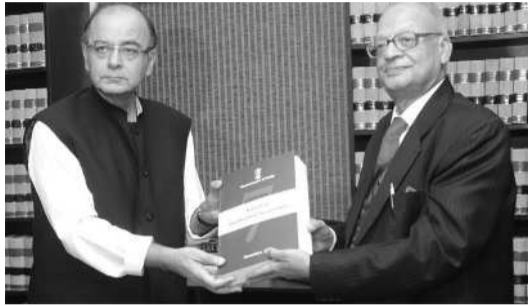

Bonanza for central govt employees

7th Pay Commission submits report, proposes 23.55% hike in salaries

New Delhi, Nov 19
 7th Central Pay Commission has recommended 23.55 hike in pay and allowances of government employees. Minimum basic pay of 18 thousand and maximum of Rs 2.5 lakh per month have been suggested by the Commission. Talking to reporters after submitting the report to Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley in New Delhi this evening, the Commission Chairperson Justice AK Mathur said the pay revision will come into effect from January next year.



He said the Commission has also recommended abolition of grade pay and pay band structure. He said the rate of annual increment for employees will be three percent. Under the recommendation, the pay will go up by 16 percent, allowances by 63 percent and pension by 24 percent.

The commission has also recommended increase in military service pay besides revised pension formula for civil employees including Central Armed Police Forces and Defense Personnel retiring before 1st January 2016. It also recommended abolition of 52 allowances and introduction of a Health Insurance Scheme. Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley said that the pay revision will impact 47 lakh serving employee and 52 lakh pensioners. He said it will cost public exchequer over one lakh crore rupees annually.

Key features of Seventh Pay Commission report:

- Suggests 23.55% hike in pay and allowances of govt employees.
- Pay will go up by 16%; increase in allowances will be 63%; increase in pension will be 24%.
- Minimum basic pay for central govt staff recommended at Rs 18,000; maximum pay Rs 2.25 lakh per month.
- Pay Commission recommends 3% annual increment and 24% hike in pension for central government staffers.
- Pay Commission report has to be implemented from January 1, 2016.
- FY17 impact seen at Rs 1.02 lakh crore from implementation of the 7th Pay Commission.
- One Rank One Pension recommended for central govt staffers as well as armed forces.

Plight of engineering staff of ZP highlighted

 During recent tour of Shri Bishnu Pada Ray, Member of Parliament to North and Middle Andaman from Nov. 14 to 16, the Junior Engineer, Surveyor and the Draftsman working in the Panchayat Raj Institutions interacted with him and expressed that the Management of Zilla Parishad has conducted selection process and appointed 41-Junior Engineer, 7-Surveyors and 3-Draftsman on regular

basis in the month of July, 2002, but their appointments have not been confirmed even after lapse of more than 13 years of continuous service. Due to such lapse, the engineering staffs of Zilla Parishad are deprived of the benefit of MACP as admissible to them as per the recommendation of 6th C.P.C. implemented from 01.01.2006. Hiring of fishing vessels, boats for non-fishing purpose is illegal

Port Blair, Nov. 19
 All the Masters, Owners, Traders, Fishers and Crews of registered and licensed Fishing vessels / boats have been informed that hiring out of fishing vessels / boats for any non-fishing purpose such as tourism, transportation, stevedoring etc. is not permitted under Fishery rules and is an offence. Hiring of fishing boats will attract cancellation of Fishing licence in accordance with the rules in force vide term and condition no. 2 (v) of the licence. The licence to fish is granted to a fishing vessel / boat only to

engage itself in the act of fishing. Further, all the fishing vessels / boats operating from Port Blair Harbour are required to follow the fishing lane specified in the Andaman & Nicobar Gazette Notification no. 1089/PMB/Vol. II dated January 23, 2012 to avoid any navigational problem. The specified fishing lane falls on the right of Port Blair harbour while entering near to North Bay, Hopetown, Panighat, Bambooflat, Dundas Point to Junglighat, a communication from the Asst. Director of Fisheries, SA said.

The Ministry said, it will cover all the remaining urban areas in the country and is to be completed by 31st of next month.

Deborah's career-best time fetches silver; Indians win six medals

New Delhi, Nov 19

Deborah lived up to her growing reputation of being the best cyclist the country. On Wednesday, this 20-year-old may have fallen just short of defending the 500m Time Trial title won last November in the Track Asian Cup here at the Yamuna Velodrome but clocked her career-best time for an improved National record on way to the silver medal.

Though Indians won two gold medals in the junior girls' section in a haul of six that included three silvers and a bronze, Deborah's performance in time trial was clearly the best for the host.

Right through this year, this Andaman girl has been clocking in the range of 36-37 seconds. But on this day, she clocked her first sub 36-second time after Korea's Kim Wong Yeong had put 35.179 on the board.

