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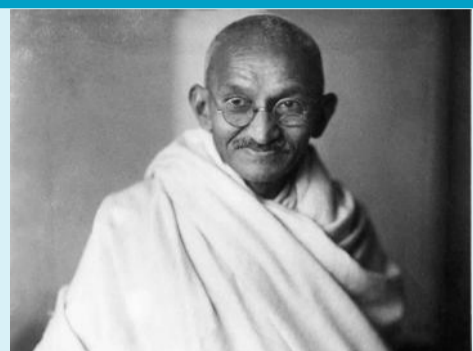

National Water Mission District Administration initiates water conservation campaign with tagline 'Catch the rain, where it falls, when it falls'

Port Blair, Oct. 1
 The District Administration has started the campaign 'Catch The Rain' with the tagline 'Catch the rain, where it falls, when it falls' under the National Water Mission. Under this campaign, a workshop was conducted on Rain Water Harvesting Structures (RWHS) in the presence of Shri Lakshay Singhal, AC (UT) along with Pradhan, District officials and Civil Society Organization members in Bambooflat. The objective of the workshop was to rope in key stakeholders to create appropriate RWHS suitable to the local climatic conditions and sub-soil strata before the onset of monsoon.
 As a part of this campaign, drives to make check dams, water harvesting pits, rooftop RWHS etc; and de-silting of tanks/ponds to increase their storage capacity; removal of obstructions in the channels which bring water from the catchment areas etc.; repairing of step-wells and using defunct borewells and unused wells to put water back to aquifers etc. are to be taken up with the active participation of public at large.
 The AC (UT) further informed that efforts are being made so that all buildings in the district should have rooftop RWHS and that maximum quantity of rain water falling in any compound should be impounded within the compound itself. The basic aim should be that 'No or only limited water should flow out of the compound'. This will help in improving soil moisture and raising ground water table.

Android PoS terminals to replace paper/manual challans for collection of spot fines & other user charges
 Port Blair, Oct. 1
 As part of Digital India Mission and to provide ease of access to services, the Port Blair Municipal Council has launched eChallan system which will become operational from tomorrow (Oct. 2). PBMC in association with its technology and banking partner Axis Bank launched the Android Point of Sale (POS) terminals which will replace paper/manual challans for collection of spot fines, water tanker payments, penalties, and other user charges.
 With the launching of this facility, Port Blair Municipal Council will do away with the system of paper/manual challans. All citizens have been requested not to accept manual/paper water tanker services receipts in case of etc. of PBMC. Citizens will be collector, sanitary issued receipts inspectors, and staff generated from these collecting payments for

Guidelines for Durga Puja celebration notified

Port Blair, Oct. 1 This year, Durga Puja is being organised and celebrated amidst the pandemic. The celebration calls for ensuring proper and adequate health safety measures for the citizens. Puja Committees must ensure the health and safety norms for themselves and for the participants and visitors. In pursuance of the discussion and the resolutions in the Coordination Meeting of the District Administration authorities with Durga Puja organisers/ club representatives recently in the conference hall of Deputy Commissioner Office, South Andaman, guidelines have been notified for information and necessary action. Accordingly, it has been decided that pandals shall have to be spacious and should be kept open from all sides. Pandals must keep adequate space and arrangements for ensuring physical distancing in terms of the existing COVID-19 protocols. There should be separate entry and exit arrangements with separate gates. Floor markings such as circles and other signages should be made on entry and exit routes and assembly points to ensure compliance of physical distancing norms. Compulsory thermal screening should be done and hand sanitizer kept at entry points. Use of masks shall be compulsory for all visitors visiting the pandals. Use and availability of foot based/contactless hand sanitizer should be made compulsory in the pandal premises and neighbourhood. Distribution of cut fruits and community feast is not allowed. Priests should use microphones to utter the mantra so that the sound reaches worshipers standing even far away and people do not have to assemble closely in small spaces. Cultural programme in / near the Puja pandal premises shall not be allowed. Award Judging Programmes are not allowed. Live streaming of Puja shall be compulsory. Electronic and social media should be used by the organisers and public authorities to make people aware to avoid large assembly and crowding on roads and near pandals. Inaugurations and immersions should be low-key and minimalist event without much pomp and grandeur. Wherever possible, inauguration should be in virtual mode. Idol must be taken to the immersion spots directly without any stopover at any place avoiding unnecessary diversions. Procession and loud speakers are not allowed during immersion. All Pandals shall display a board or banner in a prominent place showing the right way of wearing masks, social distancing, washing hands and respiratory etiquettes, a press release from DC (SA) said.

