GOI's Street Lighting National Prog.

50,000 KM of roads illuminated; work commences in A&N Islands too

New Delhi, Aug 20
The Government of India's Street Lighting National Programme (SLNP) has illuminated 50,000 KM of Indian roads with installation of 30 lakh LED street lights across the country. With this milestone, Energy Efficiency Services Limited, a government of India company under the administration of Ministry of Power, has become the world's largest street light management company. The

installation of 30 lakh LED street lights has resulted in 39 crore kWh of annual energy savings, avoided capacity of over 104.19 MW to the Urban Local Bodies (ULBs). Further it has also helped in reduction of 3.29 lakh tonnes of CO2 annually. Under SLNP, Rajasthan is leading the country with an installation of 7.85 lakh LED street lights followed by Andhra Pradesh and Gujarat with 6.03 lakhs and 5.4 lakhs respectively.

Presently, EESL is retrofitting 15,000 conventional lights with LED street lights every day. The project is near completion in the states of Himachal Pradesh, Tripura and Gujarat. EESL is also implementing a special heritage lighting project in Kashi region of Uttar Pradesh where 4,000 lights are being installed. The programme has also recently commenced in the cities of Chandigarh and Port Blair, Andaman and Nicobar Islands.

Further, the procurement price of the LED Street Lights has been reduced from Rs. 135/watt to Rs. 80/watt due to mass procurement of the lights. EESL makes the entire upfront investment in installation of the Street Lights and no additional budget allocation from the Municipalities is required. Municipalities pay EESL from the savings in energy and maintenance cost over a 7-year period, making the LED lights affordable and accessible.

Payment of GST & filing of return for July 2017 extended by 5 days

New Delhi, Aug 20

The GST Implementation Committee, consisting of State and Central Government officers, has taken a decision to extend the last date for payment of the GST for the month of July 2017 to 25th August, 2017. Earlier the last date for payment of taxes and filing of GST Return in Form 3B for the month of July was kept as 20th of August 2017. Since it is the first Return to be filed under GST, the tax payers and the tax practitioners have

requested for few more days to file their Return. Also there have been requests from States which are hit with floods to extend the last date for filing of GST Returns. The State of Jammu & Kashmir has also requested for extension of time because of late passing of their GST Ordinance. Some technical glitches are also experienced by last minute return filers. It has been specified that for those tax payers, who do not want to avail of

transitional credit in TRANS1 this month, the date for return filing will be 25th August 2017. And for those who want to fill up TRANS1 this month, the last date for filing of returns will be 28th August 2017, as announced earlier. In order not to face any last moment technological difficulty in submission of return, all tax payers have been requested to file their return well before 25th / 28th of August 2017 and not wait for the last date.

Owners, crew of fishing boats, fishers asked to follow A&N Islands Marine Fishing Rules

Boats must have life saving, fire fighting appliances & communication devices

Port Blair, Aug 20

The Department of Fisheries has asked all the fishermen of the Islands to follow the provisions of the A & N Islands Marine Fishing Rules. The advisory has been issued as it has been brought to the notice of the Department by various Enforcement/ Security Agencies that the fishers of these Islands violate the Provisions of A & N Islands Marine Fishing Rules by not carrying their valid documents

in A&N Islands have been asked to carry all these documents while at sea and produce the same for inspection by the enforcement/ Security agencies. Few fishermen are also found venturing into the Tribal Reserve Areas i.e. Prevention of Aboriginal Tribes (PAT) Regulated Areas which is a criminal

offence and will attract Legal proceedings. All the registered owners of motorized mechanical, motorized non-mechanical fishing boats and traditional crafts have also been asked to follow colour coding prescribed for their respective crafts. The motorized mechanical fishing vessels shall be painted in bright orange

colour confirming to Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) in the wheel house or canopy top for easy identification of the boat by Coast Guard. In case of motorized non-mechanical and country crafts, the sides of the boat shall be painted in bright yellow colour confirming to Bureau of Indian

PV Sindhu to lead India's charge as World Badminton Championships kicks off today

New Delhi, Aug 20 The Indian cricket team maybe in action in Sri Lanka but expect the focus to firmly shift towards Scotland as the World Badminton Championships kicks off on Monday. An Indian player is yet to win a gold at the tournament if you rewind back to the previous editions. But as many as five Indian shuttlers have been seeded this time around. They include PV Sindhu (4) and Saina Nehwal (12) in the women's singles and Srikanth Kidambi (8), Ajay Jayaram (13) and B. Sai Praneeth (15) in the men's singles. Olympic silver medalist Sindhu, who clinched the 2016 China Open and 2017 India Open, will look to better the colour of the medal that she had won in the 2013 and 2014 editions. While Srikanth turns up in Scotland after three successive final finishes, Sindhu enters the event after a couple of quarterfinal finishes in the previous Super Series events of this season. First Indian woman to win a silver at 2015 World Championship, Saina will also be in the reckoning and will look to brush aside any concern whatsoever regarding her fitness and put the best foot forward. Interestingly, Saina and Sindhu have got byes in the opening round. Sindhu will open her campaign against either Korea's Kim Hyo Min or Egypt's Hadia Hosny in the second round and is likely to meet China's Sun Yu for a place at the quarterfinals. Saina, on the other hand, will take on the winner of the match between Switzerland's Sabrina Jaquet and Ukraine's Natalya Voytsekh and is expected to clash with Korean second seed Sung Ji Hyun for a place in the pre-quarterfinals.

Standards (BIS) above the waterline for easy identification by Coast Guard. In addition, the boats should be equipped with required life saving, fire fighting appliances and communication devices. In the event of display of such colour by the boats not registered with Department of Fisheries, stringent action will be initiated as deemed fit, a communication said.

Nadal confirmed for Brisbane International

Queensland, Aug 20 New world number one Rafael Nadal will return to play in the Brisbane International ahead of the Australian Open early next year, organisers said on Sunday. The 15-time Grand Slam champion will take the top rankings spot when the official ATP rankings are released on Monday. It will be the first time the Spaniard has hit the top rankings spot since 2014. Nadal played in Brisbane for the first time in January and the 31-year-old went on to reach the Australian Open final in Melbourne where he lost to Roger Federer.
