Chandigarh, Sept 20
Union Rural Development Minister Choudhary Birender Singh has said that central government is going to provide the facilities of development and employment to the youth near their villages.

Addressing a press conference at Chandigarh yesterday, the Minister said that centre has launched Shayama Prasad Mukherji Rurban Mission for economic, social and infrastructural development of rural areas.

He said the 5,142 crore rupees would be spent on this plan formulated to provide facilities in the rural areas on the pattern of urban areas.

Port Blair, Sept 20
The Panchayat & Municipal Elections, 2015 were conducted peacefully for 685 constituencies of Panchayats and 24 wards of Municipal Council in A&N Islands today (Sept 20). No untoward incident was reported during the Poll. Voters in huge numbers came out of their homes and exercised their franchise. The rain god also favoured the mammoth efforts of the Administration and bright sunshine was observed all across the Islands. The Polling was conducted very smoothly under the close supervision and monitoring of Shri. Anand Prakash, Chief Secretary, Shri. N K Sharma, Home Secretary who is also Secretary (Panchayat & Municipal Elections) and Shri. Vijay Kumar Bhiduri, Director (Panchayat & Municipal Elections)/ Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman. Secretary (Panchayat & Municipal Elections) and Director (Panchayat & Municipal Elections) also kept the UT Election Commissioner apprised of conduct of the polling at every two hours.

Giving details of the Mission, the Union Minister said that under the scheme 300 clusters of villages will be formed throughout the country and three to fifteen villages will be included in each cluster. He said that each cluster will have around 25 to 50 thousand population. He said that 100 clusters will be set up in the current year and each state will have at least one cluster. Choudhary Birender Singh said, to encourage the economic activities and to ensure fair price for local produce 50 crore rupees will be spent on each cluster. The Minister told that total 14 services like economic activities, food processing, agricultural service, storage, digital literacy, cleanliness, solid and liquid waste management, tap water supply and skill development will be taken up in the clusters.

He said that the aim is to develop villages on the pattern of cities so that migration could be stopped.

BCCI President Jagmohan Dalmiya passes away

Kolkata, Sept 20
Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) president Jagmohan Dalmiya passed away on Sunday evening in Kolkata. The former International Cricket Council (ICC) chief was 75. He had been admitted with chest pain to a city hospital few days ago and had undergone a surgery. He passed away within 72 hours of the heart surgery. "Mr. Dalmiya died of internal gastrointestinal bleeding and internal organ failure," hospital sources said, confirming the veteran cricket administrator's death. Cricket Association of Bengal sources added: "At 6 p.m. in the evening his condition deteriorated and shortly afterwards he suffered a massive cardiac arrest from



which he could not recover." He is survived by a daughter and a son. "BCCI Condolences the sudden demise of our president Shri Jagmohan Dalmiya", the official handle of India's apex cricket body tweeted. According to sources, the BCCI secretary Anurag Thakur and IPL chairman

Rajeev Shukla will reach Kolkata on Monday. Dalmiya had first helmed BCCI from 2001-04. He was elected president again in March this year. And, under a changed BCCI constitution, he was to hold office for three straight years, until September 2017.

Newbies Gurkeerat, Aravind make into squad for India vs SA

Bengaluru, Sept 20
Young Punjab all-rounder Gurkeerat Singh earned his maiden call-up into the Indian ODI team while Karnataka left-arm seamer Srinath Aravind was a surprise inclusion in the T20 squad picked by the selectors for the limited overs against South Africa. The Sandeep Patil-led selection committee announced the teams for the three T20s and the first three ODIs against the Proteas starting October 2 at Dharamsala. Limited overs Captain Mahendra Singh Dhoni is back at the helm while senior off-spinner Harbhajan Singh was retained in the T20 squad for his consistent show during the tour of Zimbabwe. Opener Shikhar Dhawan, recuperating from a hand fracture he suffered during the first Test against Sri Lanka last month, was also included in both the squads. After being rested for the

Zimbabwe tour, seniors such as Virat Kohli, Rohit Sharma, Ravichandran Ashwin and Suresh Raina were automatic selections in both squads and so were the likes of Ambati Rayudu and Mohit Sharma. While Umesh Yadav has been included in the ODI squad, Varun Aaron was not considered for selection in any of the squads.

