## Lt. Governor attends meeting on Coastal Security at Mumbai

Port Blair, June 19

The Ministry of Home Affairs organized a very productive meeting of Home Ministers, Chief Secretaries and DGPs of Coastal States and Union Territories, under the Chairmanship of the Union Home Minister, Shri Rajnath Singh in Mumbai on 16th June, 2016. The meeting was held to review the progress made in strengthening Coastal Security and to take feedback from the concerned Coastal States and Union Territories. The meeting was also attended by Chief Minister of Maharashtra Shri Devendra Fadnis, Minister of State (Home) Shri Kiren Rijiju, Union

Home Secretary, Secretary (Border Management), officers from Coast Guard and Navy. Union Home Minister conducted indepth review on Coastal Security, State Maritime Board status in the States and UTs, security of non major ports and single mooring points, coastal mapping, distribution of biometric cards to fishermen, colour coding of boats and monitoring of fish landing points. The Lt. Governor, A&N Islands, Lt Gen A. K. Singh led the team along with Chief Secretary In-charge,

Shri Raajiv Yaduvanshi and IGP Shri Narendra Singh Bundela from A&N Islands. The Lt. Governor apprised the delegates about the importance of Andaman and Nicobar Islands and mentioned that A & N Islands are strategically located in the Bay of Bengal which comprises of 572 group of Islands spread over a vast length. The A & N Islands has a vast coast line of 1962 Km comprising more than 25% of coastline of the Country. The importance of the Islands can also be gauged by the fact that it

only has 0.2% of India's landmass but holds 30% of Exclusive Economic Zone of the Country. The sheer fact that Andaman & Nicobar Islands are located closer to Myanmar, Thailand, Indonesia as compared to nearest Indian Ports of Chennai (1190 Km), Vizag (1200 Km) and Kolkata (1255 Km), it continues to play important and strategic role in coastal security. Hence, it is extremely important to have all response capabilities to be available locally in Andaman & Nicobar

Islands as time taken for reinforcement and backup from mainland will be high and A&N Islands can be a soft target for international mischief.

He also acknowledged the progress made in Coastal Security in A&N Islands resulting in decline in poaching activities from 482 poachers caught in 2010 to only 21 in 2015. The Lt. Governor also stressed that A&N Administration is planning to construct one Jetty at Interview Island to have more presence of

In the first semi-final, hosts United States will take on Argentina on Wednesday. The second semi-final will be played on Thursday between Colombia and Chile. The Final is slated for the 27th of this month.

forces on the western coast. He also stressed the importance of tri command in ensuring security. A joint coordinated approach between Tri Command, Coast Guard and Police is required for table top exercises and mock drills in such remote Islands to strengthen preparedness for tackling external threats. The recent efforts taken by Coast Guard to save crew members from a sinking boat Al Safina were very much appreciated. The Lt. Governor also suggested use of technology like CCTV in fish landing points to tighten Coastal Security. Also, Fisheries Department has been directed to compile and update all the mobile numbers of fishermen so that INCOIS can also SMS details or areas having fish for commercial catching. Under the guidance of the Lt. Governor, Police Marine Force has started taking men having experience in boat operation from coastal areas in Home Guard. The Lt. Governor highlighted the need for Special Forces to man the remote LOPs which are presently being manned by police. The Ministry of Home Affairs has appreciated the efforts taken by A&N Administration in strengthening the Coastal Security and assured that it is committed to provide all assistance to fish the Islands.

**ANIPMT exam- 2016 on June 26; Director ANIIMS issues instructions for candidates**

Port Blair, June 19  
The Andaman Nicobar Islands Pre-Medical Entrance Test-2016 (ANIPMT) for candidates seeking admission in the Andaman & Nicobar Islands Institute of Medical Science (ANIIMS) in the Islands will be held on June 26, 2016. Altogether, 888 candidates will take the ANIPMT-2016 exam which will be held in two centers i.e Model School and Kendriya Vidyalaya No.1 at Port Blair. As per the instructions issued by the Director ANIIMS Maj. Gen. R.P. Choubey (Retd.), the candidates have to report at their respective Examination Centres sharp at 9 am on June 26, 2016. The dress of the candidates should be light colour, half sleeves, no head cover, no big buttons, no large earings, headpins and broach. Candidates have been asked to cooperate while frisking at the entry gate. Candidates have been asked not to carry any valuables, as they will be asked to leave it outside at their own risk. Accordingly, bell at 9.30 am will signify the entry of the candidates in the allotted hall/room while bell at 9.45 am will signify seating at their respective desk in allotted hall/room. The exam will start sharp at 10 AM. Bell would be played at 11.30 am (halfway and again 10 minutes before completion) and 12.50 pm. Candidates will be asked to stop writing at the final bell sharp at 1 PM. Further, the candidates have been advised not to carry any stationary items like pen, pencil, textual materials (printed or hand written), bits of paper, watch, wallet, purse, belt, water bottles, calculators, electronic devices like cell phones, blue tooth, etc. Candidates have to show admit card to the invigilator when asked for. Use only black ball pen which will be provided at the Exam hall for answering the OMR sheet. The candidates should check all pages for intactness and ensure OMR Sheet is enclosed on receipt of Question booklet. In case of discrepancy, the candidates should immediately inform the Invigilator. Ensure correct entry of Index Number in the OMR sheet both numerically and by shading and rounding appropriate circles. Sign with date in the space provided. Enter the OMR Serial Number, sign the Attendance sheet and affix your left thumb impression on the Attendance Sheet when presented. The candidates will not be permitted to leave the examination hall till completion of the examination. Candidature is liable to be rejected in case the candidates are found using unfair means or talking or helping their fellow examinees. The candidates have been asked not to write name or anything in the Question booklet or OMR sheet which may be construed as attempt to disclose their identity. Do not write or disfigure the booklet. Rough work may be done in the blank pages provided in the booklet. On completion of the Exam, the candidate should return both, the Question set with OMR sheet. The candidates have been advised to retain the Admit Card in original as the same would be required during counselling. When called for counselling, they must bring a photo ID proof, all original certificates/bond along with a Xerox copy of each and the Admit Card in original.
