## 316 free glasses provided to school children under NPCB

Port Blair, Dec. 19 School Eye Screening is one of the important components of National Programme for Control of Blindness (NPCB). It is estimated that 20% of children have problems with their eye sight affecting their participation and learning at school. To reduce the blindness due to refractive error, screening of school children are being carryout regularly throughout the Island by the Ophthalmic Assistants of respective area. During the FY 2016-2017, a total of 17051 (9946 in South Andaman District, 3393 in N&M Andaman District & 3712 in Nicobar District) students were screened, of which 924 refractive errors cases (730 in South Andaman District, 60 in N&M Andaman District & 134 in Nicobar District) detected and free glasses provided to 316 needy students (302 students of South Andaman District, 12 students of N&M Andaman District and 2 students of Nicobar District, a communication from the JS (NPCB)/DD (Ophth) said.

## Govt writes to States, UTs to implement SC's order on national anthem

New Delhi, Dec 19 Government has written to States and Union territories for necessary action on Supreme Court's order regarding National Anthem of India. Home Ministry has asked Chief Secretaries of all the States to take necessary action in this regard. Earlier, the Supreme Court had ordered all the cinema halls in the country to play the National Anthem before the start of the feature film. All present in the hall are obliged to stand up to show respect to the National Anthem. It said, the entry and exit doors shall remain closed prior to the National Anthem is played or sung in the

cinema hall, so that no disturbance is created. After the Anthem is played or sung, the doors can be opened. When the National Anthem shall be played in cinema halls, it shall be with the National Flag on the screen. The

courts had said, there shall be no commercial exploitation to give financial advantage or any kind of benefit. There shall also be no dramatization of the Anthem and it should not be included as a part of any variety show. Supreme

Court had said, National Anthem or a part of it shall not be printed on any object and also never be displayed in such a manner at such places which may be disgraceful to its status and tantamount to disrespect.

## Old notes worth over Rs 5000 can only be deposited once per account till Dec 30

New Delhi, Dec 19

The Reserve Bank today imposed stiff restrictions on depositing more than 5,000 rupees in the scrapped 500 and 1,000 rupees notes. The bank said, it can be deposited only once per account till December 30th, that too after explaining to bank officials the reasons for not having done that so far.

RBI said that defunct currency up to any amount can be deposited under the new black money amnesty Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana scheme, PMGKY. Under the PMGKY scheme, black money holders can deposit unaccounted cash in account which will be subject to 50 per cent tax and 4-year interest free lock-in for the remaining 25 per cent of the amount.

The central bank said that now-defunct notes in excess of 5,000 rupees shall be credited to only KYC (Know Your Customer) compliant accounts.

## Health Care Facility providers advised to dispose bio-medical waste safely

Port Blair, Dec. 19

The general public and the Health Care Facilities (HCFs) of Andaman & Nicobar Islands have been informed that the Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change has notified the Bio-medical Wastes Management Rules, 2016, in the Gazette of India, vide G.S.R. 343(E) dated 28/03/2016, in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 6, 8 and 25 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 (29 of 1986), and in

supersession of the Bio-Medical Waste (Management and Handling) Rules, 1998.

These rules shall apply to all persons who generate, collect receive, store transport, treat, dispose, or handle Bio-Medical Waste in any form including hospitals nursing homes, clinics, dispensaries, veterinary institutions, animal houses, pathological laboratories, blood banks, Ayush hospitals, Clinical Establishments, research or

educational institutions, health camps, medical or surgical camps vaccination camps, blood donation camps, first aid rooms of schools, forensic laboratories and research labs. For detail provision of the BMW Rules, 2016 visit

## DLTFC meeting on PMEGP under DIC today

Port Blair, Dec. 19

The District Level Task Force Committee (DLTFC) on Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP), pertains to District Industries Centre, Department of Industries, will be held under the Chairmanship of the Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman at the Conference Hall of District Office on 20th December, 2016 at 12.30 pm.