The order states that the A&N Administration may take a decision in respect of re-opening of schools and coaching institutions, after 15th October, 2020, in a graded manner. The decision shall be taken in consultation with the respective school/institution management, based on their assessment of the situation. Online/distance learning shall continue to be permitted and shall be encouraged; where schools are conducting online classes, and some students prefer to attend online classes rather than physically attend school, they may be permitted to do so; students may attend schools/institutions only with the written consent of parents; attendance must not be enforced, and must depend entirely on parental consent; the A&N Administration will prepare its own Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) regarding health and safety precautions for reopening of schools/institutions based on the SOP to be issued by Department of School Education and Literacy (DoSEL), Ministry of Education, Government of India, keeping local requirements in view; the A&N Administration may take a decision on the timing of the opening of College/Higher Education Institutions as per the decisions taken by the Ministry of Higher Education. Online/distance learning shall continue to be preferred mode of teaching and shall be encouraged. However, Higher Education Institutions only for research scholars (Ph.D) and post-graduate students in science and technology stream requiring laboratory/experimental works will be permitted to open from 15th October, 2020. Swimming pools being used for training of sportsperson will be permitted to open with effect from 15th October, 2020, for which the SOP will be issued by the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports (MoYA&S); cinemas/theatres/multiplexes will be permitted to open with upto 50% of their seating capacity, in areas outside the Containment Zones only, with effect from 15th October, 2020, for which, SOP will be issued by Ministry of Information & Broadcasting; entertainment parks and similar places will be permitted to open with effect from 15th October, 2020, for which SOP will be issued by the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting. All incoming passengers from mainland shall be tested with RAPID Antigen Test at a cost of Rs.500 per head except medical patients along with an attendant. The cost of test shall be borne by passengers themselves. Passengers destined for Nicobar, Rangat Tehsil, Little Andaman shall be tested under RTCPR and will be compulsorily kept under Institutional quarantine, till they test Negative (-ve) for COVID-19 or for 7 days, whichever is earlier. In case of passengers destined for Tribal areas (Nicobars District, Rangat Tehsil and Little Andaman) they shall also be tested for COVID-19. All drivers and helpers of cargo vehicles/persons requiring emergency movement on the ATR and moving to the North & Middle Andaman District shall be tested first and allowed to move only if they test (-ve) for COVID-19. In Nicobar District, all persons arriving shall compulsorily undergo home quarantine for 10 days. Similarly, all persons arriving in Katchal, Teressa and Chowra from Kamorta shall be placed under home quarantine for 10 days. All the private office, workplaces, shops, markets, industrial & commercial establishment rendering services/activities like Nursing Homes, Private Clinics, Hospitals, Chemists/Pharmacies, Petrol Pumps/Fuel Depots, Hotel and Restaurants, ATMs in South Andaman District shall function from 0700 hrs to 2130 hrs while in Nicobar it will be from 0700 hrs to 2000 hrs. All establishments shall display a board or banner in a prominent place, showing the right way of wearing mask, social distancing, washing hands and cough etiquettes. All the establishments shall ensure strict adherence of COVID-19 protocols like wearing of masks and maintenance of social distancing/2 Gaz Ki Doori. It shall be sole responsibility of the owner/ in-charge of shop/business establishment to ensure strict compliance of National Directives on COVID-19 and SOPs failing which in addition to criminal proceedings, the shops/ business establishment shall be sealed for 14 days. Concerned department may also prepare consequential SOPs for strict enforcement of the above directions, the order to this effect issued by DC (SA) and DC (Nicobars) added. 1.22 kg ganja seized by CCS team; 1 peddler arrested

