

PM calls for coordination among central, state governments

New Delhi, Jan 20
Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has expressed concern over the functioning of government's departments in isolation and stressed on coordination among the departments of Central and State governments. He was delivering the inaugural address on a three-day National Conference of Central and State Ministers and Secretaries of Tourism, Culture and Sports at Kutch in Gujarat today through video-conferencing. The Prime Minister asked the participants to share their best practices to solve the outstanding problems. He asked the Departments to chalk out a blue-print to channelize the youth power for the betterment of the country and the world. He said, digital movement

in the nation is going on and the youth are at the core of this. He said, the youth have also given strength to Swachh Bharat Mission. The Prime Minister called for an institutional arrangement to enable excellence in sports as every government wants

to popularise sports. The Prime Minister said, India has a lot more in sports than just cricket for which there is a need to map sports persons at District level to identify talents. He said a conducive environment is very important for sports and

First flight under UDAN scheme to take off in February 2017

New Delhi, Jan 20
The first flight is likely to take off next month under the government's ambitious regional connectivity scheme-UDAN. The scheme UDAN (Ude Desh Ke Aam Naagrik), seeks to boost regional air connectivity and provides various incentives to airlines. The fare for a one hour journey of approximately 500 kilometre on a fixed wing aircraft or for

a 30 minute journey on a helicopter will be capped at two thousand 500 rupees under the scheme. Addressing a press conference in New Delhi, Minister of state for Civil Aviation Shri Jayant Sinha said, Airports Authority of India has received 45 initial proposals from 11 bidders covering more than 190 routes under the scheme. He said, there are 75 operational airports in the

country at present and 43 new airports will be added after the implementation of UDAN scheme. The scheme was launched in October last year, which seeks to provide connectivity to un-served and under-served regions through revival of existing air strips and airports. The Minister said, the scheme is likely to give a major boost to tourism activities and employment generation in hinterland.

Australian Open Tennis: Sania Mirza & Barbora Strycova advance into 3rd round of Women's doubles category

Melbourne, Jan 20
In Australian Open Tennis, Sania Mirza and her partner Barbora Strycova advanced into the third round of the Women's doubles category. The fourth seed Indo-Czech pair defeated Aussie-China team of Samantha Stosur and Shuai Zhang 6-1,6-4 in the second round.

In another match, India's Rohan Bopanna and his new partner Pablo Cuevas of Uruguay were knocked out of the men's doubles. 15th seeds Bopanna and Cuevas lost to Australia's Alex Bolt and Bradley Mousley 6-2, 6-7, 4-6 in the second round of the season's first Grand Slam. Their exit puts an end to the Indian challenge in the men's doubles, after Leander Paes and partner Andre Sa of Brazil, as well as the all-Indian team of Purav Raja and Divij Sharan, crashed out in the first round yesterday. In Women's singles, World No.1 Angelique Kerber sailed into the fourth round. The German defeated Kristyna Pliskova of Czech Republic in straight sets 6-0, 6-4. Kerber will meet CoCo Vandeweghe on Sunday. In another match, American CoCo Vandeweghe ousted Canada's Eugenie Bouchard 6-4, 3-6, 7-5 to save

a fourth-round berth. Eighth seed Svetlana Kuznetsova cruised into the fourth round of the Women's singles after defeating former World No 1 Jelena Jankovic 6-4, 5-7, 9-7. The Russian will face her country mate 24th seed Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova for a place in quarterfinals. Pavlyuchenkova outplayed 11th seed Elina Svitolina 7-5,4-6,6-3. In the Mixed Doubles category, the top seeded American duo of Bethanie Mattek-Sands and

Mike Bryan sailed into the second round after defeating Australia pair of Arina Rodionova and John-Patrick Smith 6-4, 4-6. Earlier, in the biggest upset of the Australian open, defending Champion and World No.2 Novak Djokovic of Serbia bowed out of the Grand Slam. The 14-times grand slam champion Rafael Nadal stormed into the third round of the Australian Open defeating Marcos Baghdatis of Cyprus 6-3, 6-1, 6-3.
