## NEWS IN BRIEF

### Govt launches 100 accessible websites for Divyangs

New Delhi, Jan 19  
Social Justice and Empowerment Minister Shri Thaawarchand Gehlot today launched 100 accessible websites for Divyangs. These 100 government websites are now divyang friendly. The divyang-friendly websites, especially for visually impaired, use features such as screen readers and screen magnifiers, which can relay website content to the user in audio format. Shri Gehlot said 900 such websites will be launched in a phased manner.

### Attack helicopter Rudra in Republic Day parade

New Delhi, Jan 19  
Indigenously-developed weapon system integrated helicopter Rudra will make its maiden appearance in the Republic Day parade on Rajpath in New Delhi. Indian Air Force officials said, the flypast by the Indian Air Force on the Republic Day parade will involve 38 aircraft, including 21 fighters, 12 helicopters and five transporters.

New Delhi, Jan 19  
National Disaster Response Force, NDRF celebrated its 13th Raising Day today. The Force was raised on 19th January, 2006, as a specialised force capable of responding to any type of disaster in the country and abroad. It is strategically deployed across the nation as per the vulnerability profile. Addressing the raising day event in New Delhi, Director, Intelligence Bureau Shri Rajiv Jain said, each life is precious and the force has saved more than four thousand lives since its inception during relief and rescue operations.

A memorandum was submitted by both, the ZP



Adhyaksha and Upadhyaksha to AS (UT), MHA. During the meeting it was discussed that the Administration will find out Savings in the current budget which shall be distributed to PRIs. ## Electricity Department notifies site office phone numbers for redressal of grievances

Port Blair, Jan.19

The Administration is taking all possible steps to reduce the load shedding and normalize the power supply as early as possible. The Government and Private Power Plant are running at its full capacity to ensure the consumers are satisfied, however due to deficit of about 7-8 MW in Port Blair and South Andaman, rotational load shedding is being

exercised. The Superintending Engineer, Electricity Department, in a press release has said that owing to continuous running of the existing DG sets, they are prone to fatigue and failure. However, due to 24x7 efforts from the Engineers and its associated staff of the power plants, these DG sets are maintained and kept in running condition.

Further, it is noticed that the aggrieved consumers call at the power houses for knowing the details of load shedding thereby defocusing the staff from their work, as during the peak hours system has to be continuously monitored. Thereby, all the consumers have been advised to avoid making calls in the Power Houses. However, the Electricity

## PBMC's efforts to keep city clean & green

## 'Collect plastic and get money, prize & employment' scheme launched

Port Blair, Jan.19

The Port Blair Municipal Council has announced a scheme for the entire year of 2018 wherein any person can become partner with Municipal Council in its efforts in keeping the city clean and green. Under the scheme, any person may collect plastic bottles/plastic bags/plastic waste and deposit between 9 am and 12 noon, on every first Monday of the month.

Accordingly, the first collection for the month of January will be accepted on Feb 5, 2018 at Compost Yard, Gandhi Park, Community Hall at Dairy Farm, Sanitary Site Office at Dolly Gunj, Community Hall at Paththar Gudda (Old Panchayat Ghar), near Vegetable Market at Bathu Basthi and Dry Resource Park at Brookshabad.

Cash amount @ Rs. 2/- per kg will be paid at the time of deposit. The 20 persons who deposit maximum quantity will be given cash prizes at @Rs. 10,000/- each to first five persons, Rs. 5,000/- each to next five persons Rs. 3,000/- each to next five persons and Rs. 2,000/- each to next five persons which will be credited in their Bank Accounts, within next 10 days.

Five persons, who win highest total money, during the year 2018 will be given preference in job on Muster Roll basis in the Sanitary Section of PBMC. However, they must be an Islander Card Holder and aged between 18 to 50 years; and must be one of the winners in atleast 6 months, during the year 2018.

Employees of PBMC, including DRM/Muster Roll workers, are not eligible to participate in this scheme. However their family members are allowed to participate in the scheme.

Three-time champions India continued their dominant show in the ICC Under-19 World Cup as they thumped an ill-equipped Zimbabwe by 10 wickets on Friday. India, who had already sealed a quarterfinal spot with back-to-back wins against Australia and Papua New Guinea in Group B, produced another spectacular show to top the Group B. India are likely to face Bangladesh in the quarterfinal.

India rise three places in latest FIFA rankings



New Delhi, Jan 19  
India jumped three rungs to be placed 102nd in the first FIFA rankings of the year released yesterday. India, who are just above 103rd placed Qatar, are ranked 14th among Asian countries. India garnered 13 points in the last one month for a total of 333 points. The Indians remained unbeaten in 2017, having won seven of their nine matches while two ended in draws. India had also qualified for the 2019 AFC Asian Cup. The top 14 spots remained unchanged with reigning World Champions Germany at the top followed by Brazil, Portugal, Argentina and Belgium. Iran is the top-ranked Asian team at the 34th position.