Port Blair, Oct. 1 Central Crime Station in its continuous efforts and crackdown against illegal Narcotics in A&N Islands, has arrested 1 drug peddler. On Sept. 25, a credible information was received by SHO, PS CCS that one person namely P. Mohammed Puhari, (45 years), R/o Bimblitan will be striking a deal of ganja at Bimblitan main road. Accordingly, a raiding team rushed to the spot and later intercepted one person who was coming from Bimblitan side carrying one carry bag. On asking, he disclosed his name as P. Mohammed Puhari. During frisking & search, the raiding team recovered 1.220 kg illicit ganja from his possession. The recovered ganja was seized on the spot. The accused was arrested under Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act-1985 and a case was registered at PS CCS. The general public have been requested to pass on credible information on narcotics substances, illegal sale of liquor, gambling or any illegal activity on the telephone numbers: 233307, 232586, 100, & 9474233832. The identity of the informer will be kept secret, a press release from SP (CID) said.

N&MA District Police keeping strict vigil on bootleggers

Port Blair, Oct. 1 The District Police of North & Middle Andaman carried out a crackdown on the manufacturing and sale of illicit liquor. Based on the information received that some people were making jungli liquor in the nearby forest, search teams were deputed. Thousands of litres of the concoction was destroyed during these search operations. In the month of September itself, 32 cases under Excise Regulation have been registered in the District, with a seizure of 392 bottles of IMFL of various quantities, 14ltr. Illicit liquor and 19 kgs of Handia, a press release from SP (N&MA) said.

Whereas, in exercise of the powers conferred under Section 10(2)(1) of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, the Union Home Secretary has vide Order No.40-3/2020-DM-1(A) dated 30.09.2020 issued Guidelines on Unlock-5 and National Directives for COVID-19 management for public and work places;

Whereas, the Chief Secretary, Andaman and Nicobar Administration in exercise of the powers conferred under section 24(1) of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, has issued directions vide order No. CS/Sr.PS/05/2020 dated 30.09.2020 which will be applicable in whole of Andaman and Nicobar Islands till 31.10.2020;

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of powers vested in the undersigned u/s 51(b) of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 and in order to enforce strict compliance of the National Directives on COVID-19 and contain the spread of COVID-19 in South Andaman District, I, Suneel Anchipaka, IAS, District Magistrate, South Andaman District, hereby direct the following:-

I. Activities permitted outside the Containment Zones in South Andaman District

In areas outside the Containment Zones, all activities will be permitted, except the following:

(i) The A&N Administration may take a decision in respect of re-opening of schools and coaching institutions, after 15th October 2020, in a graded manner. The decision shall be taken in consultation with the respective school/institution management, based on their assessment of the situation, and subject to the following conditions:

- Online/distance learning shall continue to be permitted and shall be encouraged.
- Where schools are conducting online classes, and some students prefer to attend online classes rather than physically attend school, they may be permitted to do so.
- Students may attend schools/institutions only with the written consent of parents.
- Attendance must not be enforced, and must depend entirely on parental consent.
- The A&N Administration will prepare its own standard operating procedure (SOP) regarding health and safety precautions for reopening of schools/institutions based on the SOP to be issued by Department of School Education and Literacy (DoSEL), Ministry of Education, Government of India, keeping local requirements in view.

(ii) The A&N Administration may take a decision on the timing of the opening of College/Higher Education Institutions as per the decisions taken by the Ministry of Higher Education. Online/distance learning shall continue to be preferred mode of teaching and shall be encouraged.

