Chief Justice of Calcutta High Court inaugurates District Court Building at Mayabunder

"No citizen should be deprived of access to justice": Justice Manjula Chellur



Port Blair, Mar 19

The Chief Justice of Calcutta High Court, Justice (Dr.) Manjula Chellur inaugurated the District Court Building at Lucknow Village, Mayabunder, North & Middle Andaman, through a video-conference from High Court Annexe Building, Port Blair and simultaneously launched the 'Android CIS Mobile Application' of District Court. Justice Soumitra Pal, Judge, High Court at Calcutta & Judge In-charge, A&N Islands and Justice Shivakant Prasad Judge, High Court at Calcutta, presently presiding over the Circuit Bench at Port Blair, Secretary (Law), A&N Administration, Shri G.Theva Neethi Dhas,

Judicial Officers, Members of A&N Islands Bar Association and Officials from APWD were present during the function. In her inaugural address, the Chief Justice, Dr. Manjula Chellur said, with the inauguration of the District Court building at Lucknow Village, Mayabunder, her long pending visit to A&N Islands was fulfilled today. The Chief Justice lauded the efforts of Justice Soumitra Pal for getting the action plan properly implemented and appreciated the magnificent structure of the building which stands at Mayabunder. Hailing the support of the A&N Administration and the dynamic vision of

the Lt. Governor in taking the Islands forward, the Chief Justice said, "It is an achievement on the part of the Judiciary and also the A&N Administration", adding that the Islands, with its pristine beauty are on the world map and receive lot of tourists. Highlighting the topography of the A&N Islands, the Chief Justice acknowledged that the Islands are exposed to sensitive challenges, hence it is the duty of everyone to ensure that the Islanders have access to justice, while the flora, fauna and biodiversity of the areas are to be protected and maintained. "We must make all efforts to see that nothing valuable of our assets is

lost because the Islands are border country to so many countries and are vulnerable", said Justice Dr. Chellur adding that the peculiar problems pertaining to uninhabited Islands pose a challenge, as it may give rise to illegal activities, which is dangerous and harmful for the society. Speaking about Judiciary, the Chief Justice said that proper infrastructure and facilities for the smooth functioning of the Judiciary is important while the support of the police in maintaining law and order is equally necessary. The Chief Justice also suggested that a Circuit Bench of the High Court at Calcutta should also be established at Mayabunder. A regular

Additional District & Sessions Judge will also be posted at Mayabunder, once the facilities and infrastructure of the office are put into place; the Chief Justice informed and suggested that a full fledged Court should be made functional at Mayabunder while an Additional District Court at Campbell Bay should be established for the convenience of the people residing in the Nicobar group of Islands. Ministry of Road Transport & Highways accords approval for 21 minor bridges & culverts

Port Blair, Mar 19

Good news for the people of the A & N Islands. The Ministry of Road Transport & Highways has accorded in principle approval for 21 minor bridges/ culverts amounting to Rs.43.00 crores, to be taken up under CRF for connectivity to villages in various parts of Andaman & Nicobar Islands. The Ministry has further requested the A&N Administration to send a proposal for Administrative approval of the Ministry subject to certain conditions. Accordingly, the UT Administration shall ensure that encumbrance free land

for construction of minor bridges and culverts. Accrual per year for under CRF is about Rs.7.0 crore per year only, UT Administration shall give an undertaking that they will not claim amount more than the accrual amount for the Andaman & Nicobar Islands. In principle approval is accorded based on the approximate cost, however UT Administration shall work out the actual cost based on actual site conditions and get the Administrative Approval from the Ministry before tendering/ start of work.

In pursuant to that, the Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray, through this press note, has further requested the A & N Administration to ensure the above condition and to send a proposal for Administrative approval of the Ministry at the earliest. The Member of Parliament has expressed his heartfelt gratitude to Shri Nithin Gadkari, Hon'ble Minister of Road, Transport & Highways for approving the 21 minor bridges/ culverts, which was pending since long, a communication from the Office of the MP said here today.

