### Anandiben Patel to be next MP Governor

New Delhi, Jan 20  
Former Gujarat CM Smti Anandiben Patel will be the next Governor of Madhya Pradesh. Rashtrapati Bhavan announced her appointment in a tweet yesterday evening. Currently, Gujarat Governor Shri OP Kohli is holding the additional charge of Madhya Pradesh Governor.

### Govt announces names of nine more smart cities

New Delhi, Jan 20  
Urban Development Minister Shri Hardeep Singh Puri yesterday announced the name of nine more smart cities, taking the total to 99. Silvassa in Union Territory of Dadra and Nagar Haveli has topped the list of winning cities in this round of competition. The other cities include Erode in Tamil Nadu, Diu in Union Territory of Daman and Diu, Biharsharif in Bihar, Bareilly, Saharanpur and Moradabad in Uttar Pradesh, Itanagar in Arunachal Pradesh and Kavaratti in Lakshadweep.

### Rural sanitation coverage reaches up to 76%

Gurugram, Jan 20  
The rural sanitation coverage has reached up to 76 per cent from 39 per cent in October 2014 when the Swachh Bharat Mission was launched. Secretary in the Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation Shri Parameswaran Iyer said this at a workshop on Swachh Bharat Mission at Gurugram in Haryana. He said, three lakh villages, 300 districts and 10 States and Union Territories have been declared Open Defecation Free so far. He expressed confidence that with the sustained implementation, the Prime Minister's vision of a Swachh Bharat by 2nd of October 2019 would be realized.

### TRAI recommends allowing mobile, Internet services during air travel

New Delhi, Jan 20  
Telecom Regulatory Authority of India has recommended allowing mobile and Internet services for passengers during air travel in the country through both satellite and terrestrial network. In its recommendation, the authority said, Internet and Mobile Communication on Aircraft service should be permitted as In-Flight Connectivity in the Indian airspace. The Department of Telecom had sought views of the TRAI in August last year over the proposal to introduce voice, data and video services over Indian airspace for domestic, international and overflying flights.

## Milk vendors warned against selling adulterated milk Samples of milk tested; 14 penalized

Port Blair, Jan 20

A special drive to ascertain the quality of milk was conducted between December 12 & 15, 2017 in South Andaman District. Altogether, 41 milk vendors were inspected. During inspection some milk vendors were found violating the provisions of Food Safety & Standards Act, 2006, Rules & Regulations, 2011. Among them 14 milk vendors were found contravening various of the said Act and all those 14 milk vendors were penalized and a sum



of Rs 47000/- was realized as penalty. Samples of milk were also collected and tested in the Food Testing Laboratory. As per the test report, 24 milk vendors were found selling substandard milk adulterated with water and in few cases the added water was found up to 48%. The Commissioner, Food Safety has warned the milk vendors to refrain from such activities and not to (Contd. on last page)

India will play the final on Sunday against Belgium, who beat Japan 4-1. It was India's young brigade Harmanpreet Singh (2), Dilpreet Singh (12) and Mandeep Singh (47) who scored after the team had suffered a 0-2 loss against Belgium in their previous match. India's mantra was to play aggressive and that's exactly what they did right from the start.