However, Higher Education Institutions only for research scholars (Ph.D) and post-graduate students in science and technology stream requiring laboratory/experimental works will be permitted to open from 15th October, 2020, as under:

a. For Centrally Funded Higher Education Institutions, the Head of Institution will satisfy herself/himself there is a genuine requirement of research scholars (Ph.D) and post-graduate students in science and technology stream for laboratory/experimental works.

b. For all other Higher Education Institutions, they may open only for research scholars (Ph.D) and postgraduate students in science and technology stream requiring laboratory/experimental works as per decision to be taken by the Administration.

(iii) Swimming pools being used for training of sportsperson will be permitted to open with effect from 15th October, 2020, for which the SOP will be issued by the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports (MoYA&S).

(iv) Cinemas/theatres/multiplexes will be permitted to open with upto 50% of their seating capacity, in areas outside the Containment Zones only, with effect from 15th October 2020, for which, SOP will be issued by Ministry of Information & Broadcasting.

(v) Entertainment parks and similar places will be permitted to open with effect from 15th October, 2020, for which SOP will be issued by the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting (MoHFW).

(vi) Business to Business (B2B) Exhibitions will be permitted to open, in areas outside the Containment Zones only, with effect from 15th October 2020, for which, SOP will be issued by the Department of Commerce.

(vii) Social/academic/sports/entertainment/cultural/religious/political functions and other congregations with a ceiling of 100 persons, outside Containment Zones only. Such gatherings beyond the limit of 100 persons may be permitted, outside Containment Zones, by State/UT Governments only after 15th October 2020 and subject to the following conditions:

- In closed spaces, a maximum of 50% of the hall capacity will be allowed, with a ceiling of 200 persons. Wearing of face masks, maintaining social distancing, provision for thermal scanning and use of hand wash or sanitizer will be mandatory.
- In open spaces, keeping the size of the ground/space in view, and with strict observance of social distancing, mandatory wearing of face masks, provision for thermal scanning and hand wash or sanitizer.

State/UT Government will issue detailed SOPs, to regulate such gatherings and strictly enforce the same.

(viii) International air travel of passengers, except as permitted by MHA.

II. National Directives for COVID-19 Management

National Directives for COVID-19 Management, as specified in Annexure-I to the Order issued by the Union Home Secretary dt. 30th September 2020 shall be followed.

III. Lockdown limited to Containment Zones

(i) Lockdown shall remain in force in the Containment Zones till 31st October, 2020.

(ii) Containment Zones shall be demarcated by the District Administration at micro level after taking into consideration the guidelines of MoHFW with the objective of effectively breaking the chain of transmission. Strict containment measures will be enforced in these containment zones and only essential activities be allowed. There shall strict perimeter control to ensure that there is no movement of people in or out of these zones, except for medical emergencies and for maintaining supply of essential goods and services. In the Containment Zones, there shall be intensive contact tracing, house-to-house surveillance, and other clinical interventions, as required. Guidelines of MoHFW shall be effectively implemented for the above purpose.

IV. Movement of passengers

(i) All incoming passengers from mainland shall be tested with RAPID Antigen Test at a cost of Rs.500 per head except medical patients along with an attendant. The cost of test shall be borne by passengers themselves. Passengers destined for Nicobar, Rangat Tehsil, Little Andaman shall be tested under RTCPDR and will be compulsorily kept under Institutional quarantine, till they test Negative (-ve) for COVID-19 or for 7 days, whichever is earlier.

(ii) In case of passengers destined for Tribal areas (Nicobars District, Rangat Tehsil and Little Andaman) they shall also be tested for COVID-19.

(iii) All Drivers and helpers of cargo vehicles/ persons requiring emergency movement on the ATR and moving to the North & Middle Andaman District shall be tested first and allowed to move only if they test (-Ve) for COVID-19.