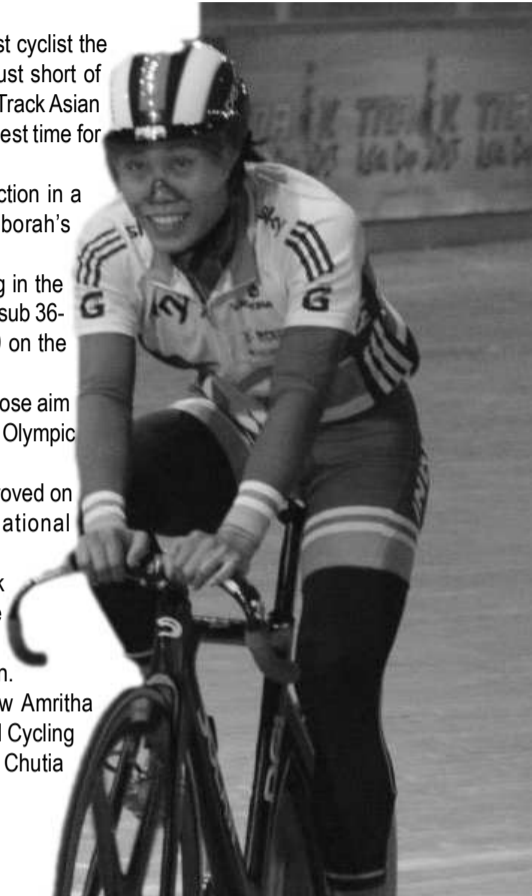
"I am confident of going under 33 seconds," said Deborah whose aim is to be able to "clock 30 seconds in four years, before the next Olympic Games." The world record in the event is 32.794 seconds.

Deborah's previous best — the National record that she improved on this day — stood at 36.643 clocked in this year's National championship.

Last month, she clocked 37.054 in Track Asia Cup in Bangkok and 36.996 in the Taiwan Track International Classic to settle for silver medals.

Like India, two gold medals also went to Korea and Uzbekistan.

But lack of competition in the junior women category saw Amritha Reghunathan, representing Sports Authority of India National Cycling Academy (SAINCA), get the better of official home entry Anu Chutia to give the host a 1-2 finish.

Nawaz Sharif wants cricket between India, Pakistan

Islamabad, Nov 19
Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif wants cricket between Pakistan and India despite prevailing tensions between the two neighbours, a close aide of the prime minister has said.

Sharif is an ardent fan of cricket. Vetoing a series between the two countries can never be a desired decision for him, The Nation quoted the aide as saying on Tuesday. "The decision to bind Pakistan Cricket Board to seek permission for series with India is because there are no positive signals from India. Shiv Sena is promoting hatred and Sharif is concerned about the players' safety," said the prime ministerial aide.

He said Sharif was a strong advocate of Pakistan-India cricket like millions of fans on

both sides of the border. Sharif was hoping for improved ties with India where cricket could be taken as a sport not war, he said. "Yes, there are political tensions but we never wanted this. Sport should be taken as a sport. We hope we will be able to solve this issue," he added.

India play out 2-2 draw against Australia in first hockey Test

New Delhi, Nov 19

India conceded the goal in dying minutes of the match to play out a 2-2 draw against Australia in the first hockey Test of the three-match series in Rajnandgaon on Thursday. This series is the preparation for Hockey World League (HWL) Final that will be held in Raipur from November 27 to December 6.

Bangkok marathon error makes runners go extra miles

Bangkok, Nov 19
Organisers of a Bangkok run have apologised after they miscalculated the distance of a half-marathon, forcing runners to cover several extra kilometres (miles) though the sweltering city.

Participants wearing pedometers realised they had covered 27.6 kilometres (17 miles) instead of the standard 21.1 kilometres in Sunday's early morning race.

"Our staff mistakenly marked a U-turn onto the course which added around six kilometres to the route," said Songkram Kraisonthi of co-organisers the National Jogging Association of

Thailand (NJAT) and Amazing Field.

"We admit our mistake and have apologised. Our staff worked hard but they were confused," he said.

By way of compensation, runners will receive a special finisher shirt in recognition of the extra distance travelled, he added.

But the offer was not enough to dampen anger among runners who pilloried the organisers on NJAT's official Facebook page. "Will I recover from my leg ache when I wear the shirt you are sending?" said Thai Facebook user Poonwanat Peem.

Usain Bolt favourite to win IAAF's 2015 World Athlete of the Year award

New Delhi, Nov 19

Jamaican super-athlete Usain Bolt, along with two Americans - decathlete Ashton Eaton and triple jumper Christian Taylor were confirmed as the finalists for the 2015 World Athlete of the Year award. The International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF) announced the names of the three finalists for the prestigious award on Wednesday. In the women's section, Genzebe Dibaba, Dafne Schippers and Anita Wlodarczyk were nominated for the prize. The 29-year-old Jamaican sprinter retained his 100m, 200m and 4x100m titles at the world championships in Beijing in August. He has won the award five times previously, in 2008, 2009, 2011, 2012 and 2013. He

was beaten in 2010 by David Rudisha and in 2014 by Renaud Lavillenie.

Eaton, 27, won his second successive gold medal at the World Championships, setting a decathlon world record of 9045. Within his series, the US athlete set a world decathlon best of 45.00 for 400m. Taylor, 25, won the triple jump title in Beijing with a North American record of 18.21m, the second-best jump in history. The US jumper also won the Diamond Race title in his event. Genzebe Dibaba, Dafne Schippers and Anita Wlodarczyk in the women's section, Ethiopia's Dibaba will compete with flying Dutchwoman Schippers and Polish hammer thrower Wlodarczyk.

due to non-availability of any specific transfer policy in Zilla Parishad, they are suffering lot either due to frequent transfer or long delay in transfer or for no transfer even after rendering considerable period of service in each station.

It was further alleged that despite of facts their appointment were in the year of 2002 and they are entitled for GPF scheme and also for the old pension scheme, but, they have been placed under the new EPF contribution and new pension scheme.

Considering the logistic and legitimate demands of the employees, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray has requested the Hon'ble Lt. Governor, A & N Islands to intervene in the matter and to redress the grievances of the Engineering staff of the Zilla Parishad, a communication from MP Bhawan said.
