Indian shooters shine at Asian Games with 2 Silver medals in Nagoya, Japan

Aichi-Nagoya, Sept. 20
In the Asian Games 2026, India's campaign continues strongly on Day 2 in Japan today. Indian shooters secured 2 Silver medals in Nagoya today. India's Elavenil Valarivan clinched a silver medal in the women's 10 metre air rifle event at the Games. The 2025 World Championship bronze medallist Elavenil shot 252.4 points in the final to finish behind Japan's



Hinata Taichi, who won gold with a record 253 points. Earlier, India has secured the silver medal in the women's 10 metre air

rifle team event, with Elavenil Valarivan, Sonam Maskar and Vidarsa Vinod combining to deliver the country's first medal of the Games. Sonam top-scored for India with 634.1, finishing fourth in the individual qualification, while Olympian Elavenil finished seventh with 633.5 points. China took the gold medal with a total score of 1904.2, while India held on to second spot by scoring 1897.

industrial use. It will remove duplicate and ineligible connections, and make subsidy delivery transparent and targeted. The Ministry said the process is not meant to deny LPG to any genuine household, and every eligible consumer has several easy ways to complete it.

It said 27.43 crore consumers have already completed authentication and do not need to do anything further. Authentication can be completed at the time of delivery, at the distributor's showroom, or on Oil Marketing Company (OMC) mobile apps. The Petroleum and Natural Gas Ministry has urged consumers who have not yet completed Biometric Aadhaar Authentication to do that before 1st October, 2026.

Bates has 4,758 T20I runs, while former Pakistan captain Babar Azam is third on the overall list with 4,596 runs. England's Jos Buttler is fourth with 4,292 runs, followed by India's Harmanpreet Kaur with 4,287 runs. 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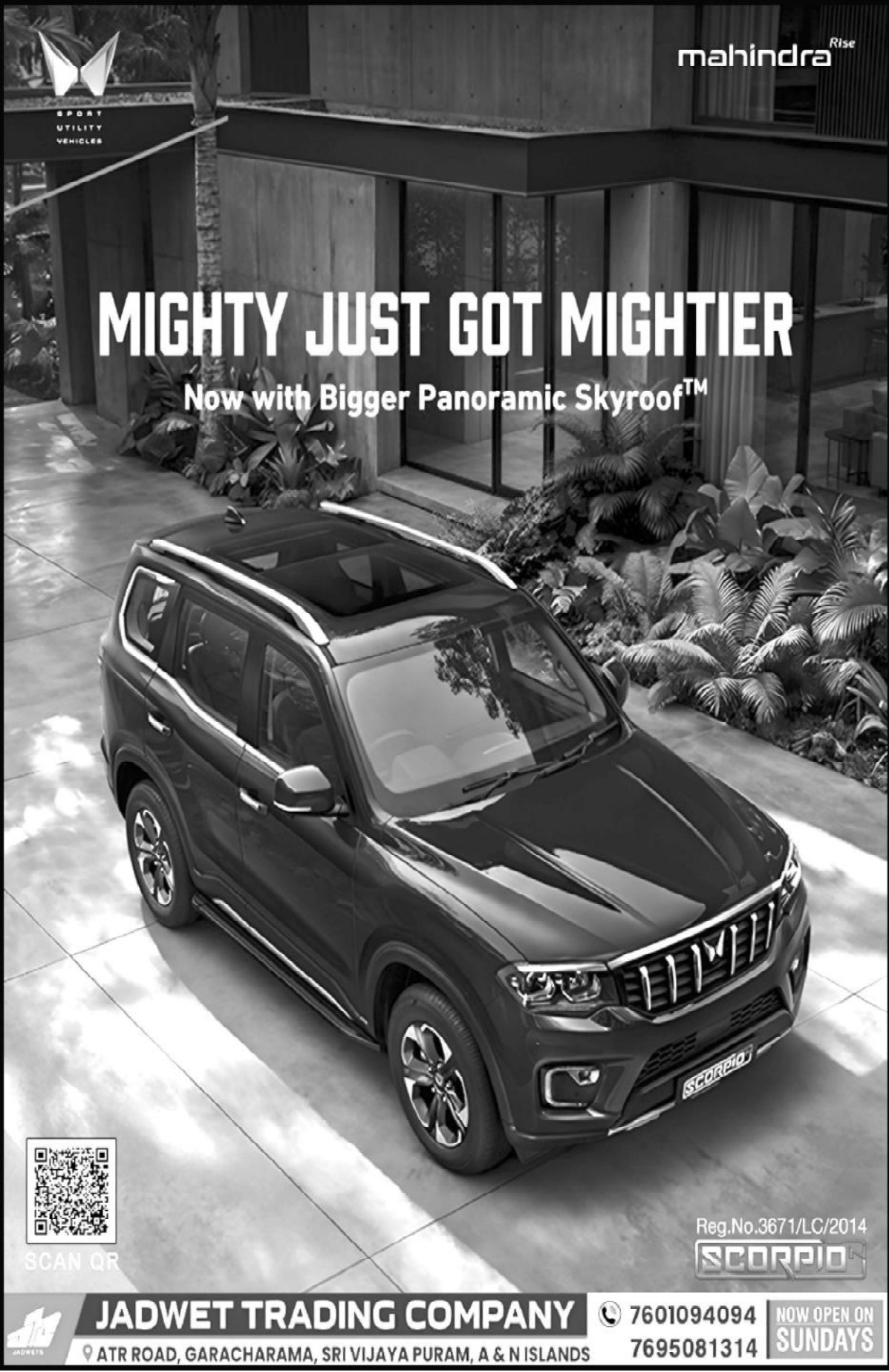
