National Seminar on 'Geopolitics and Maritime Security' begins A&N Islands to play pivotal role in India's engagement with South East Asia & Asia Pacific: LG

Port Blair, Feb.19
A two-day national seminar on "Geopolitics and Maritime Security in the Indian Ocean: An Indian Perspective" got underway at Dweepika hall of ANC today. The Lt. Governor, Lt. Gen. A K Singh (Retd.) inaugurated the all important seminar as the chief guest, by lighting the traditional oil lamp in the presence of the Chief Secretary, Shri Anand Prakash, Chief of Staff ANC, Maj Gen P.K Siwach and other dignitaries from mainland. The seminar is being organized by the Indian Ocean Resource Center, a chapter of the Institute of Social & Cultural Studies (ISCS), Kolkata, in collaboration with the A & N Administration and Jawaharlal Nehru Rajkeeya Mahavidyalaya.

Acknowledging the relevance of the topic of the seminar viz. 'Geopolitics and Maritime Security in the Indian Ocean', the Lt. Governor, while delivering his inaugural speech, stated that the centre of geoeconomics, geopolitics has been shifted from Pacific Atlantic to Asia Pacific which includes the Indian Ocean Region (IOR). "There is a realignment of economic, security and diplomatic activities dominating the sea towards the Indian Ocean Region. The conduct of the seminar in A&N Islands is of great relevance as the Islanders who live among the seas shall understand this best", the Lt Governor said. Speaking about Grand Strategy, the Lt. Governor remarked that Grand Strategy is all about spheres of influence, resources, groupings and alliances. So far, India has shied away from the grand strategy. India's strategy culture has been guided by its history, geography and traditional values, said the Lt. Governor. The Lt. Governor also threw light on the broad contours of India's strategy which have emerged viz. India does not take up any land outside its boundaries, but it is determined to protect & safeguard its territories, secondly India does not propound to impose its ideology on anyone, but does not allow anyone to impose their ideology either, thirdly, India does not want to be a part of any grouping or alliance and will take action as it deems fit as per its national interest and most importantly, India values and cherishes the autonomy of strategic decision making.

Speaking about the Indian Ocean Region (IOR), the Lt. Governor stated that there has been a little tentativeness in our abilities to propound anything beyond our boundaries. "India has emerging policy of omni-alignment, he said. "With this newly emerging alignment policy, India has



become assertive and aware of its role in the world affairs in the 21st century, keeping in mind the expectations and fulfilling its obligations", the Lt. Governor remarked. Highlighting the significance of Indian Ocean Region pertaining to security aspect, the Lt. Governor also



highlighted about the issues of IOR's geopolitics and maritime security which (Contd. on last page)

The Office of the Assistant Commissioner, South Andaman District, in a press release issued today, has informed about the streamlining of the registration process by bringing change in the criteria/procedures to be adopted. Accordingly, the general public and all concerned have been informed that they should submit the deed along with the requisite documents, and after preliminary verification on the spot, expected dates of registration are being given which is within a week of submission. Similarly, submission and registration of

deeds will be done in the forenoon while inquiry and collection of registered deeds will be done in the afternoon. Registrations of deeds are done via the computer based IRIS (Island Registration Information System) which curtails the frequent visit by parties to Sub- Registrar's office. For public convenience, applicant can now directly apply for or report to their concerned Tehsil and submit a report along with the deed. (Contd. on last page)

The sports activities in rural areas of South Andaman are poised for a boost, as the construction of a spacious Multipurpose Indoor Sports Hall at Kanyapuram, Wimerlygunj is going on in full swing. Sixty percent work of this much awaited sports project is complete. It may be recalled here that the Lt Governor, Lt General AK Singh (Retd) laid the foundation stone for the much required sports infrastructure facility at Kanyapuram on June 18, 2014. Being constructed by

