New Delhi, Jun 20

NITI Aayog has targeted to set up 1500 Atal Tinkering Labs, ATLS by the end of this year in schools across the country to impart innovation skills in the students. Briefing the media in New Delhi recently, NITI Aayog's Chief Executive Officer Shri Amitabh Kant said more than 450 schools have been selected from 32 States and Union Territories through a

competitive process for setting up ATLS. Atal Innovation Mission, AIM will provide grant in aid for selected schools that includes a one time establishment cost of 10 lakh rupees and operational expenses of 10 lakh rupees for a maximum period of five year. He said ATLS are dedicated work spaces for class 6th to 12th students to acquire innovation skills, develop ideas and build prototypes using state of

the art equipment like 3D printer, robotics and electronics development tools. Shri Kant said, the activities in these labs are designed to spur the spark of creativity in students and go beyond regular curriculum and text book learning. He said, to maximize the impact of the ATLS, AIM will soon be launching Mentor India - a strategic nation building initiative to engage leaders who can guide and mentor students in the ATLS.

India vs West Indies 2017: Complete schedule, fixtures, venues, time in IST

New Delhi, June 20  
India will look to get back to winning ways and a positive frame of mind after a disappointing show in the final of the ICC Champions Trophy at the Oval on Sunday. The Virat Kohli-led India side performed well throughout the tournament, barring the loss to Sri Lanka, and were convincing in all departments of the game. Rohit Sharma and Shikhar Dhawan provided the launchpad in most India games and the pace attack in Bhuvneshwar Kumar and Jasprit Bumrah chimed in with splendid efforts to keep the opposition on their toes. Things didn't go to all to plan when Men in Blue faced arch-rivals Pakistan, captained by Sarfraz Ahmed, to lose by a staggering 180 runs. West Indies did not feature in the Champions Trophy as the tournament only comprises the top-eight ranked teams in the world. At the cut off mark of September 30, 2015, West Indies were outside the best eight to miss out in the

tournament for the first time since its inception in 1998. Bangladesh took their place for the first appearance since 2006. In the meanwhile, West Indies played Afghanistan in their own backyard. The Windies won the T20 series 3-0 while being pushed in the opening contest. The ODI series finished 1-1 with the third match abandoned. During the first match, at St Lucia, Rashid Khan created history by

scalping seven wickets. As India return to West Indies, having played four Tests against them before moving to Florida for two T20s, the idea would be to keep the form going. Rohit Sharma and Jasprit Bumrah both have been rested while Rishabh Pant and Kuldeep Yadav have come in. West Indies have made no changes for the first two ODIs from the team that played against Afghanistan.

Champions Trophy 2021 in doubt, ICC mulls 2 WT20s in 4 years

London, June 20  
The next Champions Trophy scheduled in India could be scrapped to accommodate two World Twenty20 Championships in a four-year cycle, the International Cricket Council's CEO David Richardson has revealed. India, who hold the hosting rights for the next Champions Trophy in 2021, lost the title to Pakistan by 180 runs in the finals at The Oval on Sunday. Despite the question-marks over its relevance, the event received huge response from global audience as millions tuned in to catch the action on television. However, Richardson said there is no guarantee that there will be another Champions Trophy after 2021 and the issue will be

discussed during the ongoing ICC annual conference at The Oval. "What we want to do is differentiate our global events from each other so that they can be standalone and create maximum interest every time the event happens," Richardson told reporters. "At this stage, the next Champions Trophy is still scheduled for India in 2021. Whether that gets changed, the consideration has been given to changing to two T20s in a four-year cycle which would mean swapping the Champions Trophy for a World T20." The ICC CEO said World T20s could involve upto 20 teams in future. "The fact is that World T20s do attract a lot of interest, they generate significant revenue for television companies, but most

importantly from our point of view they provide us with an opportunity to give opportunities to more teams. "A 16-team World T20 - even a 20-team World T20 - down the line is something that we would like to look at. With a 10-team World Cup we're hoping to increase the competitiveness of matches and the standard of the tournament as a whole.