The Directorate of Shipping Services has furnished clarification about the strike by the CDC holders here. In a press release received here today, the Director, Shipping Services has mentioned that the CDC holders on strike are basically demanding the following-

a) Seniority wise enrolment of unemployed CDC holders in Administration Company Roster.
 b) Local Crew should be engaged in Andaman Administration vessels MV Nicobar, MV Akbar, MV Harshavardhana.

concerned, the Directorate of Shipping Services has already taken up the matter with the SCI requesting them to employ local crew members from the existing roster maintained by the DSS. This is also being followed up at higher levels in the Administration with the SCI and Ministry of Shipping. As and when SCI concurrence is received these additional vacancies will be available for the local CDC holders. However, with regard to the first demand of the CDC holders it is clarified that the existing number of vacancies in the three rosters as of today stand at 216 and there are closing of government accounts. In a notification issued in Mumbai, RBI said that the government has desired that all government transactions with banks must be accounted for within the same financial year.

Improvement of data connectivity / broadband Augmentation of satellite connectivity to remote Islands on top priority: CGM

The CGM, A&N Telecom Circle, Shri R.N. Jha today shared the overall performance of A&N Telecom Circle for the Financial Year 2015-16 with the media. During a press conference here this evening, the CGM said that the performance of the Circle in the last one year has been quite satisfactory in terms of improvement of quality of services, financial parameters and also in terms of implementation of developmental activities, particularly satellite bandwidth augmentation to 1 Gbps.

informed the media that the direct IP based satellite bandwidth connectivity with Kolkata for the improvement of Internet services in Havelock has also been implemented and commissioned on 17th March 2016 before the target date of 31st March 2016 as announced on 2nd Jan 2016 by Hon'ble MoC & IT during his visit to A&N Islands.

He also mentioned that tripartite MoU for the execution of Tsunami Early Warning System has already been executed between INCOIS (Indian National Centre for Ocean Information and Services), A & N Administration and BSNL. Mr Jha said that the warning system will work as an emergency communication system and also like a Mass Notification System (MNS) to dissipate emergency information to everyone with the objective to help, prevent injuries and save lives during the natural calamities in the remote Islands which are more vulnerable areas. He said the right information, to the right people at the right time could be transmitted effectively using this Tsunami Early Warning System. He conveyed happiness that BSNL is a partner for implementation of such a noble life saving initiative of the Government being implemented in A&N Islands for the first time in India.

The CGM also shared with the media that A&N Telecom Circle rank high in terms of revenue per month per BTS, revenue per month per broadband user and also in terms of collection efficiency. The work for augmentation of satellite connectivity to remote Islands for the improvement of data connectivity / broadband is on the top priority of BSNL agenda and shall be achieved progressively by June 2016 as announced by Hon'ble MoC & IT on 2nd Jan 2016.

The procedure for selection of candidates to the three rosters is governed by the A&N Administration's Order No. 3399 dated 03/08/2005, which essentially stipulates that the aspiring candidates must undergo a written test of 85% marks followed by an interview of 15% marks. However, the CDC holders on strike are demanding that there should not be any examination or selection process and they should be included in the roster based upon their seniority in service with the DSS. This would mean that the first 216 in the seniority who have served in the DSS ships would automatically be selected and the balance candidates (about 150-180) would have no chance to get into the roster and will be left without any job opportunity.

The Director of Shipping Services has had a series of meetings with the CDC holders on strike emphasizing that a suitable mechanism which would provide equal opportunity/even play field for all aspirants must be worked at to be fair to all aspiring candidates. One of the mechanisms suggested by the DSS is to give suitable weightage to the seamen for the service they have rendered with the DSS in the selection process. That means, longer a seaman has served with the DSS, higher the weightage he will get and consequently more are his chances to be selected. The proposal further suggests to absorb directly a small number of seamen who have rendered very long periods of sea service (50 months or above) with DSS without any examination what so ever. This would leave adequate vacancies for the balance aspiring candidates to compete for and also provide opportunity for fresh local candidates to be able to make the mark in the Administration roster by working hard and doing well in the written examination. There is however no positive response from the CDC holders on strike in this regard so far. The demand of the CDC holders in its present form cannot be accepted as it is discriminatory against a faction of local CDC holders (freshers) as it would leave these candidates out of contention without even providing them with an opportunity to compete.

The seamen unions NUSI and FUSI are also involved in this issue and one of the suggestions by the union is to constitute an expert Committee to look into all aspects before a final decision is taken. The A&N Administration is in the process of constituting the expert Committee soon. The Directorate of Shipping Services, A&N Administration has requested all the CDC holders to cooperate in resolving the issue in an amicable, fair and transparent manner. The CDC holders on strike are requested to withdraw their strike and participate in the deliberations of the proposed expert Committee, so as to resolve their demand, the Director Shipping Services said in the release.
