IDFC Bank inaugurated

Banking sector undergoing major transformation : PM

New Delhi, Oct 19

The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, today said that the banking sector is poised to achieve a big boost in growth in rural areas. He said this would be similar to the growth achieved by the telecom sector some years ago. The Prime Minister was speaking at the launch of the IDFC Bank in New Delhi.

The Prime Minister complimented IDFC for its successful journey of 18 years so far, and said that it was now embarking on a more challenging role, as it expands into banking, especially in the rural areas. He said that from helping to build infrastructure, the organization is now progressing to building lives (jeevan-nirmaan).

The Prime Minister said the entire banking sector is undergoing major transformation with the

advent of latest technology, and the future of banking would not just be premises-less and paper-less, but also, eventually, currency-less, and this would help curb black money.

The Prime Minister described the banking sector reforms being undertaken by the Union Government, especially in areas such as senior appointments, creation of a bank board bureau, re-capitalization of banks, de-stressing of assets, empowering bank



management through zero-interference, creation of a framework of accountability through Key Performance Indicators, and reform of governance of banks. Union Minister for Finance Shri Arun Jaitley, and Union Minister of State for Finance, Shri Jayant Sinha were present on the occasion.

Blood banks now can borrow units from one another in case of shortage

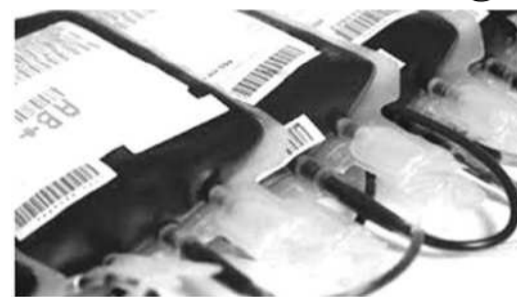
New Delhi, Oct 19

In a major modification to the National Blood Policy, blood banks will now be able to borrow units from one another in case of a shortage.

The Union Health Ministry has taken this decision as part of reforms to the handling of blood units in the country.

A shortage of blood units has been a recurring problem since the Supreme Court, on January 1, 1998, banned paid donation.

According to the Central Drug Standard Control Organisation (CDSCO), India has 2,760 licensed blood banks. The National and State Blood Transfusion



Councils were established in the 1990s to promote voluntary donations. On the recommendation of the National Blood Transfusion Council, the Ministry has identified two major initiatives towards better utilisation of blood and blood

components. The Ministry has fixed the exchange value of plasma per litre at 1600 rupees and the blood banks with surplus plasma can exchange it for consumables, equipments or plasma derived products, as per their need. (Contd. on last page)

A&N Islands Scheme for Health Insurance (ANISHI) 232 patients from Isles avail cashless treatment at empanelled hospitals in mainland

Port Blair, Oct. 19

More than 232 patients from the Islands have availed free treatment under the Health Insurance Scheme named Andaman and Nicobar Islands Scheme for Health Insurance (ANISHI) so far. ANISHI was officially launched by the Lt. Governor on January 26, 2015 with a view to provide better medical facilities for the needy citizens and their family members residing in these Islands.

This scheme is applicable

for patients belonging to BPL category of A&N Islands, pensioners settled in A&N Islands after retirement and their dependent family members and permanent residents with family income of less than Rs.3 lakhs per annum. Patients belonging to these categories can avail free treatment for various services, procedures and investigations required in connection with the medical treatment upto Rs. 5 lakhs per patients per illness in one of the empanelled Hospitals

in Islands/ mainland when referred by specialists of GB Pant Hospital, Port Blair.

As per the referral system as specified under the scheme, patient is to be referred by concerned specialist, thereafter they have to report with referral slip to the Nodal Cell (ANISHI), Directorate of Health Services along with the Islanders ID/Voter card, annual income certificate and ration card, as the case may be.

In case of mainland, the treatment is applicable and

restricted to those hospitals / nursing homes / clinics, located in towns and cities which are directly accessible by air or ship i.e. Kolkata, Chennai, Vizag and places which are easily accessible to these town and cities.

So far, five hospitals are empanelled under the ANISHI Scheme namely Medica Super Specialty Hospital, Kolkata, JIPMER, Pondicherry-(Multi Specialty Hospital), Peerless Hospitex Hospital and Research Centre (Contd. on last page)

When the Supreme Court banned paid donation, the government was mandated, under the National Blood Policy (2002), to phase out replacement donation in five years. However, since few people donate blood regularly, hospitals ask family members of patients to donate blood so as to pre-emptively replace the blood withdrawn from the blood bank.

Health Ministry's this new decision is expected to increase the availability of essential life saving medicines like human albumin, immunoglobulins and clotting factors which are all derived from plasma.

This step would also reduce the country's dependence on import of these products.
