ASSEMBLY ELECTION RESULTS 2016

BJP scripts history in Assam; Left wins Kerala; Jaya, Mamata retain power



New Delhi, May 19

West Bengal, Tamil Nadu, Assam, Kerala & Puducherry have given a decisive mandate. While it's been a clean sweep for TMC's Mamata Banerjee and AIADMK's J Jayalithaa in West Bengal and Tamil Nadu respectively, BJP has scripted history with the NDA alliance winning in Assam for the first time, ousting Tarun Gogoi-led Congress government. BJP has also opened its account in Kerala for the first time by winning one seat. BJP and its alliance partners have won a majority in the Assam state assembly elections. BJP has so far won 60 seats on its own in the 126 member house. Its ally AGP has won 13 seats while another ally BPF has won 11 seats. BJP has thus made history by winning an assembly election in any North-eastern state.

BJP Chief Ministerial candidate Shri Sarbananda Sonowal has won from Majuli seat, defeating his nearest

rival by more than 18000 votes. Chief Minister Shri Tarun Gogoi has won in Titabar, with a margin of over 15000 votes.

Shri Sarbananda Sonowal has asserted that BJP and its alliance parties will work together for development of the state. He thanked the people of Assam, especially Majuli, for having faith in him and electing him to power. Mr Sonowal said he will work hard to fulfill the aspirations of the people of the river island.

Election results show that people are supporting BJP's ideology of development: PM

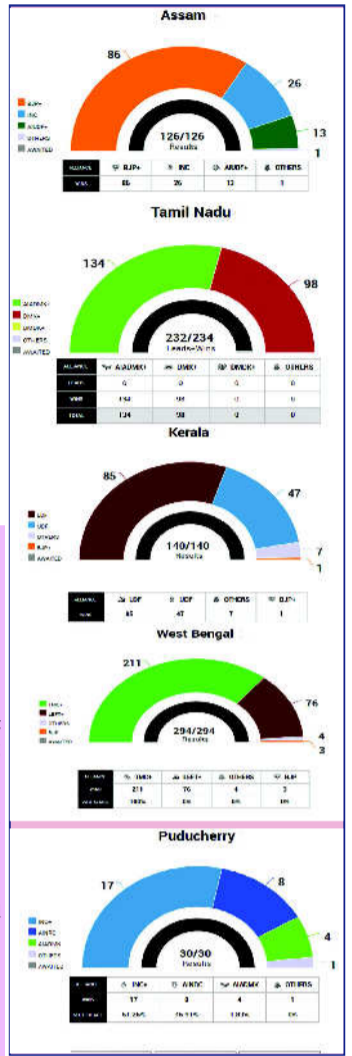
New Delhi, May 19

Mary Kom Sails Into Second Round of World Championships

Astana, May 19 Five-time champion MC Mary Kom began her campaign at the AIBA World Women's Boxing Championships in style by outpunching Sweden's Juliana Soderstrom in her opening bout here on Thursday. Mary Kom (51kg) defeated Soderstrom 3-0 in a thoroughly lopsided contest to set up a clash on Saturday with Germany's Azize Nimani, who stunned Asian Games bronze-medallist Nandintsetseg Myagmarulam of Mongolia.



In a clinical performance, Mary Kom outsmarted an opponent, who had the height and reach advantage. The 32-year-old Indian had worked hard on her reflexes ahead of the tournament and the efforts were there to be seen as she easily out-witted Soderstrom's attempts at attacking her. The Asian Games gold-medallist, who is eyeing not just a medal but also an Olympic berth in this event, used her left hooks to telling effect against Soderstrom, who failed miserably in capitalising on her

reach. In fact, the Swede looked clueless whenever Mary Kom mounted an attack. While Mary Kom was all precision in her punches, especially the right jabs, Soderstrom's swings were mostly off-target. Every attempt that the Swede made at attacking was blocked brilliantly by the swift-moving Manipuri. Even though Soderstrom did manage to make an impression in the fourth round, she had already lost the larger battle to her more experienced Indian rival.

