Dinesh Karthik does it in style, India win Nidahas T20 tri-series

Colombo, Mar 19
Dinesh Karthik did a Javed Miandad with a last-ball six as India pulled off an incredible chase beating Bangladesh by four wickets in the Nidahas T20 Tri-series final, in Colombo Sunday night. Needing five off the final delivery, Karthik smashed Soumya Sarkar over extra-cover as a second-string Indian side held its nerve in a tense situation to chase down a target of 167 in 20 overs. It would count as one of India's famous last ball sixes -- something that Pakistani legend did against India 32 years back in Sharjah. Karthik's gem of a cameo got him 29 off 8 balls with two boundaries and three sixes -- the last of them which will be forever be etched in the memory. Skipper Rohit Sharma's (56 off 42 balls) dismissal set India's inexperienced middle-order in panic mode and Vijay Shankar's four dot balls off the 18th over by Mustafizur Rahman made it very difficult



for India. Karthik came at the start of the 19th over and hit Rubel Hossain for 22 including two sixes and two fours to bring down the equation to 12 off the final over before finishing it off in style. A partisan Sri Lankan crowd, who were upset by Bangladesh's behaviour did the now famous 'Nagin Dance' (Sbnake Dance) along with Indian supporters leaving the Tegers distraught. Rohit started with a lofted boundary over long-on off his opposite number Shakib. Young off-spinner Mehidy

Hasan Miraz then got a taste of what world class batsmanship is as he was hit for two huge sixes -- one over deep mid-wicket and other over long-on along with another boundary. Shikhar Dhawan (10) and Suresh Raina (0) were out in quick succession but the Indian captain was in his element as Bangladesh's ploy of using spinners in the Powerplay didn't prove to be as effective as India. Rohit hit left-arm spinner Nazmul Islam over mid-off for a boundary and then an inside out lofted shot over long-off fetched him a six.

Unseeded Osaka tops Kasatkina to win first WTA title

Wells, Mar 19
Unseeded Naomi Osaka became the first Japanese player to win the Indian Wells final, routing Russian Daria Kasatkina 6-3, 6-2 on Sunday for her first WTA Tour title. World number 44 Osaka rolled over Kasatkina, breaking her serve four times and winning the battle of the 20-year-old rising stars in just 70 minutes. "I just knew that she was going to fight for every point, too," said Osaka. "So I couldn't afford to lose points based on nerves, and I had to keep making the right decisions." Osaka captured the title on her first match point by blasting a backhand into the open side of the court. The Japanese dynamo improved to 13-4 on the



season two days after her biggest previous win, a dominating semi-final triumph over world number one Simona Halep. She was only the fourth unseeded player to reach the Indian Wells final, with the most recent before her being Kim Clijsters in 2005. The loss ends a brilliant run in

the California desert by Kasatkina, who was playing in her second final in a row after a runner-up finish in Dubai. "She was much better today than me, so she really deserved to win," Kasatkina said. "Of course, we were both nervous at the beginning, because the biggest finals so far.

Khade wins gold at the Singapore National Age Group Swimming C'ships

Singapore Mar 19
Young swimmer Viradhawal Khade, continued his winning streak with a gold medal in the 50 metres freestyle category at the 49th Singapore National Age Group Swimming Championships (SNAG). Competing against a host of international swimmers, Khade swam his season best timing of 23.02 seconds to win the gold. The 26-year-old had also bagged a silver medal in the

50 metres freestyle at the same event. "This was a good place to start. It always feels great winning for the country. Honestly, I expected a faster time, but I'll take this. There was a lot to learn from all the races in Singapore, and I know I can improve so much more in the coming months," Khade said. Talking about his preparations for the upcoming Commonwealth Games, the

Arjuna awardee said, "I have been training in Bangalore for five months now. Things have been on track and I have been swimming competitions to prepare myself for the Games." "My times have been good and improving consistently, and at this point I feel it is all about staying injury-free and doing what I have been doing in the past months, as it seems to be helping me get better," he added.

Del Potro outlasts Roger Federer to claim Indian Wells title

Wells, Mar 19
Former US Open champion Juan Martin Del Potro stunned top-ranked Roger Federer 6-4, 6-7 (8/10), 7-6 (7/2) Sunday to win his first Indian Wells title and second consecutive ATP crown. The 29-year-old from Argentina handed Federer his first match defeat of 2018 and extended his own win streak to 11 matches, including a title run earlier this month at Acapulco. "I'm still shaking," Del Potro said. "It's difficult to describe with words. It's like a dream." Del Potro, nagged by wrist injuries throughout his career, survived three match points before claiming the championship in a third-set tie-breaker, ending a two hour, 42 minute marathon contest. "I cannot believe I won this



tournament, beating Roger in a great final and this level of tennis. We played great tennis today," Del Potro said. "I just want to keep winning titles like this if I can." Del Potro won the first five points of the deciding tie-breaker then closed it out when Swiss superstar Federer, who had won a career-best 17

straight matches to start the year, smacked a forehand long. It was an emotional match for both players as each took turns questioning the chair umpire. Del Potro urged him to stop the pro-Federer crowd from making noise on his serve and an irritated Federer also had a couple of lively conversations with the umpire.

into operation while the remaining 11 Fish Landing Centers are at various stages of construction, some of which are nearing completion. "The construction of Fish Landing Centers would not only help upgrade the existing environmental condition of the areas but also improve the quality of life of the local population, particularly the poor fisher folks", said the Director Fisheries, Dr. Utpal Kumar Sar while speaking to 'The Daily Telegrams' here.

After the completion of the Fish Landing Centers, the Fisher folk can land their fish catch in organized manner, sorting & packing of the fishes in hygienic conditions, safe berthing of fishing boats and undertake repairing & construction of fishing boats, the Director remarked. This, he said will boost more fish catch, easy transportation and enhance the frequency of fishing fleet of the fishing boats. The Fishermen of the area who were mainly using traditional fishing boats have started improving their fishing boats with modern equipments so that they can undertake long voyage of fishing, said the Director adding that the socio-economic condition of the fishermen in the Isles will further improve with the implementation of the schemes meant for them, the Director added.