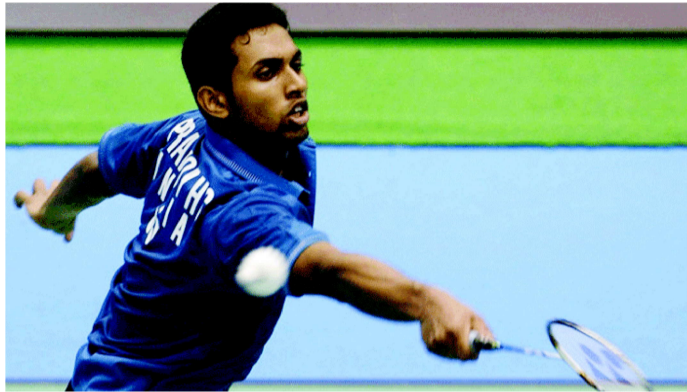
the Andaman Public Works Department, this much awaited sports project is expected to be ready by April 2016, APWD sources informed while speaking to 'The Daily Telegrams' here. This Multipurpose Indoor Sports Hall of Department of Sports & Youth Affairs will be used for promotion of sports in the region. The sports infrastructure, which is a double storied RCC framed structure, with a spacious hall for indoor games, is being built on a plinth area of 1202.04Sqmts (37.1mtr length and 32.4mtr width). The ground floor of the Sports Complex will have the facilities such as

**Asia Badminton Team Championships
Indian men beat Malaysia 3-2;
play Indonesia in semis**



New Delhi, Feb 19

Indian men's badminton team continued its impressive form to book a place in the semi-finals of the 2016 Badminton Asia Team Championships on Friday in Hyderabad. In the five-match quarter-finals tie against former champions Malaysia, H S Prannoy won the decisive match against Teck Zhi Soo to give India a hard-fought 3-2 win at the Gachibowli Indoor Stadium.

Prannoy, 23, played a dominating game to win the match in straight games 21-12,

22-20 in just 38 minutes. Earlier in the day, India's top player Srikanth Kidambi also produced a clinical display to beat Zulfadli Zulkiffli 21-14, 21-15 and give India the perfect start.

His win was followed by a tough double's win by Manu Attri and Sumeet Reddy, who beat Juan Shen Low-Kiang Meng Tan 10-21, 22-20, 21-16 in fifty minutes.

With a 2-0 lead, India could have settled the tie, but Ajay Jayaram lost his match to Iskandar Zulkarnain Zainuddin

in three grueling games, which lasted just under an hour.

The Malaysians then won the next doubles match, with Yew Sin Ong and Ee Yi Tio surviving a tense 51 minute long tie over Pranaav Jerry Chopra and Akshay Dewalkar 21-14, 14-21, 21-12.

Yesterday, India beat a seemingly depleted Chinese team 3-2.

India will play Indonesia in the semi-final tomorrow, while South Korea meet Japan in another last-four encounter.

Indian team is in auto-pilot mode, says Dhoni

New Delhi, Feb 19

Emboldened by recent success at home and away, India's limited over captain Mahendra Singh Dhoni on Friday asserted that his team is in "auto-pilot" mode and shaping up well for the upcoming big-ticket ICC World Twenty20. India blanked Sri Lanka 3-0 at home recently, following their triumph Down Under, which has given the team hope of regaining the trophy it won in its inaugural edition in 2007 under the leadership of Dhoni. The 34-year-old said, "We have played T20s in Australia and the at home in recent times. The team is doing well. So, you can say that the team is in auto-pilot mode. Injuries have to be kept at bay. If every player is fit, and every player is in form then it is good for the team," Dhoni said. Dhoni is especially satisfied with the performance of his bowlers and expects them to deliver in the mega-event starting March 8. According to him, they are better equipped to do well in the shortest format than in ODIs. "As far as T20 is concerned, our bowling has been very good. And at the same time, if you compare it with 50 overs it becomes a bit different. Because in 20 overs you know after one or two balls, batsman will want to go for a big shot, they will play aggressive cricket so you can play around with that.

can be overcome through collaborative actions based on common interest. "In this collaborative period which looks ahead, India will have to play a very vital role whether it is based on economic, social security or security of the sea links", said the Lt. Governor. He also threw light on the challenges of maritime commons, its impact on the Indian Ocean Region and the northern sea route, once it becomes operational.