New Delhi, Sept 20
A profligate Yuki Bhambri missed chances galore in a tame defeat against world number 40 Jiri Vesley as India lost the Davis Cup World Group Play-off tie against top seeds Czech Republic 1-3 in New Delhi on Sunday. The Delhi boy's 3-6 5-7 2-6 defeat in sweltering heat in the must-win fourth rubber means that India will remain in the Asia | Oceania Group 1 for next year's competition while the top seeds and three-time Champions Czech Republic regained their place in the elite 16 nation World Group. India

needed Yuki to win to remain alive in the tie but the 23-year-old ton Sunday. Yuki lost both his matches here over the weekend after playing an excellent tie against New Zealand in July when he won both the matches, including the deciding fifth one that helped India reach the Play-off stage. The doubles loss for the fancied Leander Paes and Rohan Bopanna also hurt India's chances in the tie. Since the fate of the two teams was sealed, the two teams decided not to play the dead fifth rubber between Somdev Devvarman and Lukas Rosol.

PCB secures Dubai, Sharjah as venues for PSL

Karachi, Sept 20
The PCB has finally succeeded in securing Dubai and Sharjah as venues for the Pakistan Super League T20 event early next year but at the cost of having to share the facilities with the organisers of the planned Masters Cricket League. A source in the PCB told PTI that after renewed negotiations between the officials of the PCB's PSL secretariat and the Emirates Cricket Board it had been decided in principle that the inaugural edition of the PSL would be held in Dubai and Sharjah.

Suresh Raina ton helps India A clinch three-match series against Bangladesh A

Bengaluru, Sept 20
Senior batsman Suresh Raina hit a strokeful century to help India A outplay Bangladesh A by 75 runs via Duckworth/Lewis method in the third unofficial rain-hit ODI and clinch the series 2-1, here on Sunday. Electing to bat, the Unmukt Chand-led side rode on Raina's 104-run knock to post 297 for six in 50 overs. The bowlers then restricted the visitors for 141 for six in 32 overs when rain halted play for the second and final time. The first rain interruption saw the chasing target being revised to 290 runs in 46 overs, while the second and final rain halt saw a mathematical revision of 217 runs

in 32 overs. Karnataka left-arm seamer Sreenath Aravind celebrated his India seniors call-up with two crucial scalps. But it was the batting that did the trick for India A as Unmukt (41) stitched an 82-run second-wicket partnership with wicketkeeper-batsman Sanju Samson (90) to give the team a solid start after losing opener Mayank Agarwal (4) early. Raina, who is getting ready for the South Africa series, was under a bit of pressure after getting 16 and 17 runs in the first and second match respectively, rose to the occasion with his 94-ball knock, laced with 9 fours and a six.

Agriculture Ministry to organize Rabi & Kharif Conference next week

New Delhi, Sept 20
Agriculture Ministry will organize Rabi and Kharif Conference next week in Delhi to review performance of the preceding season and prepare strategies for the coming season. An official release said, the Ministry will review the production performance of Kharif-2015 season and will take stock of inputs to ensure timely supply and creating awareness of new

technologies, innovations in crop production and allied sectors. The Rabi season is an important as Kharif in ensuring the nation's food security. The principle crops are wheat, cereals like barley, rabi maize, pulses like bengal gram, oilseeds like mustard and commercial crops like tobacco. Rabi cropping system contributes to the country's

foodgrains output to an extent of about 51 per cent on an average. Agriculture Ministry's strategy is to maximize the rabi output against the backdrop of rainfall deficit in some parts of the country.

Govt approves promulgation of Negotiable Instruments Ordinance

New Delhi, Sept 20
The Union Cabinet has approved a proposal to promulgate the Negotiable Instruments (Amendment) Ordinance, 2015. The ordinance provides for filing of cheque bounce cases at the place where the cheque was issued. An official release said, the clarity on jurisdictional issues for trial of cases of cheque bouncing would increase the credibility of the cheque as a financial instrument. It will also help

trade and commerce in general and allow the lending institution, including banks, to continue to extend financing to the economy, without the apprehension of loan default on account of bouncing of a cheque. The release said, the objective is to ensure that a fair trial is conducted keeping in view the interests of the complainant by clarifying the territorial jurisdiction of trial in case of dishonour of cheques.
