Govt to hold talks with all parties on GST Bill & seek consensus for its passage: PM

New Delhi, Jul 19 Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has said, the government will talk to all parties on Goods and Services Tax (GST) Bill and will seek a consensus for its passage. Shri Modi said this at the BJP Parliamentary Party Executive meeting held in New Delhi last evening. Talking to media after the meeting, Information and Broadcasting Minister Shri M Venkaiah Naidu said, the



Prime Minister explained the importance of GST bill and the need to pass it at the earliest. Shri Naidu said, all constituents of NDA

are supporting the bill and they have said that as and when the bill is taken up,

they will extend their support. Earlier in the day, talking to media outside Parliament ahead of the commencement of the Monsoon session, Shri Modi invited opposition parties for a constructive debate on all issues on the floor of the two Houses. He said, all parties should work together in the session to take the country forward.

PM expresses grief over loss of CRPF personnel in Bihar

Bihar, July 19 Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has expressed grief on the loss of ten CRPF commandos who were killed in an encounter with Maoists in Sondaha forest area near Gaya - Aurangabad areas last night. In a tweet, the Prime Minister's Office said, Shri Modi extended his condolences to the families of the martyred CRPF personnel. He also prayed for the speedy recovery of the injured.

Parl. passes Regional Centre for Biotechnology Bill

New Delhi, Jul 19 Parliament has passed the Regional Centre for Biotechnology Bill, 2016 with the Rajya Sabha approving it yesterday. The bill seeks to establish a Regional Centre for Biotechnology, an institution of education, training and research, under the auspices of United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) in the National Capital Region.

Coast Guard brings suspicious Myanmar boat to Port Blair for investigation

Port Blair, July 19 The suspicious boat with 11 Myanmar crew, which was apprehended by Coast Guard on July 18 near the Narcondum Island was today brought to Port Blair and handed over to police for further investigation by law enforcement agencies. The boat was found under suspicious circumstances by Coast Guard patrol ships Bhikaji Cama and

Rajkamal in Andaman Sea, nine miles East of the Narcondum Island. On challenge by Coast Guard patrol ships, the boat started fleeing and crew of the boat could be seen dumping some items into the sea. The boat surrendered only after Coast Guard ships fired warning shots, after a chase of about two hours.



While checking the boat, the Coast Guard found that the boat was not having any name or registration number written on hull and was not flying any country's flag. A large quantity of fuel and water was found stored in 40-50

Port Blair, July 19 The State President of BJP, A&N Islands, Shri Vishal Jolly, in a letter addressed to the Lt. Governor, A&N Islands, a copy of which has been released to the press has requested for establishing Radiation Unit with requisite machinery for radiation therapy for cancer patients at GB Pant Hospital. Shri Jolly mentioned that the Andaman & Nicobar Institute of Medical

Science (ANIMS) has already posted Oncologist in the GB. Pant Hospital for treatment of cancer patients but the cases which need radiation therapy are being referred to mainland hospitals for treatment & radiation therapy. They are forced to stay at Chennai/ Kolkata etc. for months for the said therapy, at time for a prolonged period. Thereby the patient & attendants are to incur heavy

expenditure for the treatment.

The State President also stated that the people of A&N Islands are thankful and grateful to the Lt. Governor for setting up the Dialysis Unit which is already functioning in the GB. Pant Hospital for the patients who need Dialysis frequently and the same is functioning upto the satisfaction of the kidney affected patients, a communication said.

Mumbai, July 19 The Indian Olympic Association (IOA) yesterday organised an official send-off event for the Indian athletes participating in the Rio Games beginning 5th of next month. Tennis star Sania Mirza, wrestlers Vinesh Phogat, Sakshi Malik and Vinod Tomar, gymnast Dipa Karmakar and young table tennis star Manika Batra were among those who attended the ceremony. Actor Salman Khan and music composer AR Rahman, the Goodwill Ambassadors of the Indian contingent for the Games, met the Indian athletes at an event. India will be fielding over 100 athletes at the Games this time.

India in West Indies: Virat Kohli-Led Team Must Win Big To Not Lose Points

Dubai, July 19 Top-ranked Australia and second-ranked India will have to complete comprehensive wins in their upcoming away Test series against Sri Lanka and the West Indies, respectively, to not lose crucial points in the ICC team rankings. The West Indies will host India in a four-Test series starting in Antigua on Thursday while Australia will go head to head with Sri Lanka in Pallekele from 26 July in a three-Test series. India are ahead of eighth-ranked the West Indies by 44 points and Australia lead seventh-ranked Sri Lanka by 33 points, and because the rankings are weighted to reflect this difference, India and Australia's failure to win their series convincingly will mean they will drop points. India will have to defeat the West Indies by a margin of 3-0 or better to stay at 112 points. Even a 3-1 or 2-0 win for India will see it slip to 110 points. On the other hand, a 3-1 or 2-0 win by the West Indies will see them rise to 79 points with India dropping below the 100-point mark to 98. Similarly, Australia will have to win 2-0 or better against seventh-ranked Sri Lanka to ensure they don't go below the current 118 points. In contrast, even Sri Lanka's 1-0 win over Australia will earn them seven points and move to 92 while Steve Smith's side will slip to 111 points. With England and Pakistan already involved in a four-Test series in England, major shake-up on top of the Test table is on the cards depending how the three series pan out.

On arrival at Port Blair, Inspector General Kuldeep Singh Sheoran, PTM, TM, Commander Coast Guard Region A&N visited the vessel and interacted with the crew of Coast Guard ship Bhikaji Cama. He appreciated the efforts and alertness of CG personnel involved in the operation. Later, Police team from Central Crime station, Port Blair took custody of the boat and crew for further joint interrogation by all security and intelligence agencies. There have been earlier instances, when vessels involved in human trafficking and arms smuggling were apprehended by Coast Guard in Andaman Sea. In September 2013, Coast Guard ship Akkadevi apprehended 04 Thai and 01 Bangladeshi gun runners from a vessel in North Andaman sea. In addition, hundreds of poachers and illegal immigrant from neighboring countries Myanmar, Bangladesh, Indonesia and Thailand have been apprehended by Coast Guard and Police during last five years, a CG communication said here today.
