1st ODI between India and Sri Lanka to be played at Dambula today

Dambula, Aug 19 The opening One-Day International of the five-match series between India and Sri Lanka will be played at Dambula tomorrow. The encounter to be held at the Rangiri Dambulla International Stadium, is slated to begin at 2.30 pm IST. India will be led by Virat Kohli, and Sri Lanka by Upul Tharanga. The Men in Blue, who won the recent three-Test series against the hosts by a comfortable 3-0 margin, will be looking to take that momentum into the limited-overs' leg of the tour as well. For Sri Lanka, the ODI series is more than just a matter of saving face after their heavy



losses in the Test series. The hosts need two more ODI wins to confirm their spot in the 2019 ODI World Cup by way of automatic qualification. If they do manage this feat against India in the upcoming series, they will move to 90 points and then West Indies will not be able to overtake

them even if they win all the six ODIs against Ireland and England, taking their points from 78 to 88 at best, before the September 30 deadline. India blanked Sri Lanka 5-0 the last time the two sides played a bilateral ODI series, back in November 2015, in India.

Nick Kyrgios beats new World No.1 Rafael Nadal to reach Cincinnati Masters semi-finals

Cincinnati, Aug 19 Australia's Nick Kyrgios pulled off a stunner to upset incoming World No. 1 Rafael Nadal 6-2 7-5 in the round of 32 of the Cincinnati Masters on Saturday. Rafael Nadal took hold of the numero uno spot in the ATP World Rankings after Roger Federer had announced his withdrawal from the Western and Southern Open owing to back injury which he incurred during the Montreal Open final. With Andy Murray already recovering from a hip injury, the Spaniard was guaranteed of the top spot for the first time since 2014. However, the Aussie



youngster set an upset over the 31-year-old ergo scripting his 100th victory at ATP Tour. Courtesy to an astounding double break, Nick had taken a 4-0 lead in the first set, a sure sign that he is back to form. Nadal did pull off a fightback in the second set roaring with a 2-1 start. But Nick shifted back

the momentum on him cheeky volleys and ravishing groudstrokes. For a moment hope returned for the Spaniard as he drew it at 5-5 breaking the Canberran for the first time in the match, but the Aussie didn't hold things back as he finished things off for Nadal at 7-5 in the second set.

UN chief urges protection for civilians trapped in conflicts

New York, Aug 19 UN Secretary-General Mr Antonio Guterres has urged people everywhere to protect the millions of civilians trapped in conflicts around the world who are routinely being killed in direct and indiscriminate attacks. He told a UN event on the eve of World Humanitarian Day that protecting civilians, humanitarian workers and healthcare staff is required under international law, yet in war zones all over the

world, parties to conflict are flouting their obligations. UN humanitarian chief Stephen O'Brien said that since the General Assembly designated World Humanitarian Day in 2008 many thousands of aid workers have been killed in direct or indirect attacks. Last year, he said, 288 aid workers were targeted in 158 attacks.

India's forex reserves increases by 163.8 m US Dollars

New Delhi, Aug 19 India's foreign exchange reserves have increased by 163.8 million US Dollars to touch a new lifetime high of 393.612 billion dollars in the week ended 11th August 2017. An RBI release said foreign currency assets, a major part of the overall reserves rose by 175.6 million Dollars to 369.899 billion dollars. In the previous week, the reserves had increased by 581.1 million dollars to 393.448 billion dollars.
