26th National Under-25 Chess C' ship concludes National level championships will attract more youth towards sports: Lt Governor

Port Blair, July 19
The Lt. Governor, A&N Islands, Prof Jagdish Mukhi gave away prizes to the winners and runners up of the 26th National Under- 25 Chess Championship held at JNRM auditorium today. International Master Kumar Shyaamnikhil P from Tamil Nadu emerged winner of the championship. Shyaam won the title and championship overtaking Mitrabha Guha of West Bengal in the tie-breaker. The Andaman Nicobar Chess Association, under the aegis of All India Chess Federation (AICF) hosted the event for the first time in these Islands. The PBMC Chairperson, Shri B Eswar Rao and senior officers of the A&N Administration were also present on the occasion.

Addressing the gathering as the chief guest of the valedictory function, the Lt Governor lauded the President ANCA and other members for efficiently conducting the National Chess Championship at Port Blair. "It was a great occasion not only for the ANCA but also for the entire Islands to organize the championship and host master chess players from mainland", the Lt Governor observed. Such national level championships encourage youth to participate in sports, he said.

The Lt Governor further stated that the game of



chess is believed to have originated in India about 1400 years ago and spread to various places in the world. Often chess is known as the game of intellectuals, the Lt Governor said, adding that chess is a great game for the development of mind and also helps achieve better concentration.

Mentioning that for the first time a national level chess championship was organized in the Isles, the Lt Governor said, with the development of the game

here in the Isles, more participants will get attracted to it. He said that the record participation of 122 players from different parts of the Country in these Islands could be possible also due to good venue and environment here, attracting more players. He said the efforts of ANCA will certainly motivate the young talents and the youth of these Islands will also get attracted towards this sport.

Addressing the young

players from mainland, the Lt Governor enlightened them about the A&N Islands, its natural beauty, people and tourism. The Lt Governor stated that these Islands are known as Mini India as people from different parts of the country live here with perfect peace and harmony. The A&N Islands is the live example of secularism, said the Lt Governor, adding that the 'Swach Bharath Mission', launched by our Hon'ble Prime Minister, Shri

Narendra Modiji has been adopted well and cleanliness is maintained all over the Islands. Under the Tourism Sector, water sports activities have been added and new water sports will be made available. Mentioning that the Administration accords priority to Tourism Development in the Isles, the Lt Governor said that tourist arrival in the year 2016 stood at 4 lakh mark in comparison to 3 lakh tourists visiting the Islands in the year 2015. It is expected that the tourist flow will touch 5 lakh mark in 2017, he added. The increase in the arrival of tourists has been possible due to the affordable air

Goods and Services Tax Manufacturers, packers & importers of pre-packaged commodities advised

Consumers can lodge complaint over toll free no. 18003453197

Port Blair, July 19
On implementation of Goods and Services Tax Act, 2017, w.e.f 1st July 2017, the Government of India has allowed the manufacturers or packers or importers of pre-packaged commodities to declare the change in retail sale price (MRP) on the unsold stock manufactured/ packed/ imported prior to 1st July 2017 after inclusion of the increase amount of tax due to GST if any, in addition to the existing retail sale price (MRP), by way of stamping or putting sticker or online printing, as the case may be.

In a press release received here today, the Asst. Controller, (LM), Directorate of Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs, has clarified that for reducing the Maximum Retail Price (MRP), a sticker

with the revised lower MRP (inclusive of all taxes) may be affixed and the same shall not cover the MRP declaration made by the manufacturer or the packer, as the case may be on the label of the package.

Use of unexhausted

packing material/ wrapper has also been allowed upto 30th September 2017 after making the necessary corrections.

Selling the packaged commodities beyond MRP is a violation of the provisions contained in the

Legal Metrology (Packaged Commodities) Rules, 2011 framed under the Legal Metrology Act, 2009 & stringent legal action, as deemed fit, shall be initiated against the violators.

