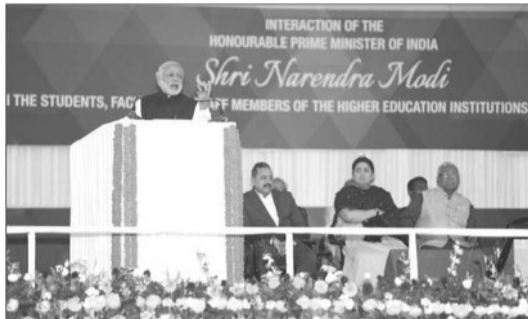

Guwahati, Jan 19
 Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi today said India is among the fastest growing economies in the world. Preliminary survey of vulnerable areas complete

Census operation to estimate population of salt water crocodile on Jan 30-31

Port Blair, Jan 19
 The Department of Environment & Forests, Andaman & Nicobar Islands has decided to conduct a census operation to estimate the population of salt water crocodile in the coastal waters of Andaman & Nicobar Islands. Population estimation studies will give an idea about the density, the areas in which they inhabit, size

classes viz. yearlings, juvenile, sub-adult, adult and also their sex ratio including breeding females. It is proposed to conduct the census operation on 30th-31st January 2016, when both day and night count will be done. In this connection a preliminary survey of all the vulnerable areas of the territory was made during 2014-15. Based on the

preliminary survey, the following creeks/nallahs have been identified for carrying out the census. South Andaman - Tushnabad nallah, Manpur nallah, Collinpur, Tirur, Jirkatang, Wright Myo, Shoalbay nallah, Chouldari, Sippighat, Beodnabad nallah, North Bay, Lohabarrack Sanctuary, all areas in Mahatma Gandhi Marine National Park, (Contd. on last page)

Govt extends time for contribution to APY subscribers till March

New Delhi, Jan 19
 The Government has decided to extend its contribution to subscribers of Atal Pension Yojana, APY up to 31st of March this year. Under the scheme Central Government's contribution of 50 percent of the subscriber's contribution upto Rs 1,000 per annum,

was available to each subscriber, who join APY before 31st of December 2015 for a period of 5 years. The Government took this decision in view of public demand to extend the timeline. This measure is likely to benefit substantial number of people who have not been able to join APY

and therefore have failed to avail the benefit of co-contribution of the Government. The scheme was launched on 1st of June 2015 to address the longevity risks among the workers in unorganised sector and to encourage them to voluntarily save for their retirement.

Promising improvements in maternal, child health and nutrition: NFHS survey

New Delhi, Jan 19
 Results of the first phase of the National Family Health Survey, 2015-16 show promising improvements in maternal and child health and nutrition. Union Health Ministry said, the survey in 13 States and two Union Territories indicate that fewer children are dying in infancy and early childhood. The Survey covered Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Goa,

Haryana, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Meghalaya, Sikkim, Tamil Nadu, Telangana, Tripura, Uttarakhand, West Bengal and Andaman and Nicobar Islands and Puduchery. All these States have rates below 51 deaths per one thousand live births. The Ministry said, better care for women during pregnancy and childbirth (Contd. on last page)

World's oldest man, Yasutaro Koide dies at 112

Tokyo, Jan 19
 The world's oldest man, Yasutaro Koide, died today at the age of 112 in central Japan. Koide who born just months before the Wright brothers made their first successful flight, died of heart failure and pneumonia in the central Japanese city of Nagoya, said the city official. Asked about the key to

longevity, Koide had reportedly said, the best thing to do is avoid overwork and live with joy. According to the Guinness World Records website, the world's oldest person is American Susannah Mushatt Jones who is 116 and was born on July 6, 1899.

as provided in IS-14904:2007; or IS5238:2001; or IS 5236:1982, as the case may be, as amended from time to time and the transporter or consigner of the livestock shall follow the code of practice laid down in the respective specification regarding the transport of the livestock.

Apart from this, subject to sub-rule (1), the motor vehicles for carrying animals shall have permanent partitions in the body of the vehicle so that the animals are carried individually in each partition where the size of the partition shall not be less than viz. Cows and Buffalos (2 Sq.mtrs.), Horses and Mares(2.25 mtrs.), Sheep and goats (0.3 Sq.mtrs.), Pig (0.6 Sq.mtrs.) and Poultry (40 cm sq.).

No Motor vehicles meant for carrying animals shall be permitted to carry any other goods, a communication from the Registering Authority, A & N Administration said.
