

## Conservation & Development of Indigenous Cattle Deptt. of AH&VS urges farmers to avoid indiscriminate breeding of cattle

Port Blair, Jan 19  
As part of National programme to conserve and enhance productivity of India's indigenous cattle breed, the Departmental Cattle Holding Farm at Dollygunj has taken up the mission of production of indigenous cattle (Gir breed) through performing Artificial Insemination in the existing stock of cross breed cattle.



Gir cows are robust, resilient and found to be suited to the Islands' climate and environment. They are endowed with qualities of heat tolerance, resistance to diseases and the ability to thrive under extreme climatic stress and less than optimal nutrition. Due to constraint in

resources, presently the farm is maintaining limited stock and the Department of AH&VS is providing facilities of artificial insemination in cattle with selected Indigenous cow germplasm for the benefit of dairy farmers. Hence, cattle rearing farmers have been requested to avoid

indiscriminate breeding of their cattle and adopt artificial insemination by contacting the nearest Veterinary Institutions to upgrade the non-descript breed available with them, a communication from the Senior Veterinary Officer, Cattle Holding Farm, Dept. of AH & VS said.

**Bajrang Punia, Ravi Kumar claim gold medals in Rome Ranking Series**

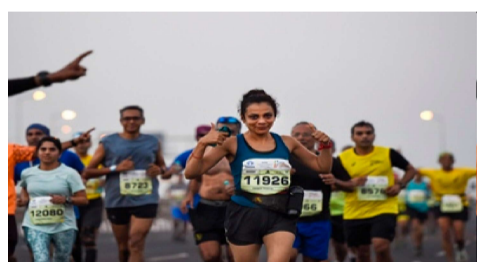
Rome, Jan 19  
India's star wrestlers Bajrang Punia and Ravi Kumar Dahiya kicked off the Olympic year in style, winning a gold medal each in their respective weight categories at the Rome Ranking Series here. The 25-year-old Bajrang staged a remarkable comeback to secure a 4-3 win against USA's Jordan Michael Oliver in the summit showdown of the 65kg freestyle category. Ravi, who competed in the 61kg category instead of his regular 57kg, also bagged gold after getting the better of Kazakhstan's Nurbolat Abdullayev 12-2 in his final bout late on Saturday night. The 23-year-old from Sonapat



had made the final round after securing impressive wins over Moldova's Alexaandru Chirtocaa and Kazakhstan's Nurislam Sanayev. Up against one of India's biggest medal prospects in the Tokyo Olympics, Oliver conceded that it was not his night against Bajrang. The American lauded the competitive spirit of Bajrang.

"Wasn't my night... but I got a lot of work to do to be where I want to be! Hats off to @BajrangPunia dude is heck of a competitor! Until next time my friend," the American tweeted. Bajrang had to sweat it out in the first round against Zain Allen Retherford of the USA before prevailing 5-4. In the quarterfinal, the ace Indian wrestler went past another American Joseph Christopher Mc Kenna 4-2, before getting the better of Vasyil Shuptar of Ukraine 6-4 in the semi-finals. However, it was curtains for Jitender in the 74kg and world championship silver medalist Deepak Punia in the 86kg category.

Gurjant Singh (1st), Mandeep Singh (34th) and Man-of-the-Match Lalit Upadhyay (36th) scored a goal each, while Jip Janssen (14th) and Jeroen Hertzberger (28th) scored for the visitors at the Kalinga Stadium here. The Indian forwards were backed by a defence which performed brilliantly, letting the Netherlands score only once from nine penalty corners. First rusher Amit Rohidas was impeccable in thwarting Dutch chances with goalkeeper PR Sreejesh keeping the ball out when Rohidas missed. World No 5 India, on the other hand, converted two of their seven penalty corners.

Reid passed his first real test against a top team with flying colours as Manpreet Singh's men bagged three points in the 2020 edition opener. Lincoln, Jan 19  
Prithvi Shaw scored 150 in just 100 deliveries to help India A post a gigantic 372 on the board in the second warm-up match against New Zealand XI in Lincoln on Sunday. Batting at a phenomenal strike rate of 150, the Mumbai batsman smashed 22 boundaries and two sixes in his innings. Shaw's innings finally came to an end in the first ball of the 35th over when Kiwi seamer Zak Gibson picked up his wicket. Apart from the 20-year-old, Vijay Shankar also completed his half-century, before he was trapped leg before by Daryl Mitchell on 58(41). India were eventually bowled out in the 50th over, with Ishan Porel being the last man to be dismissed on 2. In response, the hosts got off to a



dreadful start as Ishan Porel sent opener Katene Clarke packing on 1 in his first over. He struck again in the sixth over of the Kiwi innings, reducing the hosts to 27/2. However, opener Jack Boyle and Finn Allen brought the Kiwi chase back on track as the pair added 144 runs for the third wicket. After playing an important knock of 87 from 65 deliveries, the latter was trapped LBW by all-rounder Krunal Pandya. Meanwhile, Boyle also completed his century and stitched an 88-run stand for the fourth wicket with skipper Mitchell. The opener was eventually dismissed on 130 by Krunal but the hosts kept fighting till the end. However, in the end, they fell short by 12 runs after running out of overs. For India, right-arm medium pacer Porel (2/39) and Krunal (2/50) grabbed two wickets each.

**RBI asks issuers to provide facility to switch on, off cards to prevent frauds**

New Delhi, Jan 19  
Reserve Bank has asked banks and other card-issuing companies to provide facility to customers to switch on and off their debit or credit cards, a move aimed at enhancing security for digital transactions.



The RBI said that at the time of issue or re-issue, all cards (physical and virtual) should be enabled for use only at contact based points of usage ATMs and Point of Sale (PoS) devices within India. The RBI further said that for existing cards, issuers may take a decision, based on their risk perception, whether to disable the card not present (domestic and international) transactions, card present (international) transactions and contactless transaction rights.