Turning to the A&N Islands, the Lt Governor opined that A&N Islands, from being the strategic out post, will have to become the springboard for India's engagement with the Asia Pacific and South East Asia. The Lt Governor stated that to become this springboard, various important aspects such as communication, connectivity, development activities, economic activities, tourism and fisheries etc have to be improved in the Islands, from all corners. "Realizing this fact, the Administration has been making best efforts to put in place all the required facilities so that when time comes we are ready to take off", he added. The Lt Governor said that if North East is the land fulcrum of the India's Look East Policy, the A&N Islands are well positioned to act as maritime bridge for India's engagement with South East Asia and Asia Pacific.

The Lt Governor stated that with the great support of the Central Govt., during the last 20 months or so, under the guidance of the Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, the Administration has been able to carry forward various development activities in the Isles. "To spur the developments on a fast track mode, in the last one year, 12 to 14 Central Ministers visited the Isles to find out the need of the Islanders", he said.

The Lt. Governor also outlined the four centres of gravity viz. the strategic nature of the Islands, the people of Islands and their aspirations, the ecology & environment of the Islands and the original inhabitants; Particularly Vulnerable Tribes (PVTs) of the Islands. "If all these four centres live in harmony with each other,

nobody can stop the Islands from marching ahead", he added. Speaking about the various developments that have taken place in the Islands during the last one and half year, the Lt. Governor informed the gathering about the chartered flight services in Chennai Port Blair, Port Blair-Nicobar sectors that are already available, and the chartered flight in Port Blair-Kolkata sector, which will start from February 25. "Night landing by flights has been started and this is going to improve the communication & connectivity network further in these Islands", the Lt Governor said.

Opening of the Medical College, introduction of Medial Insurance Scheme, construction of two bridges on the ATR route connecting Port Blair and Diglipur, undersea cable project to improve connectivity are some of the major projects implemented/sanctioned during the period, he said.

The Lt Governor also mentioned that efforts are on to take tourism also to Diglipur, Baratang, Long Island, Hutbay and Campbell Bay. The construction of the two bridges and improvement in the ATR will help tourism grow further. The airstrip of ANC in Diglipur would be extended and an ATR aircraft of Air India would be permanently kept at Port Blair which will fly daily to Diglipur. Eco-tourism is also being promoted in Ross & Smith Island, he said.

In his address, the Chief of Staff, A&N Command, Maj. Gen. P.K.Siwach highlighted about the flash points on land and maritime affairs of A&N Islands and maritime sea route strategy. For developing A&N Islands as a spring board, economically and security wise, the joint structure of A&N Command needs to be strengthened, he added.

In his address, the Academic Coordinator, ISCS, Shri Deba R. Mohanty threw light on the significance of the seminar and the core topics viz. Maritime Security and economic aspects of the Indian Ocean & the strategic importance of A&N Islands, role of India in global maritime security, role of A&N Islands as a major strategic assets of the country, A&N Islands' untapped assets, its strength and weaknesses.

In his welcome address, the Secretary ISCS, Shri Arindam Mukherjee said that the seminar will highlight on the various aspects of geopolitics and security dimensions of the Indian Ocean Region and the larger role of India pertaining to maritime security in Indian Ocean.

In the first session, the resource persons spoke on the theme 'Changing contours of geopolitics and maritime affairs in the Indian ocean' and the second session threw light on 'Evolving strategic design: India as an inclusive power in the Indian ocean'.

The Seminar was also attended by senior officers of the Administration, officers from the Defence, lecturers and students of JNRM.

Out of the total 144 seats 115 seats will be reserved for Islanders while the rest 29 seats can be allotted to non-Islanders.

The ticket cost per passenger for one way between Kolkata and Port Blair:

- a) For Islanders on production of Islander card/ Local certificate and for employee of Central Govt./ PSUs/Defence personnel posted in A & N Islands on production of certificate issued by HoD/Head of office - Rs. 5000/- one way.
- b). Non-Islanders. - Rs.9000/- one way.

Tickets for outlying areas: The Islanders belonging to the Nicobar and N & M Andaman District may apply in the prescribed format to the respective Deputy Commissioner's Office.

Cancellation of Tickets: No refund will be allowed for cancellation of ticket (S), if there is no demand for the cancelled seat and it goes unoccupied due to cancellation. However, 20% cancellation charges will be recovered otherwise, a communication from the Dy. Director, Civil Aviation said.