India to take on Australia in semi-final of ICC Women's World Cup today

Derby, Jul 19
Confident Indian women will aim to turn the tables when they will take on six-time champions Australia in the second semi-final of the ICC Women's World Cup in Derby, England tomorrow. India have a poor record against Australia, having lost 34 out of 42 games the two teams have played so far. But come tomorrow, the Mithali Raj-led Indian team will be aiming to end the losing streak against Australia. A win tomorrow will ensure India's entry into the summit



clash against the host England at the Lord's, only for the second time in the history of the tournament. India played the final of the World Cup only once in 2005 edition in South Africa, where they lost to Australia. The match will also provide the Indians a chance to avenge their morale-shattering eight-wicket loss to Australia in the round-robin stage just a week ago in Bristol.

Commonwealth Youth Games: Indian Jr judokas win gold, three bronze medals

Bahamas, Jul 19
Indian junior judokas won a gold and three bronze medals in the ongoing Commonwealth Youth Games being held in Nassau, Bahamas. Soni from Haryana won the gold medal in the below 73Kg Weight Category, after beating Nikolic Uros of Australia in the final bout, while Ashish won a bronze in the below 60Kg weight category, defeating Zain

Prosser Harry of England in bronze medal bout. Antim Yadav of Madhya Pradesh won a bronze in the below 48Kg weight category, surpassing Russell Jasmine of Bahamas in Repechage bout. Manipur's Rebina Devi Chanam also won a bronze medal in the below 57Kg Weight category after getting the better of Saskia of Australia. The Organising Committee of

the Games that would conclude on July 24th had allowed the participation of only four weight categories Judo players (2 Boys & 2 Girls) from each country, and all the Indians won medals. Recently, three Indian woman judokas had won bronze in their respective categories at the recently-concluded Asian Junior Judo Championships in Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan.

Ashwin slips to third position in latest ICC Player Rankings for Test bowlers

Dubai, Jul 19
India spinner Ravichandran Ashwin slipped a place to take the third position in the latest ICC Player Rankings for Test bowlers today. Sri Lanka spinner Rangana Herath has climbed to second position after grabbing his eighth 10-wicket match haul and helping win the one-off Test against Zimbabwe. The 39-year-old Herath, who is the most successful left-arm spinner in Tests with a tally of 384 wickets in 81 matches, finished with a match haul of 11 for 249 in Colombo to move up a list in which England's James Anderson and Australia's Josh Hazlewood are the highest ranked pace bowlers in joint-fourth position.



In the ICC Player Rankings for Test Batsmen, Hashim Amlia is back in the top 10, having gained six places to reach 7th position, while Zimbabwe batsman Craig Ervine up 20 places to 40th and Sikandar Raza, up 28 places to 48th, have attained career-best positions after knocking up centuries against Sri Lanka.

Kumar Shyaamnikhil P from Tamil Nadu got Rs 50,000 as first prize, Mitrabha Guha of West Bengal got Rs 30,000, Grahes Y of Andhra Pradesh got Rs 20,000, Mohite Ranveer of Maharashtra got Rs 16,000 and Badrinath S of Pondicherry got Rs 14,000. Apart from this, 20 players received cash prizes ranging from Rs 12,000 to minimum upto Rs 5000. Three best players of A&N Islands Kumar Dhan Raju, Vishal Kanna and Sai Sagar got Rs 5000, 3000 and 2000 respectively. Shri Abhijit Agarwal, Vice President ANCA who moderated the function, also proposed the vote of thanks.

Current speeds vary between 61 - 85 cm/sec. Similar high waves have also been forecasted along the west coast of Nicobar Islands between Ten Degree Channel and Great Channel. Current speeds vary between 78 - 103 cm/sec. Under the influence of moderate to strong Southwest monsoon current, strong southwesterly wind speed between 25 and 35 kmph gusting to 45 km per hour and generally rough seas likely along and off Andaman and Nicobar coast. Fishermen have been advised to be