Any individual, above 18 years of age are eligible under the scheme. There will be no income ceiling for assistance for setting up projects under PMEGP. For setting up of project costing above Rs.10 lakh in the manufacturing sector and above Rs.5 lakh in the business/service sector, the beneficiaries should possess at least VIII standard pass educational qualification. The financial assistance is available only for new projects under the scheme.

The beneficiaries' contribution in the project cost are 10% for the general category and 5% for the special category including ST, OBC, women, ex-servicemen, physically handicapped etc. The rates of subsidy of the project cost are 15% for the general category and 25% for the special category in Urban area. Whereas, 25% for the general category and 35% for the special category in Rural area. The maximum cost of the project/unit admissible under manufacturing

India v England, 5th Test, Day 4

# Karun Nair's triple ton puts India in command against England



Chennai, Dec 19  
Karun Nair cracked a brilliant triple century as India took total control against England in Chennai on Monday, posting their highest-ever Test score.

Right-hander Nair, who finished on 303 not out, reached the landmark with a boundary before India declared their first innings on a huge 759-7 for a lead of 282 in the fifth and final Test. England ended the day on 12 without loss, with skipper Alastair Cook (three) and Keaton Jennings (nine) at the crease, and a day's play still to survive to secure a draw.

The day belonged to 25-year-old Nair, who had previously never scored a century for India but batted through three sessions to frustrate England's bowlers on a flat pitch. Nair was playing in just the third Test match of his career. He recorded his maiden century in the morning session before expertly converting it into a double and then a triple in the evening.

He became only the third batsman to convert a maiden Test hundred into a triple century, joining the elite company of West Indies' Garry Sobers (365 not out) and Australia's Bob Simpson (311). Nair's knock came off 381 balls and was laced with 32 fours and four sixes. He reached the feat with a cut shot off Adil Rashid and raised his helmet to a standing ovation. The triple ton came a day after teammate Lokesh Rahul missed 200 by a single run after getting out to Rashid on 199 in the final moments of play on Sunday. Nair, who started the day on 71, shared three hundred-plus partnerships with Rahul, Ravichandran Ashwin (67) and then Ravindra Jadeja (51).

## Karun Nair becomes first Indian cricketer to convert maiden Test century into a triple hundred

Chennai, Dec 19  
Indian Test batsman Karun Nair on Monday entered history books as he became the first Indian cricketer to convert his maiden Test ton into a triple century. Resuming from his overnight score of 71, Nair went on to hit one of the finest knocks in the history of Test cricket. The moment came in the 191st over, where batting on 299, he played a cut shot against Adil Rashid past covers to reach the feat with a boundary. Virat

Kohli declared the innings the moment Nair crossed the 300-run mark. Nair remained unbeaten on 303 runs and his knock was studded with 32 boundaries and four sixes. The capacity crowd at MA Chidambaram Stadium in Chepauk witnessed one of the

best knocks in Test cricket by an Indian batsman. With the brilliant knock, Nair became the only second Indian cricketer after Virender Sehwag to score a triple century in Test cricket. Sehwag has two centuries to his name.

New Delhi, Dec 19  
Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi in a tweet message has congratulated cricketer Karun Nair for his triple century against England and termed it as historic saying the country is delighted and proud of his remarkable feat. Karun Nair has become the second Indian player after Virender Sehwag to hit triple century in test cricket.

His 181-run sixth-wicket partnership with Ashwin stood out as India registered their highest-ever innings score of 759, surpassing their 726 against Sri Lanka in December 2009.

Earlier in the day debutant England all-rounder Liam Dawson, who ended with two scalps, got his first Test wicket with his left-arm spin.

Dawson, who scored an unbeaten 66 in England's first innings, pinned Murali Vijay in front of his stumps and he was given out lbw. India have already secured the series with a 3-0 lead.
