Sensitize young minds to find creative solutions to socio-economic problems of our country: President

New Delhi, Mar 20

The week-long Festival of Innovations in Rashtrapati Bhavan concluded yesterday (March 19, 2016) with a 12 hour long coding competition to develop web and mobile applications in hackathon style (non-stop rapid development). The topics on which applications were developed were 1) teachers taking attendance after every class 2) examination authentication for students, 3) monitoring entry into public monuments and 4) monitoring of public toilets. The President, Shri Pranab Mukherjee felicitated the winners of the competition in each category in presence of Shri Mohandas Pai and Shri



Karl Mehta of Code for India and other dignitaries. Speaking on the occasion, the President said a country like India may have reached a certain level of technological advancement. It may have promoted the development of a scientific bent of mind and temperament amongst its citizens, especially the young ones. However, unless young minds are

sensitized to the need for finding creative solutions to top-ranging socio-economic problems of our country, the goal of inclusive development will remain elusive. PBMC revising Smart City Proposal; citizen & stakeholders urged to provide feedback

Port Blair, Mar 20

The PBMC is in the process of revising its Smart City Proposal based on the comments received from the Ministry of Urban Development. During the course of revision, a number of new projects are proposed to be added to the existing proposal and to remove certain projects which are not fitting into the ambit of the Smart City Mission. A team from PBMC visited Administrative Staff College of India in Hyderabad and attended a diagnostic workshop and evolved certain new projects based on the current and future potential of Port Blair City for upgrading the current Smart City Proposal.

The newly identified projects are hereby brought before the citizens of Port Blair to evoke a public response in order to improve it further.

Port Blair Connect - To connect Port Blair City through a robust wireless based mesh network that creates a network backbone for providing 'intra-net' through which all government services can be accessed. Apart from that, it will also serve as a robust disaster communication system.

Project 'Patha' - An initiative to name the roads/streets/bye-lanes in Port Blair City and to provide every household an identity by assigning a house number using Geo-Tagging Technology. This would enable easy delivery of government services to citizens' doorsteps, delivery of e-Commerce goods, precision of emergency service delivery (Ambulance, Fire Service, PCR Vans, Taxi, etc).

Heritage Walk - A walk through the historical structures in Port Blair to highlight the history of

freedom struggle in Andaman and Nicobar Islands; with special emphasis on the patriotic fervour of the citizens here. Advance technology like audio guide, electronic murals, etc to display the history and uniqueness of the freedom struggle will be installed in vital points.

Marine Esplanade - The long coastline in the city from Chatham to Marina

Park will be developed with street furniture, sea decks, sighting telescopes and leisure activities/facilities.

Port Blair Pass - A smart card/wearable technology based simple solution for the visiting tourists to experience hassle free entry to tourist spots, transport facilities and concessions in hotels/restaurants, etc.

Smart Mobility - GPS enabled bus tracking system, smart bus stops with passenger information system on bus timings, bus routes matrix, e-Bus Pass, etc with modern bus bays. **Dashboard** - A computer enabled system to monitor the progress of municipal works undertaken in various wards with citizen friendly interface to enable them to monitor the progress of works in their

Large Egrets, Medium Egrets, Small Egrets, White bellied Sea Eagle, White breasted Kingfisher, Andaman Green Pigeon at the wetlands of Sippigath on either side of the main road.

The reserve forests of Chidiyatapu presented a different avian spectacle which included Andaman tree pie, Andaman drongo, Racket-tailed drongo, blacked napped oriole, Scarlet Minivets, Green Imperial Pigeon, Glossy staling, Andaman cuckoo, Sun birds, Andaman bulbuls, and spotted woodpeckers, all making excellent early morning calls and whistles.