Kohli hands Kings a royal thrashing

Bangalore, May 19 It seemed that rain had only delayed the inevitable at the M. Chinnaswamy Stadium on Wednesday. Virat Kohli (113, 50b, 12x4, 8x6) scored his customary century, Royal Challengers Bangalore ran up a total in excess of 200 — 211 to be precise — and yet another team, this time Kings XI Punjab, came under the bludgeoning willows of the home batsmen, all in a matter of 15 overs. Having threatened all day, rain came down in a torrent in the evening to push the start to 9.45 p.m. and reduce the match to a 15-overs-a-side affair. After the ground staff did a splendid job in getting the arena ready in less than an hour after the rain stopped, Kings sent RCB in, perhaps sensing an even chance in a curtailed match. At his magical best But not one trick of M. Vijay worked as Kohli, at his magical best, subjected the Kings bowlers to the most bruising of times. Axar Patel's shy at the stumps in the fourth over was



the closest Kings came to dismissing Kohli. After a quiet first three overs, off which only 17 runs came, Kohli and Chris Gayle (73, 32b, 4x4, 8x6) exploded like a volcano. The result was a 147-run opening stand in just 11 overs. So brutal was the hitting that at one point, nine consecutive scoring shots were all sixes. Gayle did his utmost to dispel the belief that his return to form in the last game was a flash in the pan. And he succeeded too. But never before has an innings of his been

Kohli had brought up his 50 while Gayle was still on 42. The skipper would go on to bring up his fourth century of the season in the 14th over. More than 90 per cent of Kohli's runs came in the 'V', with his lofted extra-cover drive being the sweetest among all. Spinner K.C. Cariappa, playing in his hometown, experienced the best of it — or rather the worst from his point of view. In all he gave away 55 runs in his three overs and Kohli hit 43 of them. With this knock, Kohli now has 4002 runs, the most in the history of IPL, surpassing Suresh Raina's total of 3985.

New Delhi, May 19 The closing ceremony of 27th India-Indonesian CORPAT (Coordinated Patrol) was held from 16-19 May 16. and leaders for the exceptional win in Assam. In a tweet, Shri Modi said, this win is a historic by all standards. He termed the victory as phenomenal. Outgoing Chief Minister, Shri Tarun Gogoi said he has accepted the verdict of the people. Talking to media in Guwahati, Shri Gogoi said winning and losing is a part of democracy and the political system. He said big victory with a big margin for BJP only means that people are expecting great things from the new government. In West Bengal, TMC has won 211 seats, well above the 50 per cent mark in the 294 member assembly. Congress-Left combine has taken 77 seats while BJP has bagged 6 seats. Independent and others have won four seats. Chief Minister, Ms. Mamata Banerjee has congratulated the people of West Bengal for supporting her party. She said, the development strategy her government adopted has paid back. She also appealed to the people to maintain peace. In Tamil Nadu, All India Anna DMK has touched the half way mark by winning 134 seats in the 232 member house. DMK and Congress has bagged 98 seats. IUMI has bagged one seat. The Prime Minister spoke to West Bengal Chief Minister Ms. Mamata Banerjee and Tamil Nadu Chief Minister Ms. Jayalalitha and congratulated them for the victory. In Kerala, the LDF has returned to power by winning 91 of the 140 seats, trouncing the ruling UDF which could bag only 47 seats. BJP has opened its account in the state by winning one seat. Eight results have gone in favour of others. In Puducherry, Congress has won 15 and its alliance partner DMK two seats giving it a majority in the 30-member house to form a government. AINRC has bagged 8 seats and AIADMK has won 4 seats while one seat has gone to Independent. The BJP has said, the poll results of all the five Assembly elections reflect that the people of these states have acknowledged the work done by Shri Narendra Modi-led NDA government. Briefing reporters in New Delhi, BJP President, Shri Amit Shah said that his party has performed well in the Assembly polls in Assam, West Bengal, Tamil Nadu, Kerala and Puducherry. He termed it as the victory of positive politics over negative campaign.