V. All the private office, workplaces, shops, markets, industrial & commercial establishment rendering services/activities like Nursing Homes, Private Clinics, Hospitals, Chemists/Pharmacies, Petrol Pumps/Fuel Depots, Hotel and Restaurants, ATMs in South Andaman District shall function from 0700 hrs to 2130 hrs. All establishments shall display a board or banner in a prominent place, showing the right way of wearing mask, social distancing, washing hands and cough etiquettes.

VI. All the establishments shall ensure strict adherence of COVID-19 protocols like wearing of masks and maintenance of social distancing/2 Gaz Ki Doori. It shall be sole responsibility of the owner/ in-charge of shop/business establishment to ensure strict compliance of National Directives on COVID-19 and SOPs failing which in addition to criminal proceedings, the shops/ business establishment

shall be sealed for 14 days.
VII. Concerned department may also prepare consequential SOPs for strict enforcement of the above directions.

VIII. Protection of vulnerable persons
Persons above 65 years of age, persons with co-morbidities, pregnant women and children below the age of 10 years are advised to stay at home, except for essential and health purposes.

IX. Use of Arogya Setu
(i) Arogya Setu enables early identification of potential risk infection, and thus acts as a shield for individual and the community.

(ii) With a view to ensuring safety on offices and work places, employers on best efforts basis should ensure that Arogya Setu is installed by all employees having compatible mobile phones.

X. Any person violating the measures will be liable to be proceeded against as per the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 besides legal action under section 188 of IPC and other legal provisions as applicable. They shall also be liable to pay fines as per the orders in force.

AND WHEREAS, the Chief Secretary, Andaman and Nicobar Administration in exercise of the powers conferred under section 24(1) of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, has issued directions vide order No. CS/Sr.PS/05/2020 dated 30.09.2020 which will be applicable in whole of Andaman and Nicobar Islands till 31.10.2020;

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of powers vested in the undersigned u/s 51(b) of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 and in order to enforce strict compliance of the National Directives on COVID-19 and contain the spread of COVID-19 in Nicobar District, I, Kishore Kshirsagar Lakshman, IAS, District Magistrate, Nicobar District, hereby direct the following:-

I. Activities permitted outside the Containment Zones in Nicobar District

In areas outside the Containment Zones, all activities will be permitted, except the following:

(i) The directions of the A&N Administration regarding re-opening of schools and coaching institutions, after 15th October 2020 shall be strictly followed.

(ii) The directions of A&N Administration regarding opening of College/Higher Education Institutions as per the decisions taken by the Ministry of Higher Education shall be strictly followed.

(iii) Swimming pools being used for training of sportsperson will be permitted to open with effect from 15th October, 2020, for which the SOP will be issued by the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports (MoYA&S).

(iv) Cinemas/theatres/multiplexes will be permitted to open with upto 50% of their seating capacity, in areas outside the Containment Zones only, with effect from 15th October 2020, for which, SOP will be issued by Ministry of Information & Broadcasting.

(v) Entertainment parks and similar places will be permitted to open with effect from 15th October, 2020, for which SOP will be issued by the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting (MoHFW).

(vi) Business to Business (B2B) Exhibitions will be permitted to open, in areas outside the Containment Zones only, with effect from 15th October 2020, for which, SOP will be issued by the Department of Commerce.

(vii) Social/ academic/ sports/ entertainment/ cultural/ religious/ political functions and other congregations with a ceiling of 100 persons, outside Containment Zones only. Such gatherings beyond the limit of 100 persons may be permitted, outside Containment Zones based on the directions of the A&N Administration.

II. National Directives for COVID-19 Management

National Directives for COVID-19 Management, as specified in Annexure-I to the Order issued by the Union Home Secretary dt. 30th September 2020 shall be followed.

III. Lockdown limited to Containment Zones

(i) Lockdown shall remain in force in the Containment Zones till 31st October, 2020.

