NHRC has not received any complaint regarding any serious

human rights violation in the Islands. The Commission received only 20 complaints from the A&N Islands in a year while it receives about 1.20 lakhs complaints from each States annually, said Justice Dattu adding that this is the least number of complaints from any State or UT, which shows that the status of human rights in these Islands is very good. Justice Dattu further explained that the National Human Rights Commission in terms of its mandate under the Protection of Human Rights Act, 1993 has been holding camp sitting/open hearings in various parts of the country with the objective of spreading awareness and better protection of human rights. Justice Dattu further explained that during the open hearing/camp sitting at A&N Islands, the Commission took up for hearing 10 complaints about alleged violation of human rights. These complaints included issues such as denial of proper medical care on account of improper functioning of GB Pant Hospital, lack of manpower support including specialist doctors, problem of encroachment of land, poachers in the tribal belts, atrocities on Scheduled Tribes, deaths in hospitals, atrocities on Jawara tribe women and lack of infrastructure such as roads, bridges, potable water, power etc. in different regions. The Commission considered at length the submissions made by the concerned UT Administration officers and asked for comprehensive report in eight cases for amelioration of the problems. In one case of proven violation of human rights, the Commission issued a show cause notice u/s 18 of the PHR Act, 1993 to the UT Administration to show cause as to why monetary relief may not be awarded to the victim tribal girl. One case was closed since the Commission was satisfied with the action taken by the authorities. In the second half, the Commission had an interaction with the NGOs who highlighted various issues such as unauthorized cargo boats

Defending champ Novak Djokovic stunned by 117-th ranked Denis Istomin

Melbourne, Jan 19
Defending champion and World No. 2 Novak Djokovic was knocked out in the second round of the Australian Open by Uzbekistan's Denis Istomin today. The 117th-ranked Istomin ousted the



six-time winner 7-6(10/8), 5-7, 2-6, 7-6 (7/5), 6-4 in 4hr 48min on Rod Laver Arena. The 30-year-old world number 117 played the match of his life to hand the six-times champion only his second defeat in seven years at Melbourne Park.

Istomin let out a huge roar of delight when he ensured Djokovic's earliest exit from the tournament in more than

a decade, the 12-times grand slam champion sending a service return long to end the contest after four hours and 50 minutes. The wildcard, who hit 63 winners, edged the first set but simply refused to fold when second seed Djokovic hit back to win the second and third sets. Clinching the fourth on another tiebreaker to send the match into a decider, Istomin

grabbed an early break in the fifth and held his nerve to deliver a famous victory. "I mean it was tough, since third set I get cramping in my leg so I don't know how I hold it," he added. "But I was physically normal today." After the biggest win of his career, Istomin moves onto a third-round meeting with Spaniard Pablo Carreno Busta.

Yuvraj breaks Sachin's record against England, hits century after 6 years

Cuttack, Jan 19
Yuvi reached the 100th milestones in just 98 balls. He came in at number 5 after Shikhar Dhawan bowled by Chris Woakes and the squad was decreased to 25/3. After 6 years of long wait and a very hard struggle, the left-handed hard hitter from team India, Yuvraj Singh has finally smashed a massive century against England on January 19 in Cuttack. This was Yuvi's first 100 after the 2011 world cup which he had scored against West Indies in Chennai. Yuvi reached the 100th milestones in just 98 balls. He came in at number 5 after Shikhar Dhawan was topped in a bowl by Chris Woakes and was bowled after scoring 15 in 11 balls and the squad was decreased to 25/3. With this century, Yuvi not only scored 14th ton of his career but also surpassed 'Master

Blaster' Sachin Tendulkar in terms of scoring most runs in ODIs against England. Sachin had scored 1455 runs in ODI against England, which was the highest by any Indian in ODIs, but in today's match, Yuvi left Tendulkar behind after scoring a total of 1478 runs in 35 innings against England. In addition, Yuvraj now also holds the record of highest individual runs scored against England in an inning - 150 runs off 125 balls. In innings played a vital role in bringing the Indian innings back on track. England had won the toss and decided to bowl first. KL Rahul and Shikhar Dhawan did start India off on to a brisk start but Rahul was dismissed by Chris Woakes in the third over. The real blow came four balls later when skipper Virat was caught in the slips. Dhawan was dismissed shortly thereafter by Woakes himself and India were tottering at 25/3. And, this was the knock which led Yuvi reach his 100 of 98 balls.



Captain Smith powers Australia to 2-1 lead

Perth, Jan 19
Steve Smith's eighth One-Day International (ODI) century fuelled Australia's seven-wicket victory over Pakistan in Perth and gave the hosts an important 2-1 lead in the five-match series. After Australia were delicately poised at 46 for 2, Smith (108 not out from 104 balls) combined in a 183-run third-wicket partnership with debutant Peter Handscomb (82 from 84) as the hosts chased down 264 in the 45th over, with Travis Head remaining unbeaten on 23.

The turning point of the match came in the 10th over when Handscomb was caught at slip off Junaid Khan, but the paceman overstepped in a major reprieve for the tentative ODI newcomer who hadn't scored from three deliveries. Australia would have been teetering at 3/46 had Junaid not overstepped and a rampant Pakistan could have smelled a series win but, alas for them, the gaffe proved costly. Despite the white hot form in the Test arena, where he averages nearly 100 from four

Tests, Handscomb's selection raised some eyebrows due to a modest 50-over domestic record. Those fears materialised early with Handscomb looking out of touch and he should have been dismissed on 10 but was dropped at backward point. Inevitably, Handscomb shrugged off the struggles and his assured batting from Test cricket resurfaced during the match-winning partnership with Smith, who also became the fastest Australian to 3000 career ODI runs.

society. Highlighting the objectives of NHRC, the Chairperson said, it aims at ensuring speedy disposal of pending cases and issues related to human rights violations by interacting with NGOs and other stakeholders of the society. He added that the Commission has also initiated open hearing on various issues relating to atrocities and problems faced by the Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribes.

The Chairman further stated that the open hearing/camp sitting has become very important, as it enables the Commission to interact with all sections of the society to know the ground reality of the issues. He also acknowledged the challenges and limitations faced by people of these Islands and the issues pertaining to the welfare of PVTGs of A&N Islands.

He said, through this open hearing, the Commission seeks to work hand in hand with the States/ UT Administration in resolving various issues and challenges including Human Rights violation cases, he added.

Addressing the gathering, the Secretary (General), NHRC, Shri Satyanarayan Mohanty said, NHRC has organized camp sittings in several States across the country and for the first time, the Commission has organized open hearing/camp sitting here in A&N Islands today. He said, the Islands have its own limitations in terms of access to National Institutions besides various other issues. Though NHRC works as a catalyst, the primary responsibility of protection of Human Rights still remains with the UT Administration, he said adding that the need for intense engagement of both is necessary and it must be carried forward. He remarked that the open hearing/camp sitting has been designed not only to hear and dispose off pending cases, but also to provide opportunity to the State Government/ UT Administration to assess important human rights issues.

In his address, the Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Anindo Majumdar outlined the unique features of A&N Islands which reflects the essence of perfect peace and harmony despite its diversified population. He also brought to the fore the issues pertaining to the welfare of PVTGs of these Islands and efforts taken by the A&N Administration in ensuring a conducive environment for them to grow. He expressed hope that the visit of the NHRC and its Members, would benefit the Islanders and it would also provide valuable suggestions, guidance and directions to the A&N Administration in creating the required environment for the citizens of these Islands and assured the commitment of the A&N Administration in upholding the rights of every human being and safeguarding their welfare.

Earlier, welcoming the gathering, the Secretary (Law), Shri Sandip J Jacques remarked that a right is not what someone gives you, but it is what no one can take away from you. He said, since the A&N Islands do not have its own Human Rights Commission, the visit of NHRC to these Islands is of immense significance. He also threw light on the inception of NHRC and its objectives adding that NHRC receives complaints from across the country all through the year and through the recommendations, it seeks to enquire and resolve Human Rights violation issues in the country. The inaugural session concluded with the vote of thanks proposed by the Joint Secretary, NHRC, Dr. Ranjit Singh.

This was followed by an open hearing/ camp sitting on various issues relating to atrocities and problems faced by the Scheduled Tribe/ Scheduled Castes. The commission took up hearing of 10 complaints about alleged violations of Human Rights in A&N Islands during which concerned officials of A&N Administration made their submissions and were asked by the Commission to furnish comprehensive reports in the cases brought forth, for solving the problems.

Serena Williams routs Lucie Safarova to reach third round at Rod Laver Arena

Melbourne, Jan 19
Serena Williams charged into the third round of the Australian Open on Thursday with an emphatic 6-3 6-4 win over Czech Lucie Safarova. The second seeded American, bidding for a seventh title at Melbourne Park, served up a storm, clubbing 15 aces and 35

winner in the 86-minute contest under the lights at Rod Laver Arena. Williams blew two match points in an uncharacteristic lapse but closed it out on the third with a searing forehand down the line that Safarova did well to get a racket to. Williams next faces compatriot Nicole Gibbs for a place in the fourth round.

On a day when everyone struggled against gusty winds and a sudden drop in temperature, Neha Tripathi carded six over 78 to maintain the lead in the second round of the 1st leg of the Hero Women's Professional Golf Tour here today. at Junglighat (Burning Ghat), environmental pollution at Prothrapur Graveyard, total absence of lights at bus stops, problems due to sale of liquor, non constitution of Women Commission and State Human Rights Committee, lack of electricity and BSNL connectivity besides denial of infrastructural facilities at Anganwadi Centres at Port Blair. It was also brought to the notice of the Commission that there has been no BPL category survey during the last 15 years and tribal workers from Chhotanagpur who settled in 1918, have not been granted ST status, informed Justice Dattu.

The issues raised by the NGOs along with the other issues which came to notice during the course of the hearing were taken up with the Chief Secretary and other senior officers of the Union Territory. The authorities have assured the Commission of prompt action and effective steps for better protection of human rights of the residents of this UT.

The Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Anindo Majumdar has assured of looking into all the issues, Justice Dattu informed adding that the Administration will also issue disability certificates to the eligible persons within 15 days of applying while the fishermen will be covered under insurance schemes so that in case of any eventuality, appropriate compensation can be given to them. The A&N Administration will also ensure proper lighting system at the bus stands soon, Justice Dattu said.

The media briefing was also attended by Members, NHRC, Justice D. Murugesan and Shri S.C. Sinha. Proposing the vote of thanks at the end, the Secretary (General), NHRC, Shri Satyanarayan Mohanty said that this was the first visit of NHRC to these Islands and it has been a very fulfilling experience.