(ii) Containment Zones shall be demarcated by the District Administration at micro level after taking into consideration the guidelines of MoHFW with the objective of effectively breaking the chain of transmission. Strict containment measures will be enforced in these containment zones and only essential activities be allowed. There shall strict perimeter control to ensure that there is no movement of people in or out of these zones, except for medical emergencies and for maintaining supply of essential goods and services. In the Containment Zones, there shall be intensive contact tracing, house-to-house surveillance, and other clinical interventions, as required. Guidelines of MoHFW shall be effectively implemented for the above purpose.

IV. Movement of passengers

(i) All persons arriving in Nicobar District shall compulsorily undergo home quarantine for 10 days. Similarly, all persons arriving in Katchal, Teressa and Chowra from Kamorta shall be placed under home quarantine for 10 days.

(ii) No member of the crew of any ship (passenger or cargo) shall be allowed to disembark without the permission of the respective SDM. All labour working on ships shall be placed under quarantine for a period of seven days.

(iii) All outbound passengers from Car Nicobar, Nancowry group and Great Nicobar intending to avail ship / helicopter services shall compulsorily undergo Rapid Antigen test at cost of Rs.500/- per head. The cost of the test shall be borne by the passengers themselves except medical patients who are referred and Govt. officers/officials on duty.

V. All the private office, workplaces, shops, markets, industrial & commercial establishment rendering services/activities like Nursing Homes, Private Clinics, Hospitals, Chemists/Pharmacies, Petrol Pumps/Fuel Depots, Hotel and Restaurants, ATMs in Nicobar District shall function from 0700 hrs to 2000 hrs. All establishments shall display a board or banner in a prominent place, showing the right way of wearing mask, social distancing, washing hands and cough etiquettes.

VI. All the establishments shall ensure strict adherence of COVID-19 protocols like wearing of masks and maintenance of social distancing/2 Gaz Ki Doori. It shall be sole responsibility of the owner/ in-charge of shop/business establishment to ensure strict compliance of National Directives on COVID-19 and SOPs failing which in addition to criminal proceedings, the shops/ business establishment shall be sealed for 14 days.

VII. Concerned departments may also prepare consequential SOPs for strict enforcement of the above directions.

VIII. Protection of vulnerable persons

Persons above 65 years of age, persons with co-morbidities, pregnant women and children below the age of 10 years are advised to stay at

home, except for essential and health purposes.

IX. Use of Arogya Setu

(i) Arogya Setu enables early identification of potential risk infection, and thus acts as a shield for individual and the community.

(ii) With a view to ensuring safety on offices and work places, employers on best efforts basis should ensure that Arogya Setu is installed by all employees having compatible mobile phones.

X. Any person violating the measures will be liable to be proceeded against as per the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 besides legal action under section 188 of IPC and other legal provisions as applicable. They shall also be liable to pay fines as per the orders in force.

This order shall come into effect from 01/10/2020 and shall remain in force up to 31/10/2020.

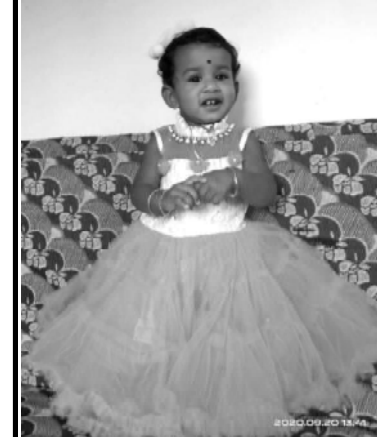

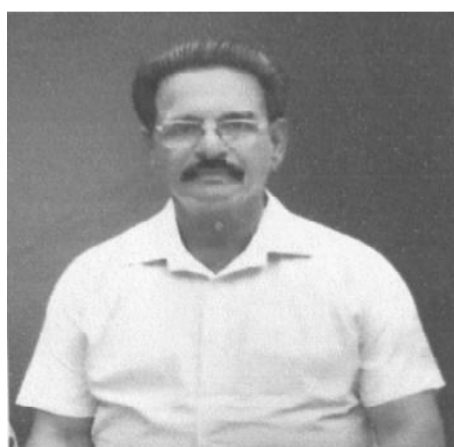
